RIVERDALE, Md. (FOX 5 DC) - A man is dead after a shooting Saturday night in Prince George's County.

Supreme Court lets Virginia voting go ahead under redrawn map

WASHINGTON - (AP) - Voters will elect lawmakers to the Virginia **House** of Delegates using a map seen as favorable to Democrats, under a ruling from the Supreme Court.

The justices' 5-4 decision Monday was perhaps telegraphed by the fact they previously allowed election planning to go forward using the map. Virginia held its primary last week.

Republicans control the House by a **slim** 51-49 margin. The Republican-run House had urged the Supreme Court to let the state use an election map previously struck down by a lower court as improperly factoring race into the drawing of some districts.

This is the last time the state will use the map to elect lawmakers to the House because that map will need to be redrawn following the 2020 census results.

WASHINGTON (FOX NEWS) -- Former Vice President Joe Biden is still, by far, the leader in the Democratic Party's presidential nomination race.

His lead reflects the mood of the party, as Democratic primary voters want someone who will unite **Americans**, provide steady leadership, and who has high ethical standards.

In addition, while Democrats best President Trump in hypothetical matchups and keep his support at 41 percent or lower, none of the challengers hits 50 percent.

These are some of the findings from the latest Fox News Poll.

Biden tops the list of **Democratic** contenders with 32 percent support among primary voters. Bernie Sanders trails at 13 percent, Elizabeth Warren at 9 percent, and Pete Buttigieg and Kamala Harris both at 8 percent. Next is Beto O'Rourke at 4 percent, Cory Booker at 3 percent, and Amy Klobuchar and Andrew Yang each garner 2 percent. Julian Castro, John Delaney, Tulsi Gabbard, Kirsten Gillibrand, and Tim Ryan receive 1 percent a piece.

Since March, Sanders is down 10 points, while Buttigieg (+7), Warren (+5), and Biden (+1) have gained ground.

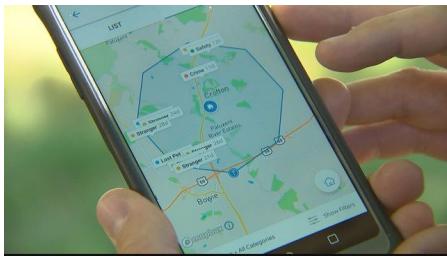

WASHINGTON (FOX 5 DC) — Anne Arundel County residents — are you looking to make your neighborhood safer? Well, county police have started to use a popular home safety service that will give you the chance to work hand in hand with police officers.

Starting this week, police officers in Anne Arundel County will be able to use your pictures and videos in order to catch people suspected of various crimes.

Here's how it'll work: Police are asking residents to download the "Neighbors by Ring" app on your smartphone.

Once you join on the app, you'll then be able to upload video and pictures from your Ring home security device to the cloud.

Police will then have the ability to contact you and ask if they can use your uploaded media to help them apprehend any suspect involved in package thefts, car robberies or any other type of crime.

Robert Blackmore has been a Crofton resident for a few years now and owns a Ring home security device.

He says someone broke into his car several months ago — an incident that persuaded him to use the "Neighbors by Ring" app.

Blackmore says the app makes him feel safer knowing other community members are on the lookout, yet he also mentioned some privacy issues.

He told FOX 5 he is concerned about other members in the neighborhood who may not want an image of their house out there, nevertheless, Blackmore feels the overall good the app does outweigh the negative.

“If this helps to alleviate some of the crime and give a police department the aggregated data that they need to be able to use their resources to effectively action something that happens in the neighborhood then that’s fantastic. I think the benefit far outweighs any privacy concerns and honestly, I don’t really have any,” said Blackmore.

Police say they can only use the information uploaded to the app at the permission of the owner. The app also hides the identity of every user who uploads any kind of information. The system has officially been adopted county wide on Monday.

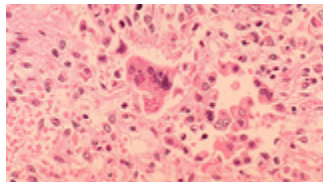

MANASSAS, Va. (FOX 5 DC) - Health officials are alerting the public to a potential exposure to the measles virus after a person with a confirmed case of measles was known to have been in several places in different parts of northern Virginia over the past weekend and earlier this week.

Officials are alerting those who may have been at the following **locations** on these specific dates and times:

- Dulles International Airport in Terminal A and Baggage Claim **level** on Sunday, June 2, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m.

- Novant Health UVA Health System Haymarket Medical Center, 15225 Heathcote Boulevard, Haymarket, VA in the emergency department on Sunday, June 2 at 11 p.m. through early Monday, June 3 at 4:30 a.m.

- Inova Fair Oaks Hospital, 3600 Joseph Siewick Drive, Fairfax, VA in the emergency department, including the waiting area, on Tuesday, June 4 from 3 to 5:30 p.m.

Officials warn that based on the date of exposure in this instances, if you were potentially infected with measles you may develop symptoms as late as June 25.

