There's a \$30,000 reward to find a killer in Columbia in Howard County. A clerk at a 7-11 store was shot to death overnight. Someone heard the gunshot and called police around 3am. There were video monitors in the store but police say they're not sure they captured the shooting. The description of the suspect is very vague, only that he was wearing a mask. Customers are describing the victim as quiet, polite and a hard worker.

4/25 DC Jail Mistake

The DC jail has set three inmates free by mistake in the last three months. Officials at the DC jail claim it's a paper work problem. In the most recent case, a man was let out two weeks ago. Today he was back in court. A judge ordered him to start serving his six month sentence today. A lawyer who won a \$12 million lawsuit for record keeping problems says the same old problem is to blame. he says the jail's system for processing prisoners is broken.

4/25 Officers Struck

In Montgomery County, one officer is in grave condition and another is seriously injured after a bizarre accident. One officer was trying to chase down a DUI suspect on foot in Aspen Hill. When he tried to cross the street, another officer's patrol car hit him. Police are not releasing the names of the officers.

4/25 VA SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

Police are releasing more information they've learned on the Virginia Tech shootings. Seung-Hui Cho took just nine minutes to kill 30 people in Norris Hall. He fired more than 170 rounds of ammunition and killed or injured more than 50 faculty members, staff and students. Law enforcement officers say they're combing through hundreds of clues to find answers. What they still don't know right now is Cho's motive for the rampage.

4/23 Sherman Avenue Fatal

DC Police are trying to figure out who shot 18 year old Edwin Ventura five times early Sunday morning at Columbia Road and Sherman Avenue. He was shot by masked attackers wearing all black clothing. Police say the motive isn't clear but DC Councilman Jim Graham says he's been told investigators are looking at whether this was gang related or came from a recent altercation. Ventura was the father of a four month old baby.

4/23 Va Tech Today

Students returned to class today, one week after the shootings that killed 32 of their classmates and the gunman. The students say they're glad to be back and hope that getting back to a normal routine will give them some comfort. The day started with a moment of silence for the two victims in the dorm, then again at the time Seung Hui Cho killed 30 students at Norris Hall.

4/10 FFX Stranger Danger

Fairfax Couty police are alerting the public today about a dangerous incident that occurrend earlier this month. A man jumped a fence and tried to attack a 9 year old girl as she was playing in her own backyard. The girl was oustside when a man apparently scaled a fence and grabbed her. She fought back and ran inside. The man got away.

4/10 Stillwater Place Shooting

A 19 year old an is behind bars today. He is charged in last year's murder of a DC area record producer. Raymond Brown was gunned down as he tried to folow a tow truck he thought was stealing his car. Neiman Marcus Edmonds is in lockup waiting to appear before a judge on possible extradition to Prince George's County. Sources tell Fox 5 Edmonds has been arrested before for car theft in the county. DC Police pickedu im up on a murder warrant this morning in the district.

4/2 PG Club Crackdown

Prince George's county officials say crimes happen all too often at some night clubs there. 4 days ago, police padlocked clubs considered trouble spots. Now an agreement, promising increased security and more

safety measures mean the clubs can reopen.

4/2 Frederick Townhouse Bodies

There are disturbing new details in the case of those children and their father found dead in a Frederick Maryland townhome. The three little girls died from suffocation. The only boy in the house, a 3 year old, was murdered with blows to his skull. The preliminary autopsy says the father died from suicide by hanging. Meanwhile, no one can find the children's mother. Police say she used several alias, with several different names on her ID cards. Police won't comment publicly on reports of a troubled marriage or whether they fear for her safety or consider her a suspect in these devastating deaths.

Police say 19 year old Trae Allen was shot and killed in Richardson's home then they got a tip he had bragged about killing the store clerk. He has an extensive arrest record in Maryland.

5/22 Lynchburg Threat

A Liberty University student was arrested and accused of having gasoline bombs in his car, the day before the funeral for school founder Jerry Falwell. Reports say he may have been planning to disrupt any protests that could happen at the funeral. Police say it does not appear he meant to disrupt the funeral. Thousands of people attended Falwell's funeral today. The Campbell County Sheriff's office is still investigating whether anyone else might have been involved.

5/21 MySpace Sex offenders

Today Myspace.com announced it will turn over the names of convicted sex offenders who are registered members of the site. Child advocates say it's a good move that will go a long way to keeping track of child predators online. 14 states including Maryland asked Myspace for the information. Myspace says it started collecting information back in December on sex offenders with the intent of turning it over to authorities. So far, 7000 sex offender profiles have been removed.

