CBN News Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Hospitals across the nation are pushed to the limit due to a spike in COVID-19 cases. Things are particularly bad in Utah and parts of the Midwest. In El Paso, Texas, the situation is so dire residents face a mandatory 10:00 p.m. curfew to blunt the impact. El Paso's largest hospital has prepared for the worst by erecting overflow tents in the parking lot in case there aren't enough beds inside to handle a possible influx of patients. Nationwide, 42,000 people have been hospitalized this week. In Texas, that number surpasses 5,000 – almost double what it was last month. Texas physician Craig DeLisi told CBN News he's concerned about the rise in hospitalizations. Dr. DeLisi said one reason for the increase in cases and hospitalizations is the cooler weather, which drives people inside where the disease is more easily spread. Also, after seven months of practicing mitigation efforts, people are simply tired of wearing maskings and keeping their distance from others. There, the doctor prescribes caution, but no fear. While a lot of attention is focused on increased infections in some places, one often overlooked statistic is the drastic reduction in death rates, a reported 80% since April. According to Johns Hopkins Coronavirus Resource Center the U.S. death rate now stands at 2.6%, lower than 14 other countries in Europe, South America and the Middle East. Six months ago, patients hospitalized with COVID-19 in the US faced a 25% chance of death. Now doctors are seeing a much lower death rate of 7% among those hospitalized with the virus. That includes the anti-viral medication Remdesivir which blocks the replication of the virus. On October 22, 2020, it became the first drug to be approved by the FDA to treat COVID-19. The steroid medication has been given Emergency Use Authorization by the FDA and is used to calm the often deadly "cytokine storm," the over-reaction of the immune system caused by massive inflammation. Both Remdesivir and Dexamethasone were given to President Trump after he was diagnosed with COVID-19. One of the most highly touted drugs given to the president, a polyclonal antibody made by the pharmaceutical company Regeneron, isn't yet available to the general public, but the FDA could issue an Emergency Use Authorization in the months ahead. President Trump is one of only a couple of hundred people to be given the drug on a Compassion Use basis. The drug stimulates a robust immune response to the virus. In the meantime, hospitals are now using a similar treatment, convalescent plasma, which is antibody-rich blood donated by people who have survived COVID-

CBN News Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Even as coronavirus cases and hospitalizations are surging across the nation, rays of hope are beginning to break through. This week brought news that Moderna's vaccine tests show it's 94 percent effective. That's the second vaccine showing promising results in just two weeks. Last week, the US hit a record number of COVID hospitalizations, surpassing one million new confirmed cases in just the first 10 days of this month. Deaths are climbing again. The new wave appears bigger and more widespread than the surges that happened in the spring and summer. Unlike the earlier outbreaks, this one is not confined to just one part of the country. But now both Pfizer and Moderna's coronavirus vaccines have reached a testing-milestone, they'll soon seek FDA emergency use authorization. The two vaccines are similar. Both use what's known as messenger-RNA technology, require an initial shot then a booster three weeks later, and need to be kept frozen. Meanwhile, nine other drug companies are nearing the end of their coronavirus vaccine trials, meaning more than one vaccine will likely be approved. FDA vaccine consultant and Standford researcher Dr. Kari Nadeau helped develop both the Johnson and Johnson and Novavax vaccines. She says regardless of the approved option and timing, Americans can trust the process. And technological advances over the years have helped to speed-up vaccine development. Scientists have been analyzing COVID-19 vaccine data as it comes in, instead of pouring over pages of information after trials are finished as is typically done. Plus, millions of doses are being manufactured now instead of waiting until after approval. Distribution plans have also been mapped out so vaccines can be administered the moment the FDA gives the go-ahead. Last month, nine companies issued a joint statement promising not to seek FDA approval unless a vaccine meets their toughest safety standards. The Centers for Disease Control and National Institutes of Health add that when vaccines receive the green light, their data will be made available to the general public. In the meantime, people should talk to their doctor about any concerns. No vaccine is 100 percent effective. The Food and Drug Administration says the lowest it will tolerate is 50 percent efficacy. Masks and social distancing may still be advised in the months following the release of one or more vaccines.