She has done this by prosecuting crimes against children, ensuring the integrity of our legal system, and leading teams of prosecutors to hold dangerous criminals accountable.

In early 2022, occupational exposure as a firefighter was classified as carcinogenic by the International Agency for Research on Cancer. A new \$4 million grant from the Arizona Board of Regents will offer the statewide firefighting community new hope in the battle against cancer. Through a recently approved Regents' Research Grant, the University of Arizona will lead a study, in partnership with the Arizona Fire Chiefs Association and Arizona State University, to target enrolling 1,500 Arizona firefighters to test the effectiveness of whether blood or plasma donations lower cancer-causing "forever chemicals" known as PFAS levels. Sami Garcia is an Arizona-based author who has written a thriller about bomb ordinance team. Summary of book: When survival is determined by a ticking fuse, a rogue team of experts brings the fire. Officer Harris and her bomb squad pyros defend the public from dangerous murders when they are, in fact, facing a perilous stalker themselves. Harris and McKenzie, her professional and romantic partner, are in search of who they are as a couple and who their local serial bomber is in this first book of the highly anticipated Light Em' Up series. Garcia has a degree in Criminal Justice and worked in corrections. The screenplay based on the book has won 7 awards, 2 for best

screenplay, 1 for best screenplay feature and the rest were bronze awards for best tv pilot screenplay. Sandy will discuss environmental issues at the legislature for the new year.

According to a new report by the Helios Education Foundation (a foundation that provides scholarships and support for post-secondary education opportunities for underserved communities), students in Arizona are losing time in school due to COVID.

A group of House Republicans is pushing to eliminate most federal taxes and replace them with a federal sales tax in a plan that would also abolish the IRS. But tax experts warn the act is not so fair to working families while giving the wealthiest Americans a break. The Fair Tax Act was introduced by Representative Earl "Buddy" Carter. It would abolish income, payroll, estate and gift taxes and propose a 23 percent national sales tax, but the effective rate would be 30 percent.