5/21 | Street Ped HIt

A young man was hit by a car of robbery suspects being chased by police.

It happened at 10th and H Streets in Northeast. Police were chasing a car after getting a call about a violent robbery on Capital Grounds. They tried to stop the suspects but the car kept going. Police say the suspects hit an innocent boy walking across 10th street. The two suspects bailed out of the car about a block away. The car has temporary tags from North Carolina. Neighbors question whether police should have chased a car the wrong way down a one way street but police say it's allowed when the suspects are considered an imminent danger to the community. The boy was taken to the hospital and is expected to be okay.

5/16 Police Week Misconduct

DC police chief Kathy Lanier is warning police officers to behave during Police Week or face the consequences. Police all over the country are in DC for the special week to honor fallen officers. Some citizens have complained of rowdy officers drinking in the streets. DC's chief and the FOP both say officers won't get a break if they're caught breaking the law.

5/16 Plastic Bag Attack

A dangerous predator is on the loose attacking women in Northern Virginia. Police say he sneaks up from behind, throws a plastic bag over a woman's head and gropes her. He's struck three times in the Arlington area since March. Because the attacks are so quick and happen at night, there isn't much of a description of the attacker. Arlington police are urging women not to walk alone at night.

5/15 Parking Ticket Criminal Link

A Fox 5 follow up tonight. DC police are about to get their hands on new technology that will help track down stolen vehicles. He was expected to turn himself in today to face charges of sexually assaulting a 15 year old student. Thomas used to teach at the Forestville Military Academy and according to Fox 5 sources, he's accused of having sex with a student who was then 15 and now 17. He's also accused of taking an 18 year old student to a business conference in San Francisco without his parents' permission.

5/7 Pins in Skl Food

Three different times in ten days, sewing pins have been found inside school lunches at Rachel Carson Middle School in Herndon, Virginia. The school has called police to find out who did this and stop it from happening again. Cafeteria workers found the first pin on April 24th laying on top of applesauce. Two days later, a teacher found a second pin stuck in the foil on a yogurt and on Friday, a worker found the third pin on top of cranberry sauce. Fairfax County schools and police are investigating. No one has been hurt; the school is stepping up its security on the cafeteria food.

5/2 Fire Marshal Investigation

The FBI is conducting a corruption investigation of the DC Fire Marshal's office. For the last 2 months, federal agents have been looking into allegations of wrongdoing against at least one investigator. Tonight, we've learned the Fire Marshal has been transferred and a supervisor has been placed on leave as the FBI continues to question people within the office. Right now, the probe is centered on fire inspections. Last Saturday, Lanier announced that the reward for information eading to an arrest and indictment in Cutchin's death would be doubled to 50-thousand dollars. This morning, Lanier credited investigating officers and help from the community in making the arrest. The investigation into the case is continuing.

A not guilty verdict on all charges against former DC mayor Marion Barry. The DC Councilman was accused of DUI charges. Today he took the stand defending his actions during the traffic stop in September. Secret Service agents who stopped Barry's car last September tenth testified that Barry smelled of alcohol, was stumbling and had red eyes and slurred speech. The 71-year-old Barry says he was not drunk or using drugs. His attorney says the problems that led to Barry's arrest were the result of his age and medications he was taking for diabetes and high blood pressure. In his ruling, D-C Superior Court Judge Richard Ringell said he could not find beyond a reasonable doubt that Barry was intoxicated. He noted a breathalyzer test registered a blood-alcohol content of -point-zero-two, well below the legal limit of point-zero-eight.

6/11 Girl Touched in Store

The Sheriff's Office in Loudoun County is investigating a report that a man inappropriately touched a 5 year old girl while she was shopping with her mother in a Sterling store on Saturday. The nonprofit group recruits and trains teachers to serve in urban districts, including D-C. Rhee spent three years as an elementary school teacher in Baltimore in the mid-1990s. She says she is honored to lead D-C's schools, and is excited about bringing about change.

6/11 Autism Vaccines

Thousand of families who claim that vaccines caused their children's autism are closely watching a hearing before the federal court. The parents of a 12-year-old autistic girl have asked a federal court to find that the autism was caused by common childhood vaccines. This is the first in a series of nine test cases that could pave the way for thousands of autistic children to get compensation from a government fund that was set up to help people who were injured by the shots. The girl's parents believe a preservative called thimerosal, which was used in vaccines, weakened their daughter's immune system. They say it prevented her body from clearing the measles virus after she was immunized at the age of 15 months. Today, she suffers from a series of health problems, including severe autism, claucoma and epilepsy. Nearly five-thousand similar claims have been lodged with the government. But large scientific studies have found no association between autism and the vaccines. And a government lawyer said many of the

claims are based on conjecture or speculation. The hearing is expected to last three weeks.

