Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WLOC-AM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern in our local community. The issues that greatly affected the community during the previous calendar quarter were:

- Community Support for Low Income Families: Abundance of the Hart is a monthly commodity food program dedicated to assisting low income and needy families across the community.
- Covid-19 Awareness and Prevention: Hart County Judge Executive, Joe Choate discussed the spike of Covid-19 cases in Hart County and informed the community of data changes daily. Mr. Choate also discussed information from the CDC regarding when the Covid-19 vaccination will be available locally and which residents will be eligible to get the vaccine first.
- Covid-19 Effects on Education: Superintendents of both local school systems addressed the educational changes due to Covid as schools transitioned from hybrid learning to in-home virtual instruction.
- Covid-19 Legal Helpline: Kentucky's Access to Justice Commission and the four Kentucky civil legal aid programs formed a free Covid-19 Legal Helpline. The free helpline can assist all Kentucky residents who have experienced a civil legal problem as the result of the Coronavirus pandemic.
- Covid-19 Testing: Local doctor's office discussed free Covid-19 testing at their facility.
- Economic Hardship – Kentucky Governor, Andy Beshear designated \$15 million dollars in federal relief funds to help Kentucky residents at risk of losing essential utility services caused by the economic hardship due of the Covid-19 pandemic.

- Elderly Support - The Annual WLOC Nursing Home fund collected \$2,100 for our two area nursing homes. All proceeds were given to the nursing homes to buy needful supplies for the residents. Members of the community joined in with our staff to present the funds and sing Christmas Carols to the residents and staff.
- Grief Support: Local hospital offers virtual sessions for the bereavement support group as an opportunity for community members to learn to cope with feelings of grief, loss and sadness.
- Mental Health/Trauma Support – Isaiah 43 Christian Counseling services offers virtual and in-person treatment services for community members who are suffering from trauma.
- Poverty Assistance – WLOC Clothes for Kids raised \$8,640 this quarter for needy children in the Hart County and Caverna School Districts. The funds are given to the Family Resource Youth Services Centers at both local schools to assist with the Angel Tree Christmas Program for needy children. The Angel Tree program makes it possible for all children to have clothing and Christmas gifts their family cannot afford.