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: A surge in COVID-19 cases coupled with plunging temperatures has led to greater safety measures for homeless shelters across the country. Some must limit the number of people they can help during the pandemic when the need is even greater than usual. The Bowery Mission, a Christian shelter in New York City, first opened to the city's homeless in 1879. Earlier this year, the Big Apple became ground zero in the battle against the coronavirus, forcing the Bowery Mission to change procedures. Winans said the changes come just as needs have grown. Further south, Union Mission Ministries, in operation for 125 years in Norfolk, Virginia, has also made adjustments. Gray explained that the Union Mission can only fill half its normal 400 bed capacity. And earlier this year, they had to turn some people away. With its doors still open, the Mission continues to extend a helping hand to those in need, while miraculously keeping COVID at bay. For the Bowery, running five locations during the pandemic has been especially difficult. He said there have been a few flare-ups. To keep cases down, residents are given daily temperature checks and hygiene has become top priority. As the whole county battles a resurgence of the virus, both The Bowery Mission and Union Mission Ministries stand ready to serve their cities' most vulnerable.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: According to a report by the National Urban League, African Americans are infected with COVID-19 at nearly three times the rate of white Americans. And blacks are twice as likely to die from the virus. Still, many don't plan to get the vaccine. A recent Pew Research survey found that only 32 percent of Black Americans adults answered they would either definitely or probably take a COVID-19 vaccine. According to a report by the COVID Collaborative, just 14 percent trust the vaccine's safety. To build confidence among communities of color, a group of black health professionals put out a public service message. Dr. Reed Tuckson, Founder of Black Coalition Against COVID says a vaccine can't come soon enough given the devastating impact he has witnessed. He admits much of the hesitation goes back to the Tuskegee Syphilis Experiment, a 40-year government study involving hundreds of black men. The men, mostly poor sharecroppers suffering from Syphilis, were monitored by government health officials but not treated. Many dies, went blind, or experienced other severe health problems. It is a history that still haunts many in the black community. Dawn Baker, a local news anchor in Savannah, GA chose a different response. She took part in critical trials for the COVID-19 vaccine, something she sees as part of the solution to this deadly problem. Tuckson also pointed out that much has changed since the experiment. In the meantime, Tuckson said the medical community must earn the trust of blacks who are suffering from COVID-19 as well as those affected by the malpractice of the past.

CBN News Reporter Caitlin Burke Reports: When COVID-19 first took hold in the US, Carlsa Pratico's priority immediately shifted to her parents. The 60-plus group is considered high-risk in a COVID-19 world, even if they're otherwise healthy. According to a New York Life study, that's thrusting Millennials into the role of caretaker at an accelerated rate. The study finds 40 percent of Millennials are now likely to be caring for an elderly parent, compared with 34 percent of Gen Xers and 13 percent of Boomers. Goyer says young caregivers face unique challenges. Practico would help act as a full-time caretaker for her day to giver her mom a break. She found it nearly impossible to juggle work with his care. After six months, other family members stepped in to help and the Practicos decided to return home to New York City. Still, research shows a majority of Millennials predict they will continue providing financial, housing, or care-giving support even after the pandemic ends. A factor that could take a long-term toll. Therran Robinson, 28, has been a caregiver for more than 20 years. Doctors diagnosed his mother with a terminal autoimmune disease when he was just in middle school. Incredibly driven, Robinson worked to juggle a career with his care-giving responsibilities. Then the pandemic changed the game. Suddenly, keeping his mom safe meant staying home. Loneliness is another challenging reality for a caregiver, one exacerbated by this ongoing health crisis. In this case, going online is a blessing for Robinson and many other Millennials. Goyer says taking advantage of resources (http://aarp.org/caregiving) specifically for caregivers and having a support is especially important this time of year. According to a recent AARP survey, the pandemic has had a negative impact on the mental health of 44 percent of caregivers surveyed and nearly half (46 percent) of the people they tend to. Some care recipients may feel depressed or abandoned or have difficulty understanding the changes due to cognitive issues. If you're feeling down AARP has a family caregivers support group on Facebook (http://https://www.facebook.com/groups/aarpfamilycaregivers/) and a telephone support line at 1-877-333-5885. The trend of Millennials stepping in to help aging family members is only expected to grow. Experts say its imperative for this generation to begin factoring this into financial plans, as the pandemic has already highlighted how important it is to prepare for the unexpected.

