Newscasts starts off the day's coverage with news that happened over night, and a look at stories in the making; the 5:30P; 10P; and weekend newscasts on Saturday at 6P and 10P; Sunday at 5:30P and 10P consist of late breaking news, sports and weather. Our viewers are given up-to-the minute news coverage as well as recaps of the day's top stories. Face masks are required at Auburn University, and everyone is urged to test negative before returning to class. In-person inmate visitation is suspended at a local detention center.

COVID AND HOSPITALS

The Omicron variant is causing Covid-19 cases to surge in Alabama. The positivity rate is the highest it has ever been. A month ago, we had under 350 in the hospital with Covid, it has now tripled to almost a thousand. We have just under 200 people in the ICU right now; there were over 800 in August.