The Virginia Department of Health advises anyone at the above locations at the times noted should:

- If you have received two doses of a measles containing vaccine (either the measles, mumps and rubella [MMR] vaccine or a measles only vaccine which is available in other countries) you are protected and do not need to take any action.

- If you have received only one dose of a measles containing vaccine, you are very likely to be protected and your risk of being infected with measles from any of these exposures is very low.

However, to achieve complete immunity, contact your health care provider about getting a second vaccine dose.

- If you have never received a measles containing vaccine nor had a documented case of measles, you may be at risk of getting measles from this exposure. Contact your local health department or health care provider for advice on possible intervention to decrease your risk of becoming infected or other precautions you need to take. If you notice the symptoms of measles, stay home and away from others and immediately call your primary health care provider or health department to discuss further care. Call ahead before going to the office or the emergency room and tell them that you were exposed to measles.

GERMANTOWN, Md. (FOX 5 DC) - First responders treated about 100 people after a backyard deck collapsed during a house party Saturday night in Germantown.

Nobody was seriously hurt, but one partygoer went to the hospital for a non-life threatening injury, authorities say. First responders treated everyone else at the scene.

WESTFIELD, N.J. - A Delaware man is in police custody after authorities in New Jersey say he was found with a handgun and ammunition outside of an elementary school.

Thomas J. Wilkie, 46, of Bear, Delaware is facing a number of charges after police say they found him in a school parking lot with the gun more than 100 rounds of ammunition just before 4 p.m. Thursday.

Westfield police responded to Tamques Elementary School after receiving a report from New Castle County police in Delaware that Wilkie was on his way to the school and may be armed.

The school was placed on lockdown as a precaution, and responding officers found Wilkie in the front seat of his SUV, parked in the school's parking lot.

Police say Wilkie was holding a .45-caliber handgun with hollow-point bullets. Two additional loaded magazines of ammunition were also recovered, along with 130 additional rounds of ammunition that were in the trunk.

Wilkie has been charged with second-degree unlawful possession of a weapon, fourth-degree possession of hollow-point bullets, and fourth-degree trespassing on school grounds.

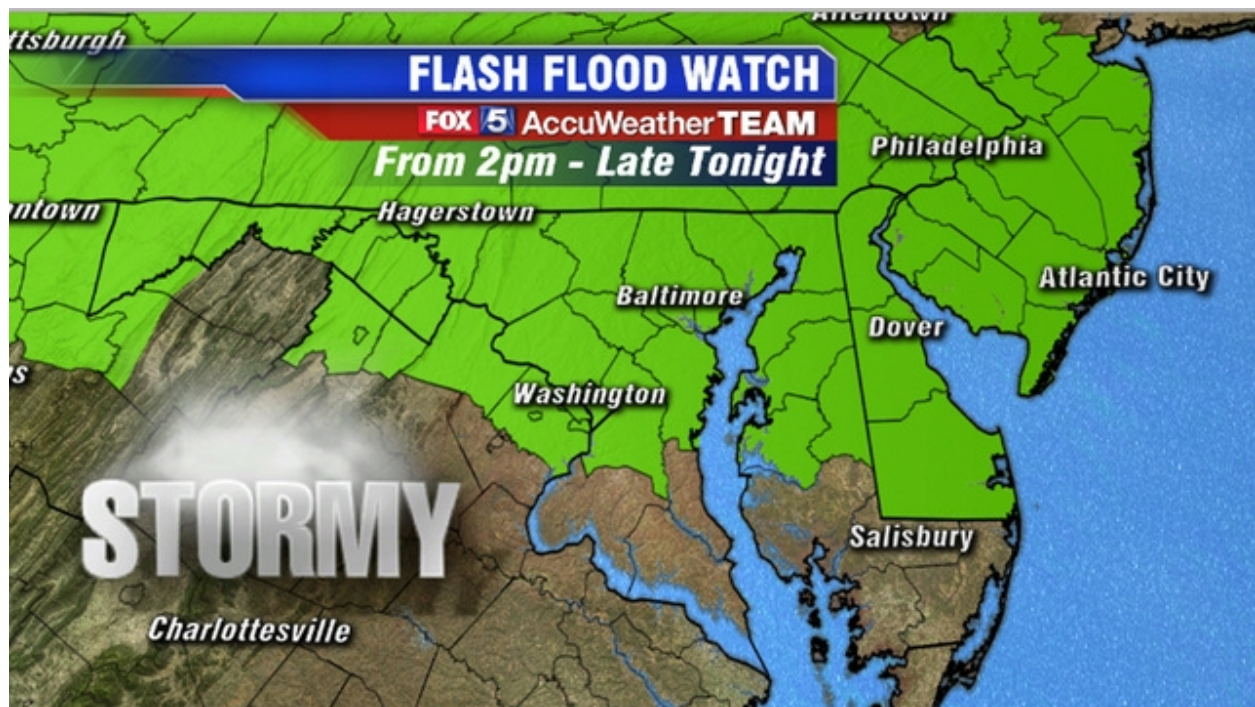

WASHINGTON (FOX 5 DC) - We're in for a humid and stormy workweek with the potential for heavy rain and showers during the second half of each day through Thursday.
