After a lot of struggling he got Lee out of the vehicle. Lee was transported to Lakes Regional Healthcare and "is doing well", the Dickinson County Sheriff's Office said in a statement. The dog was dried out and is also doing well. Salmon was treated for minor cuts from the broken glass. If he hadn't been there and jumped into action to help the man would have drowned in the icy water.

A study by iSeeCars.com found the average vehicle is priced 8.8 percent above the sticker price. The tax-filing deadline is about a month away and the IRS has reminded taxpayers they can file for an extension if they don't think they can complete their return in time. But the agency also points out that even if you postpone filing, you still have to pay what you think you owe by April 18. Paradise Grilling Systems is recalling about 18 thousand Paradise Grills first generation outdoor kitchens. Liquid propane gas can accumulate inside the closed lid and cabinets, causing an explosion when the user relights the grill, posing fire and burn hazards. That's happened at least twice.

A 2-year-old girl was found face-down in an above-ground swimming pool while a family member was reportedly watching several children for their mother. That family member jumped in the pool and pulled the toddler out. She immediately called 911 for help, telling the dispatcher no one on scene had any CPR training. While sending units to the scene, Telecommunicator Supervisor Thomas Eggers began giving CPR instructions over the phone. "Okay. Put the baby flat on her back on a hard surface. I want you to take one hand and place it on the center of her chest and to press to a depth of one inch. Okay? We're going to do 30 compressions," Eggers can be heard saying. The first unit on scene, Deputy Kaelin Darcy, took over CPR, then picked up the child and ran her to a Fire Rescue crew that arrived moments later. Soon, the child was responsive and crying. She was transported to a hospital in serious condition for further treatment but she is expected to make a full recovery. Her life may have been saved by the dispatcher giving CPR instructions over the phone.

Kennedy will be an assistant football coach for Bremerton High School for the 2023 season. At 98, North Carolina preacher Roy Jernigan is still excited about sharing the Gospel. Even after serving as a missionary on Indian reservations across the country for 52 years, Jernigan won't stop preaching because his life is his ministry, and he wants people to see Jesus when they see him. After resigning from full-time duties as a pastor in Texas just over a year ago to live with his daughter Linda Williams in La Grange, Jernigan has continued preaching to hundreds of people weekly through his Facebook ministry, Preacher Roy Ministries. And he remains energized to keep himself
