We were joined by State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris, who discussed Alabama's surging coronavirus numbers and new public health directives. We were also joined by Lt. Gov. Will Ainsworth, who told us there was no rift between him and Gov. Kay Ivey over his outspokenness on the state's virus preparations. Senate President Pro Tem Del Marsh was with us to talk about the economic fallout from the virus and the legislature's plans moving forward. And Alabama Finance Director Kelly Butler joined us to discuss how the virus is affecting state budget planning.

We were joined by State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris, who discussed the continued rapid rise of coronavirus cases and deaths in Alabama and when the peak might come. We were also joined by Mark Jackson, the Executive Director of the Medical Association of the State of Alabama, who talked about how doctors are holding up under all of the pressure. And Senate Minority Leader Bobby Singleton of Greensboro was with us to discuss how the pandemic has renewed a Democratic call for Medicaid expansion in the state.

We reported on new recommendations that would allow some Alabama small businesses to begin reopening immediately. We were joined by Sen. Arthur Orr of Decatur, who said he was a big proponent of restarting the economy sooner rather than later. We were also joined by State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris, who said any easing of coronavirus restrictions should be done with extreme caution. And Rep. Mike Ball of Madison was with us to discuss his ethics reform bill and how he believes it addressed some of the concerns raised in a recent state Supreme Court ruling on the ethics case of former House Speaker Mike Hubbard.

We reported on Gov. Kay Ivey keeping her stay-at-home order in effect through the following week. We were joined by State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris, who said any reopening of businesses should be done in phases. He also talked about the need for more virus testing in the state. We were also joined by U.S Senator Doug Jones of Birmingham, who discussed a new virus relief package approved by congress, including more money for testing. And House Majority Leader Nathaniel Ledbetter of Rainsville was with us to talk about delaying the resumption of the legislative session for one more week, because of the virus.

We reported on Gov. Kay Ivey easing some of the virus restrictions on state businesses. We were joined by State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris, who talked about the need for a phased-in approach to reopening the economy.