6/11 Va Tech Mental Health

A government panel is trying to figure out how the Virginia Tech tragedy happened. Before the shooting, Seung Hui Cho did get some help from the mental health system but it seems he still slipped through the tracks. Today the panel appointed by Virginia Governor Tim Kaine held a public meeting trying to find out why he didn't get more mental help. Even before the hearing, parents and families of the victims were upset that none of them were invited to be on the panel. The group's chair says it's important for the panel to be objective.

6/11 Girard St Fatal



Investigators don't believe Terry Cutchin was the target but they do believe the same gunman tried to shoot a teenage girl on the same block that same day.

6/11 Girl Touched in Store

The Sheriff's Office in Loudoun County is investigating a report that a man inappropriately touched a 5 year old girl while she was shopping with her mother in a Sterling store on Saturday. According to the 5-year-old, the man approached her in the toy section of the Burlington Coat Factory in the Community Plaza. It happened around 1 PM but authorities were not contacted about the incident until after 8 PM the same evening. The Sheriff's is asking what took so long. He says in a shoplifting case, the store would have called for help immediately. This may not be the only case. In January, a stranger kissed an 8 year old girl in the same store. The store didn't call police then, either. He says the store has security cameras but no one knows how to work them. The store managers didn't comment.

6/6 Bus Stop Hit

We're learning more about the woman accused of plowing through a group of children at a bus stop in La Plata. A judge set a \$50,000 bail for Jacqueline Simmons. She didn't say much in court but her mother says Simmons has been trying to kick her drug habit. Police arrested her yesterday nine miles away from where witnesses say she hit the children and kept going. Four kids were hurt. Police say she failed two out of three sobriety tests. Simmons has a history of DUI and hit and run convictions. In 2005, she had another DUI and hit and run conviction. IN 2006, she had another DUI. Both of those cases were in South Carolina. 

WASA's chief admitted the agency doesn't even know how many hydrants the city has, but claims 29 are out of service, which is less than 1% of the city's estimated 9,000. DC Fire officials say not knowing which hydrants are out of service is like playing russian roulette.

A fast-moving fire engulfed a row home, killing six people and critically injuring seven others, most of them members of an extended family. At least one child was killed in the fire. They were part of a group of seven inmates picking up trash along the Inner Loop south of Branch Avenue when a man lost control and swerved onto the shoulder. The 65 year old driver was traveling from Philadelphia to Richmond. Maryland State Police say he may have had a medical emergency of fell asleep at the wheel. Charges are pending. The victim, James Morton -Bey was serving a two year sentence at a boot camp in Jessup.

6/14 Struck by Lightning

A 16 year old Virginia boy was struck by lightning inside his house! It happened Friday night in Bowling Green Virginia. Now he's talking about what happened. Craig Swanson and his family were huddled in the hall during the storm when lightning struck right in the middle of his house. Craig's dad saw a big spark come out of his shoulder, then the teen started screaming in pain. He spent two days at the hospital but is fine except for a few burn marks. The house has several scorched areas where you can see what happened.

6/13 Pants Lawsuit

A 54 million dollar lawsuit over a pair of pants at the drycleaners. Today, closing arguments wrapped up in DC Superior Court. The man suing, DC Judge Roy Pearson says Custom Cleaners lost his pants in 2005. The store owner testified today they found the pants and tried to give them back but Pearson insisted those pants did not belong to him. Pearson says the company violated DC's Consumer Protection laws by posting a sign that says "satisfaction guaranteed" and not living up to the promise. Defense attorneys questioned Pearson about his divorce proceedings. A trial court had ruled that he was largely responsible for the "excessive driving up of legal costs... by creating unnecessary litigation." Attorneys for the dry cleaners portrayed Pearson as financially desperate with no job when he filed the suit.

6/12 Fireworks Testing

Neighbors in a Montgomery County neighborhood are complaining about government testing. The Consumer Product Safety Commissions rents property in Beallsville o test fireworks. That leaves smoke and debris and makes loud noises in their home. Neighbors and the agency tried to reach an agreement for months. Today, the CPSC announced it was terminating its contract for the property. Neighbors will still have to listen to the testing through the end of July.