CBN News Reporter Eric Philip Reports: Suicides are reaching epidemic proportions, and the numbers in the US military are up for the fifth year in a row. It's reaching across generations affecting current troops, veterans, and families. Kim Ruocco knows this from personal experience. Her husband took his life while at the height of his military career. Major John Ruocco served as a Marine Corps pilot for 15 years. A really good one according to his wife, Kim, and the accolades don't stop there. It's a battle he lost in 2005. A social worker by profession, Kim often sensed subtle changes in her husband's behavior during phone calls. John became a part of a growing statistic of active military and veterans who have committed suicide. The latest Pentagon research shows increases over the last five years with more than 500 military suicides in 2018 alone. A Veterans Administration report indicates some 6,000 veterans suicides each year between 2005 and 2017. Dr. Heather Kelly is director of military and veterans health policy at the American Psychological Association. But there is help. After her husband's death, Ruocco started the Assistance Program for Survivors or TAPS. On the prevention side, the American Bible Society has rolled out the "God Understands Campaign" to help service members who are battling depression and other mental health challenges. It includes testimonies from people like Bryan Flanery who attempted suicide while in the army. Groseclose says social distancing in these times only magnifies feelings of isolation, and that could cause the already growing suicide numbers among service members to spike. He says the campaign provides a unique human and divine connection. In fact, experts say faith is what's called a "protective factor" when it comes to suicide. In other words, those who identify with all faiths are at a lower risk for suicide.

CBN News Reporter Chuck Holton Reports: The Trump Administration is making the fight against human trafficking a major priority. In addition to putting money behind the effort, a special unit US Marshals is making a huge difference. In Ohio, a joint operation between federal and state officers recently recovered 35 missing children. A similar operation rescued 39 missing children in Georgia. Behind all this success is a unit of the US Marshals Service. The Sex Offender Investigations branch is made of only three men, working overtime to save as many kids as they can. Of those, at least 65,000 are victims of the commercial sex industry. Ongoing riots and violence against federal courthouses in Portland and elsewhere, however, are taking agents away from this important work. These operations are also complicated because those rescues need special care. Because of COVID crisis and the de-fund the police movement, many agencies don't have the time or resources to track down child predators. And that's where the body of Christ comes in. There are ministries who are putting in the legwork to track down these predators and build cases that will give authorities everything they need to take these guys off the streets. One of them is All Things Possible Ministries, led by former Army Ranger, Jeff Tiegs. And what they find is often chilling. The Trump administration is taking action to put a stop to these heinous crimes. US Attorney General William Barr recently announced that over \$100 million in grants is being awarded across the country targeted at human trafficking prevention initiatives. Those on the front lines of the battle have come to realize law enforcement isn't the ultimate solution.

