Education, including school funding, school consolidation, history of civil rights, science, learning disabilities, art and culture, public education, misuse of funds, and school closings.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4:30pm, 04/13**

Teacher Pay Deadline – Legislative Committee passes a bill authorizing teach pay raises, but it's a futile gesture since there isn't money to fund the pay raises. The lawmakers say they're doing it to show their intent, and in case a funding source arises.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4pm, 05/03**

Facebook Arrest – A Sapulpa elementary teacher was arrested after an open Facebook account revealed illegal activity. Megan Sloan remains in the Creek County jail after being arrested on drug and embezzlement charges. According to police another teacher found Sloan's Facebook account open and saw a conversation where Sloan allegedly wrote to someone about using and selling heroin along with pawning school equipment. During the investigation Sloan admitted to having Xanax, selling school I-Pad tablets and taking field trip money to buy drugs. Evidence of heroin and meth were found in her purse when she was booked into jail.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4:30pm, 05/12**

Memorial Marathon Check – Two local elementary schools received trophies and \$500 checks for having the most participants in the Kid's Memorial Marathon.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4am, 06/09**

Break-In At OKC High School – Police are investigating a break-in at a metro high school. Police say someone broke into Douglass High School on Martin Luther King near NE 10<sup>th</sup>. The break-in happened around 2am and was discovered when someone set off the fire alarm. The school kitchen was flooded in addition to a ransacked office and broken glass.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4:30pm, 06/14**

OKCPS Pay Raises – The Oklahoma City Public School District has decided to set aside 2.6 million dollars to give all teachers, support staff and principals small raises. The most a teacher will see is a \$600 raise based on length of service and education.

### **NewsChannel 4 At 4pm, 06/22**

OKC Tax Increase Vote – Voters will go to the polls in September, deciding whether to raise their own taxes to improve streets and public safety. At stake is the extension of a temporary one-cent MAPS tax for infrastructure and a permanent quarter-cent tax to be dedicated to public safety. Teachers and education advocates showed up at the public hearing pushing for a portion of the tax to go to education. Their idea was rejected. Education advocates expressed surprise at the city's new proposal lacking education funding.

## **KFOR-TV 2nd Quarter 2017 – Crime and Drugs Issues**

Crime and drugs, including drugs, DUI, identity theft, auto theft, consumer fraud, gun control, sex crimes, murder, restraining orders, identity theft, crime prevention, white collar crime, methamphetamines, health care crimes.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 5am, 04/07**

High Speed Chase – Oklahoma Highway Patrol troopers were involved in a police chase that started outside of the city limits but ended in town. It happened around 2:30am. The pursuit ended near SW 54<sup>th</sup> and May. Authorities tell us this is where the driver lost control of a white Lexus. The vehicle ended up in a yard hitting a parked car. Three people were in the car. One man was taken into custody as he tried to take off running. Officers caught up with the second person thanks to a canine unit and a police chopper. A third person remains on the run.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 4pm, 04/19**

Logan County Deputy Accused Killer In Custody – Authorities say the man accused of shooting and killing a deputy with the Logan County Sheriff's Office is in custody. While serving that eviction notice, officials say the deputy was shot multiple times in the body and face by Nathan LeForce. Authorities say LeForce stole the deputy's patrol car and drove it to a nearby convenience store where he stole another vehicle from a customer. Shortly after 2 p.m., troopers with the Oklahoma Highway Patrol confirmed that they captured LeForce. At this point, it is unclear exactly what charges LeForce will face for the shooting and manhunt.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 5pm, 04/24**

Oklahoma Death Penalty – On Wednesday, Lorne Fultonberg talked to the state's attorney general who said he thinks Oklahoma should find a way to move forward with the death penalty, even though a committee recommended an extended moratorium on it. The death penalty has been put on hold in Oklahoma since the botched execution of an inmate on death row. A committee released a 300-page report on the problems they think Oklahoma has with it.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 5am, 05/12**

Fatal Shooting – An argument ends with a fatal gunshot on the city's Northwest side. It happened near 91<sup>st</sup> and Walker yesterday afternoon. It sounds like this was an argument that escalated very quickly. When police got to the scene they found a man dead inside a home in the area.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 10pm, 06/07**

HOA Treasurer Facing Embezzlement Charges – The former treasurer of the Summit Place Home Owners Association, Ralph Mann, is facing 8 felony counts of embezzlement. He is accused of writing \$160,000 of documented checks to himself and depositing them in his personal account. As of late Wednesday afternoon, Mann had not been booked into the Oklahoma County jail. An arrest warrant has been issued for with a \$100,000 bond.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 4pm, 04/05**

Driving License Exam Sites May Close – The Oklahoma Department of Public Safety is facing a budget crisis that may lead to the closing of most of the driver's license examination offices in the state. The budget cuts could lead DPS officials to close 25 of 36 driver's license examination offices in the state. State law requires the agency operate sites every 100 miles. Drivers will still be able to go to their local tag agents to renew or update existing Oklahoma licenses but new drivers should be prepared for a long trip and wait. A DPS spokesman said they are looking at other alternatives such as furloughs, force reductions or ending trooper academies.

Town Hall Meeting – On Wednesday Sheldra Brigham went to Chickasha where Representative Tom Cole held a Town Hall meeting for the people in the area. The people who attended could express their concerns to their lawmakers in hopes of making changes.

### **NewsChannel 4 at 4:30pm, 05/17**

Shelter Repurposed – The now closed DHS Children's Shelter has received approval to be refurbished as a center where needy families can get help with medical attention, parenting classes and even cooking assistance. The goal is to help with building better families and keeping their kids instead of losing them to the foster care system. Two wealthy local women are giving \$1 million dollars each to the project.

### **NewsChannel 4pm, 05/17**

Announcement of New Budget Plan – With less than a week before a critical deadline, it seems that some Oklahoma lawmakers have reached a budget agreement. For month, lawmakers have been negotiating to close a nearly \$900 million budget shortfall. .

### **NewsChannel 4 at 6am, 05/18**

Tornado Assistance – Clean up in Elk City is well underway after an EF2 tornado devastated the community. Aid is pouring in from all over the state. The Veteran's Affairs Department near NE 23<sup>rd</sup> and Lincoln is the center for organizing Oklahoma City based assistance.