6/11 Puppy Mills

The Humane Society is releasing details of an investigation into puppy mills. It claims some puppies at local stores come from puppy mills that sell their dogs at auction. The dogs are kept in small cages, sometimes without water out in the hot sun. The dogs then go to pet stores and owners buy them, not knowing the dog's history. One local woman says she bought a dog that way and ended up spending \$6000 on vet bills to save him from pneumonia. The humane society says you should always check out your local animal shelter or rescue group for a breed, or buy from a breeder you can visit in person. Always ask to see the areas the dogs are kept in .

Some parents at the Woodridge campus of the Friendship Public Charter School just learned today that the teacher was suspended. They are upset that they didn't know a teacher was being investigated. DC's public charter school board says individual schools handle personnel matters internally and that the Friendship School has a good track record.

4/23 School Trip Questions

A top Prince George's County School official is under intense scrutiny for taking a teenager with him to a school board conference in San Francisco, apparently without the parents' permission. Nathaniel Thomas was absent today's regularly scheduled personnel meeting. He's accused of taking an 18 year old male student with to the School Board Association Conference. Thomas has publicly said he's done nothing wrong. The student is 18 years old and is considered an adult, so police are not investigating. The school board has hinted privately that at the least, the trip poses serious ethical questions.

4/03 DC School Reform Vote

DC's new mayor wanted control of the city's crumbling and failing schools and it looks like he's going to get it. After 3 months of debate and public hearings, the DC Council has given initial approval to a change in the way schools are run. Mayor Adrian Fenty will have ultimate responsibility. An elected School Board member resigned in protest over the change. Giving the Mayor control of the schools will allow him to hire and fire a chancellor and also establishes an authority to modernize, build and repair schools. It also sets up an office to hear complaints and help solve problems. Two councilmembers voted against the plan. The final bill is expected to pass with minor amendments in a couple of weeks.

Questions about that trip led to the allegation about the sexual misconduct with a student. It's up to the State Board whether to remove him.

5/9 Pins in Skl Food

A 12 year old boy is under arrest accused of putting straight pins in his classmate's food. It started as three cases spanning about ten days. Now there's a fourth case of a paper clip found in a chicken nugget. It's all happened at Rachel Carson Middle School in Herndon. Police thought they had the case wrapped up when they arrested the 12 year old. Then, another student found the piece of metal in his chicken. Police are investigating this latest case. To make meals safer, cafeteria workers are now letting students order their food, then lunch workers prepare it and hand it to them at the end of the food line. Police say there's no way the student already arrested could have participated in this latest case.

5/8 SKL board member arrested

A local school board member is now behind bars. Nathaniel Thomas turned himself in on charges late this afternoon. He's accused of a sexual offense against a 15 year old former student. This ends a four day manhunt for Thomas. Police had been searching for him since Friday when they issued an arrest warrant. Thomas surrended at Prince George's County headquarters surrounded by his family. Under a deal with the State's Attorney's Office, Thomas agreed to a \$100,000, not to have contact with anyone under 18 and he will surrender his passport. He is also accused of taking an 18 year old student to a business seminar in California without the teen's parents' permission

5/7 SKL Board Member

Police in Prince George's County are now looking for one of the county's school board members. Sources tell Fox 5 police are searching for Nathaniel Thomas. He was expected to turn himself in today to face charges of sexually assaulting a 15 year old student. Thomas used to teach at the Forestville Military Academy and according to Fox 5 sources, he's accused of having sex with a student who was then 15 and now 17. He's also accused of taking an 18 year old student to a business conference in San Francisco without his parents' permission.

5/7 Pins in Skl Food

Three different times in ten days, sewing pins have been found inside school lunches at Rachel Carson Middle School in Herndon, Virginia. The school has called police to find out who did this and stop it from happening again. Cafeteria workers found the first pin on April 24th laying on top of applesauce. Two days later, a teacher found a second pin stuck in the foil on a yogurt and on Friday, a worker found the third pin on top of cranberry sauce. Fairfax County schools and police are investigating. No one has been hurt; the school is stepping up its security on the cafeteria food.

6/14 New School Building Czar

If they do, she becomes the 7th head of DC schools in 10 years. Rhee founded the New Teacher Project in 1997. The nonprofit group recruits and trains teachers to serve in urban districts, including D-C. Rhee spent three years as an elementary school teacher in Baltimore in the mid-1990s. She says she is honored to lead D-C's schools, and is excited about bringing about change.