CBN News Reporter Dale Hurd Reports: The US government is still trying to assess the damage from a massive, 9-month long computer hack on some of our government's most classified networks. The hacking operation, disclosed publicly Sunday, began as far back as March, when much of the federal government and many of America's largest companies installed a software update on their IT networks that included malware called SUNBURST, which could lie dormant for weeks to avoid detection. One security expert told CBN News that on a scale of one to ten, this hack was a ten. Government officials admit they were stunned by the sophistication of the hack, and that many of America's most deeply held secrets may have been stolen. The infected software came from a company called SolarWinds in Austin, Texas, which provides computer network monitoring services to the White House, Pentagon, Secret Service, and most of America's Fortune 500 companies. After the hack, the SolarWinds customer page has been deleted from the company website. The hack was so bad that the Pentagon on Tuesday had to order an emergency shutdown of an internal communications network that handles classified material, something that reportedly never happened before. The mainstream media is calling this a Russian hack, but officials don't really know. They've only said it looks like it was foreign nation state, and that could include China. Whoever the hackers were and whatever they were after, it could take months or even years before experts have the answers.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: Jonathan Fleming spent nearly 25 years in prison for a crime he didn't commit. In 1989, jurors convicted him of second-degree murder in the death of a New York drug dealer. Fleming, who also sold drugs and knew the man, said he a solid alibi. But prosecutors argued that Fleming could have returned to Brooklyn to commit the crime. They also produced a witness who testified to seeing him pull the trigger. Fleming, however, was found guilty and spent the next 24 years of his life behind bars. Fleming said that anger consumed him until an experience he had at a church service behind bars. It was a spiritual transformation that answered long time prayers for Fleming's ex-wife Patricia Johnson. Fleming spent years trying to prove his innocence and a break finally came when new investigators along with Brooklyn's Conviction Review Unit took his case. Attorneys found evidence proving Fleming could not have been in New York at the time of the murder; information authorities never turned over to his defense team. These investigative teams, also known as Integrity Review Units, are spreading across the country. And in 2018 alone, statistics show they helped free 58 wrongfully convicted people. The eyewitness who said she saw Fleming commit the crime also recanted, and newly found witnesses implicated someone else in the murder. An Integrity Review in Georgia helped to free Darrell hall, who in 1991 had been sentenced to life in prison for possessing two grams of cocaine. Media mogul Tyler Perry recently gave Hall a job at his Atlanta studios. In Flemings case, justice arrived on April 8, 2014, after almost 25 long years behind bars. While Fleming is grateful for the work of attorneys and investigators, he said the real credit goes to the Lord. That included letting go of the anger he had towards those responsible for robbing him of nearly 25 years of his life, including time he missed with his mother who passed away shortly after his release. Fleming's story, the subject of an upcoming book entitled, "24/7: Wrongfully Convicted, Rightfully Released," has already been an inspiration. Meanwhile, the state of New York awarded Fleming \$6 million dollars for his wrongful incarceration. He now hopes to help others through the Jonathan Fleming Foundation.

CBN News Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Cataracts go hand-in-hand with a long life. The good news is today's modern cataract surgery can turn back the hands of time and give us the vision we had when we were young. Just ask Mary Benson. After undergoing cataract surgery she now feels a sense of renewed joy and zest for life. She said the results were even better than she hoped they would be. Everyday objects that used to appear blurry and dull now look sharp and vivid. She first noticed a problem when she could no longer read fine print or do handwork. That prompted her to visit Stephen Scoper, M.D., a board-certified, fellowship-trained ophthalmologist and the Vice President of Virginia Eye Consultants. Dr. Scoper recommended Mary have her cataracts surgically removed. Improvements in research and technology put today's procedures remarkably better than the ones performed just ten or twenty years ago. Dr. Scoper performed the surgery on Pat Robertson after the CBN Founder complained of difficulty reading from a distance. Since vision loss is gradual, some patients don't realize how dramatically their eyesight can deteriorate over the years. Dr. Scoper relayed his conversation with Robertson. Most cataract surgeries are performed in an outpatient surgery center, not a hospital. So while blurry, cloudy, muted-colored vision is a natural part of aging, it can be reversible with cataract surgery. Now if only the other problems associated with getting older were as easy to fix!

CBN News Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Alzheimer's is a scary disease because it means no remembering loved ones or how to do basic things like getting dressed. Until recently, doctors didn't know what caused it and couldn't offer much help. However, now that's changed. Just like a roof with dozens of holes can only work if all of them are repaired, Alzheimer's had dozens of causes that must all be addressed, according to Dr. Dale Bredesen who has researched the causes and treatments of Alzheimer's Disease for more than thirty years. His book, "The End of Alzheimer's Disease: The First Protocol to Enhance Cognition and Reverse Decline at Any Age" lists the many different causes of Alzheimer's and describes how his Bredesen Protocol can prevent the disease and has been shown to reverse symptoms in people with mild to severe cognitive decline. Sally Weinrich reversed her symptoms when she started the Bredesen Protocol after being diagnosed with the early stages of Alzheimer's Disease. She has been on The Bredesen Protocol for four years and has remained mentally sharp the entire time. She says her husband Martin discovered The Bredesen Protocol through an internet search and helped his wife get started on it. The first step of the Bredesen Protocol involves getting what's called a "cognoscopy." A cognoscopy tests for each of the dozens of Alzheimer's risk factors. It's a simple procedure that involves giving blood and taking a quick, online quiz that measures a person's mental capacity compared with other people who are the same age. Since each person is different, the results will vary. The online test measures things like memory and reaction time. The blood tests measure levels for good things like Vitamin D, Magnesium and Zinc as well as bad, such as toxins and inflammation. The cognoscopy also tests your genetic risk. Approximately 75 million Americans, roughly one in four people, carry one copy of the ApoE4 gene, which equates to a thirty percent increase in the risk of Alzehimer's. Approximately seven million Americans carry both copies of the gene, which means they have more than a fifty percent risk of developing Alzehimer's Disease. Two-thirds of Americans with Alzheimer's Disease carry one or both copies of the ApoEr gene. Three-quarters of Americans carry two copies of the ApoE4 gene, which means they have a nine percent chance of developing Alzheimer's during their lifetime. (http://www.synergymedicalcenter.com/functional-medicine-cognitive-health-program-virginia-beach-norfolkchesapeake.php) is one of the more than 1,500 physicians who has trained under Dr. Bredesen and prescribes his protocol to her patients. Until now, too many people didn't want to know whether they carried one or both copies of the ApoE4 gene because they felt there was nothing they could do about it. However, now the opposite is true. People should know early whether they carry the gene because with early intervention science now tells us it's possible to silence it, or "turn it off." Patients can learn the nearest location of a health care professional who has trained in the Bredesen Protocol on the website. Patients can also work with their primary care physician to prescribe the blood work needed for a cognoscopy. Patients can also get a cognoscopy by working directly with practitioners at Apollo Health, the brain health community founded by Dr. Bredesen. Dr. Ryder says she reviews the results of a patient's cognoscopy with them. Based on the results of the cognoscopy, the patient is prescribed a tailor-made program using diet, exercise, sleep, stress reduction, supplements, and more. So far more than 5,000 people have started the protocol. Dr. Bredesen and this team have documented cases of patients who initially scored low on the Montreal Cognitive Assessment, or MoCA, a screening that measures brain function, who improved after adopting the protocol. Likewise, patients who had poor EEGs, which measure brain-wave speed showed improvement and those with brain shrinkage detected on MRI scans later showed increased volume after being on the protocol. Dr. Bredesen published research studies documenting cases before and after evidence of improved cognition, including Sally Weinrich's. Meanwhile, Dr. Bredesen's research continues. So instead of using a single drug to treat Alzheimer's Disease, it appears a customized, multi-pronged approach to treatment and prevention could be the best strategy to fight this scourge.

Sam Sorbo adds onto her husband's story as they went through infertilely stating "You're going to have trouble in this world, we were promised that, but there is always a way through, and God has the opportunity to redeem only through our struggles and problems."