4/26 Shrek Protest

A children's advocacy group wants the Department of Health and Human Services to oust Shrek from his role as spokesman for an anti-obesity drive. The Campaign for a Commercial-Free Childhood says the soon-to-open "Shrek the Third" has too many promotional ties with unhealthy foods to justify using the ogre as a health advocate. The ad campaign features ads in which Shrek and his fellow characters urge children to exercise at least an hour a day. The Shrek character is also used to advertise sugary cereals, popsicles and yogurt.

4/24 FDA Food Safety

There are calls tonight to protect the food supply after a string of outbreaks linked to tainted food. Hundreds of people have gotten sick or died from contaminated spinach, peanut butter or lettuce in the last year. That and the recent pet food recall are raising questions about the Food and Drug Administration's ability to keep food safe. A Colorado Congresswoman claims the FDA does not have enough authority to investigate and order companies to turn over their records. Some Congressmembers want to see a single agency to oversee food safety. Right now, it's the responsibility of more than a dozen agencies.

4/10 PG Hospital Center

The closing of the financially troubled Prince George's Hospital System "appears unavoidable." That's according to a statement released by Governor Martin O'Malley's administration. Negotiations with county officials collapsed late Monday in a last-minute effort to get legislation passed before the end of the General Assembly. Lawmakers wanted assurances from local officials that they were committed to their end of the plan, but county officials wouldn't agree on all the details. Prince George's Hospital Center and three other facilities are owned by the county and run by a nonprofit company. Together, they serve about 180-thousand patients a year, many of them poor and uninsured. County Executive Jack Johnson says he's hopeful there's still a way to save the hospital system.

4/09 MD General Assembly

This is the final day for Maryland's General Assembly. One of the biggest items out of this year's legislation is a smoking ban. Maryland will join Delaware and the District in banning smoking in restaurants and bars.

4/9 Bed Bugs Return

All 50 states are reporting bedbug outbeaks. They're smaller than a pencil eraser and they plan themselves in beds. The bugs are hard to spot unless you know what you're looking for. A thorough vacuum and steam teatment will usually get rid of them but it may take a couple of tries. Exterminators say bed bugs are making a comeback due to a shift toward less toxic pesiticides and indoor sprays.

4/3 DC Rats

A national TV show says it found rats and mice running rampant in some DC restaurants. The Baja Fresh near Dupont Circle shut down for a day to clean up the mess from mice. It now has a clean inspection record. The Popeyes on 14th Street is still closed after the rodent sighting and so does an Adams Morgan Mexican restaurant. The Department of Health pest control experts say his inspectors run 10,000 calls a year. Much of the trouble is that huge containers of garbage feed and attract all those pests. Baja Fresh's president told Inside Edition the store was dealing with an ongoing rodent problem in the building. The Popeyes manager says he was unaware of the rodent problem.

McDonald's says the lawsuits are without merit.

5/15 Teen Drinks to Death

A tragedy for an Annapolis family after a teen drank himself to death. Today his mother is speaking out to try to make sure others don't live through this heartbreak. Claire Herrig-Blaine says she hopes seniors who are about to graduate will consider what they are drinking and be responsible. Her son Galen was a talented musician who never seem to be in any trouble. Last April, he left the house with two friends and never came home. After calling his cellphone, they went looking for him and found police surrounding a car. Galen was dead inside. His blood alcohol level was nearly four times the legal limit. An adult bought the liquor for the boys. When Galen got drunk, his friends threw a blanket over him and left him there. They didn't know he was dead.

5/15 VA Lyme Disease.

A serious disease is on the rise in Virginia. Lyme disease cases are up dramatically. Fairfax, Prince William and Loudoun Counties have the most cases. Lyme disease is caused by the tiny deer tick. Large deer herds and more development in their natural habitat have contributed to the spike. The disease leaves victims with long term health problems.

5/15 Mogo Transfat Ban

The Montgomery County Council has unanimously approved a ban on the use of trans fats in restaurants, supermarket bakeries and delis. The move makes Montgomery the first county in the nation to restrict the artery clogging oils. It is similar to legislation passed recently in New York and Philadelphia.

The measure takes effect in January for restaurants and in January 2009 for establishments offering baked goods that aren't

prepackaged. French fries and chicken tenders will still be on the menu at fast food places, but they'll have to find other types of oil to

took them in. Supermarkets will still be able to sell prepackaged foods containing trans fats, such as Oreo cookies. Dunkin' Donuts would have to comply unless the company obtains a

waiver. Church suppers would have to stop serving food with trans

fatty oils unless the pastor gets a waiver from the county health department.