The life of a woman prisoner is very dangerous. Many of these women will never adapt to so-called 'normal life' because of the traumatic experience they face behind those prison walls. There's a tremendous amount of tension, violence, and fear that women face daily. The percentage of women going to prison has skyrocketed over the last 30 years by 646%, rising from about 15,000 women to over 110,000 women. So many of these women experience physical and sexual abuse while imprisoned. More than one million women are a part of the criminal justice system whether it is through incarceration, probation, or parole. Many of these women are mothers, or mothers to be, at the time of their imprisonment, and 62% of these women have children under the age of 18 while in prison. These incarcerated women find themselves in a place of regret, depression, physical harm, and sometimes with suicidal thoughts. But the bars of a prison cell are not strong enough to hold back God's grace, love and forgiveness. These are the stories of a few women who were once locked in a prison cell but found the keys to freedom through Jesus Christ.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: President Trump has unveiled a plan for Black Americans to increase iobs and financial opportunities. It is called the "Black Economic Empowerment Platinum Plan" and it commits \$500 billion to inner-city areas to create an era of new prosperity and close the wealth gap in black communities. The president recently pitched the plan during an event in Atlanta. Georgia small business owner Bruce LeViell, who also heads the president's National Diversity Coalition, says he was overcome with emotion as he heard details about the plan. California GOP Congressional candidate Joe Collins, who also attended the event applauds the move. The president's plan comes at a time when America's wealth gap between whites and blacks remains substantial. According to a report by the Federal Reserve, in 2019, the typical white family had an approximate net worth of \$188,200, compared to \$24, 100 for black families. Plus about 46 percent of white families own their own home, compared to 17 percent of black families. President Trump is promising that, if reelected, over the next four years his administration will improve those numbers by creating three million jobs for the black community, 500,000 black-owned businesses. He also commits to increasing homeownership opportunities for African Americans, providing access to better education and higher policing standards. Often touting his accomplishments such as historically low unemployment for blacks and prison reform, the President argues that Democrats have long taken African-American voters for granted. In 2016, Trump received just eight percent of the black vote. A recent Washington Post/ABC News poll found black voters heavily favor former Vice President Joe Biden over Trump 88 to nine percent. LeVell believes it is time for blacks to seriously consider what Trump has to offer. LeVell admitted that it's a tough sell to many considering the hostility and division in today's political climate. Yet he is hopeful that Election Day results will prove the polls wrong. Meanwhile, to further wood black voters, the president's plan also includes a proposal to make Juneteenth, the day African Americans mark the end of slavery in the US, a federal holiday.

CBN News Reporter Caitlin Burke Reports: Since COVID-19 initially slammed the economy, we're now seeing a recover; with stronger than expected job growth, falling unemployment rates, and even payroll increases. However, the latest numbers also reveal more working mothers being forced to choose between careers and their children. Some of the earliest jobs lost to the pandemic came in restaurants, salons, hotels, and retail - all industries dominated by women. Then, as the economy began to re-open, many schools remained closed, keeping students home to learn virtually and forcing parents to make it work. It wasn't long before that became unsustainable for Thomas and she chose to quit her job as a director for a non-profit to focus full time on her family. She is now among the nearly 900,00 women who left the workforce in September, right as the school year began. One downside potential for Thomas is that, according to a Washington Post (https://www.washingtonpost.com/graphics/2020/business/coronavirus-recession-equality/?itid=lk) inline manual 19), mothers of school-aged children are taking longer to re-enter the workforce. Economists fear this could have consequences for working women. The authors (http://https://faculty.wcas.northwestern.edu/~mdo738/research/ADOT 0720.pdf) published by Northwestern University state that, not only will it take longer for these women to find hard work, they will also find it harder to get jobs comparable to their previous positions. Researchers conclude that could result in decades of women earning less. Meanwhile, this pandemic is also weighing heavy on mothers who are working outside the home. Martin returned from maternity leave in August, then only a month later, she found out her two older children would be learning from home. Staying home isn't an option financially for her family so Martin finds herself helping with school assignments from work, at nights and on weekends. Her limitations weigh heaviest when sees her children struggling. Many economists say priority number one should be getting kids back in school. They're pushing Congress to pass another stimulus that includes checks specifically for families with children, hoping to provide a financial cushion to help pay for childcare or private schooling.

CBN News Reporter Heather Sells Reports: Across the country, the economic pain is still hitting Americans hard with 21 million out of work and 6.6 percent of mortgages in delinquency. The congressional bailout that's been protecting mortgages and extending unemployment runs out at the end of December, putting pressure on lawmakers to pass another relief package. But investors are looking down the road and signaling their optimism. On Tuesday, the Dow rose more than 400 points to surpass 30,000 for the first time in history. Greg McBride, the chief analyst for Bankrate, a financial company, says it's especially significant after months of the economy getting hit by COVID-19 restrictions and lockdowns. Perhaps even more impressive, however, is the S&P 500, which represents the broader market, increasing by 1.5 percent on Tuesday for its own record high. It has far greater impact on 401K accounts than the Dow. What might be encouraging the stock market is recent news about the promising development of several vaccines with initial distribution possibly starting in mid-December. McBride says investors are paying close attention. President Trump, who has shunned the cameras in recent weeks, returned to the podium Tuesday to highlight the good news and praise the medical community. Many also believe that investors are encouraged to see the presidential transition process moving forward and in particular, former vice president Joe Biden naming the former Federal Reserve chairwoman Janet Yellen as secretary of the Treasury. The good news from Wall Street cannot trickle down fast enough for the many Americans who find themselves in long food lines this week, waiting for Thanksgiving turkey or just a few extra groceries. In Ft. Worth, Texas, Operation Blessing partnered with The Goodness Project and Gateway Church to distribute food. Gateway Pastor Stephen Wilson said the needs are great. But he also said the season is causing many to reflect on how God has provided.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: More than 400,000 children make up the foster care system in the United States. Experts say COVID-related family issues are likely to increase that number. But there is good news as more families show an interest in providing homes for kids in need. Earlier this year when a video of a 9-year-old Oklahoma boy named Jordan pleading for a family hit the web, the story went viral. In just twelve hours thousands of inquiries poured in to adopt Jordan, who had been in foster care for six years. His case highlights the crisis of children stuck in America's foster care system. Kimberly Offutt of Bethany Christian Services said with lives disrupted due to the pandemic, many families are seeing a rise in substance abuse, domestic violence, and financial struggles. That is why Bethany is offering families much needed support, such as meals, transportation, and babysitting, to keep them from having to place their children in foster care. Through its "Safe Families Ministry," volunteers help vulnerable families by temporarily taking in their children while the parents regain stability. Bethany is now offering information, training, and licensing online for those interested in foster care and adoption. Another emerging trend Bethany has been seeing is more single parents getting involved in adoption. Meanwhile, to raise awareness for foster care and adoption amid the pandemic, on October 20, Bethany will be hosting a virtual event called "Family Changes Everything," featuring Francis Chan, Christian rap artist Lecrae and others.

CBN News Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: Dr. Alveda King, niece of civil rights icon Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and director of Civil Rights for the Unborn, and Ginger Howard, Republican National Committeewoman of Georgia, come from different backgrounds and cultures. Yet the two share a passion for moral and social justice. The women met a few years ago and quickly formed a bond of sisterhood; often spending time at each other's homes and shopping together. They never thought about writing a book about reconciliation in America. That is until two years ago. In their new book, "We're Not Colorblind: Healing the Racial Divide, King and Howard highlight the importance of seeing people, no matter their race, in the images of God. Also included in the book are painful memories from the women's past, something Howard admitted that she struggled to write about, including growing up in a family with a separate bathroom for their black maid. King writes about how she once hated whites after her uncle and her father were killed during the Civil Rights Movement. As a devoted Christian, King said she had learned the lesson of forgiveness and, more importantly, going to its source. Seeing the recent unrest and protests over race play out across the country, King empathizes with young minorities who are angry and demand justice but disagrees with the organization of Black Lives Matter. As the country struggles in 2020, the authors see special timing in the release of their book, which was written two years ago, as a divine tool for the times. In the end, she points to the words of her late uncle as the way forward. Howard agreed and said she believes that God wants to use multi-ethnic relationships as shining examples of his love.