5/9 Surgical Fires Folo

An update tonight on a Fox 5 investigation. Surgical fires can be a devastating medical error. They're operating room accidents that permanently scar and even kill patients every year. They can happen even in minor procedures when an ignition source, like a laser, comes into contact with oxygen or flammable materials or liquid anesthestics around a patient. A Federal law that could help prevent them is stalled. Now, after our report, Senator Edward Kennedy sent a letter to the Secretary of Health and Human Services. He wants to know when the Department will implement a law passed two years ago aimed at stopping medical mistakes by requiring a system for reporting them. HHS says it cannot give a date for when it will implement the law.

Baby yoga classes are the newest way to get your baby moving and encourage a lifetime of healthy exercise habits. Moms take the classes with their babies as a way to bond with the kids and help mothers get back in shape after birth.

6/18 Counterfeit Products

Fox 5's hidden cameras uncovered counterfeit toothpaste at a store in Virginia, even though that state isn't on the original recall list. The FDA said the counterfeit toothpaste.. possibly contaminated with a poisonous chemcial was only sold in Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. The FDA now says it will expand its investigation to see where else the toothpaste may be on the shelves. Trade experts say many stores are selling dangerous fake products, including power cords and power strips.

6/15 Bad Toothpaste

Our hidden camera found five boxes of possibly contaminated toothpaste on the shelves of a local discount store. The owner says he hadn't heard of the recall until today and has now taken the tubes off the market. At another discount store in Silver Spring, an owner says his business sold 22 tubes of toothpaste possibly contaminated with a poisonous chemical used in antifreeze. Federal inspectors found toothpaste on a shelf at the Dollar Power store containing the chemical (diethylene glycol) last week. A store employee says the toothpaste was ordered from a trading catalogue. Although the toothpaste bears a Colgate label, officials at Colgate-Palmolive say the tubes are counterfeit. The company does not use the chemical in its toothpaste, and has been warning consumers and assisting the government with the recall. Company officials say labeling on the tubes indicate they are manufactured in South Africa and contain several misspellings. Colgate-Palmolive says it does not import toothpaste from South Africa.

The toothpaste has been found in Maryland, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania.

6/14 Kellogg Cereal

Kellogg Co. says it will increase the nutritional value of the cereals and snacks targeted at children or else stop marketing those products to them altogether. Company brands such as Froot Loops cereal and Pop-Tarts toaster pastries that fall outside certain standards will either be reformulated or dropped from advertising that reaches audiences where at least half of the people are under age 12. The change comes after parents and advocacy groups worried about child obesity threatened a lawsuit.

6/11 Autism Vaccines

Thousand of families who claim that vaccines caused their children's autism are closely watching a hearing before the federal court. The parents of a 12-year-old autistic girl have asked a federal court to find that the autism was caused by common childhood vaccines. This is the first in a series of nine test cases that could pave the way for thousands of autistic children to get compensation from a government fund that was set up to help people who were injured by the shots. The girl's parents believe a preservative called thimerosal, which was used in vaccines, weakened their daughter's immune system. They say it prevented her body from clearing the measles virus after she was immunized at the age of 15 months. Today, she suffers from a series of health problems, including severe autism, claucoma and epilepsy. Nearly five-thousand similar claims have been lodged with the government. But large scientific studies have found no association between autism and the vaccines. And a government lawyer said many of the claims are based on conjecture or speculation. The hearing is expected to last three weeks.

06/07 Pet Food Poison

More pet food fears tonight with a new source of possible contamination. A lab in Texas reports finding painkillers in both dog and cat food. That can be very dangerous for pets. Acetaminophen is a painkiller for humans. The lab in Deer Park Texas has tested various pet foods and says it's showing up in some samples. Because of a confidentiality agreement, they can't reveal which brands of pet food are affected.

06/07 Tuberculosis Hearings

Tough questions on Capitol Hill today about the tuberculosis patient that sparked at international health scare. From his hospital bed in Denver, Andrew Speaker angrily denied that he wasn't running or hiding from anyone. He claims he was never ordered not to travel but Fulton County, Georgia officials say they told him he shouldn't travel. The government says he changed his travel plans to get out of the US and to Greece for his wedding earlier than planned. The head of the CDC says they made a mistake in giving him the benefit of the
