

NBC Meet the Press: NBC News correspondents interview world and national leaders about issues of topical importance. Regular programs include 60 minutes Sundays at 8:00am and 12:05am.

Dateline NBC: NBC News correspondents cover topical news, in-depth investigations and newsmaker profiles. Schedule varies.

On the Money: *On the Money* is a half-hour series that brings you the latest in market and economic news that impacts your money. The show is produced by CNBC and distributed in national syndication by NBC Universal Domestic Television Distribution. Regular programs include Sundays from 9:30-10:00am.

January 3, 2019

College Credit (education) – Students at North and Memorial High Schools in Eau Claire can start signing up for a new program through CVTC beginning in September to earn college credit and even an associate degree for free while attending high school.

Minimum Wage (business) – In 2019, 20 states saw an increase in minimum wage – including Minnesota. However, the executive director with the La Crosse Area Chamber of Commerce says Wisconsinites are not heading over the border for the pay raise. With unemployment in Wisconsin around two percent, employers are paying employees higher than minimum wage to attract and retain workers.

Pig Farm Charges (agriculture) – A Durand man is charged with 10 counts of mistreatment of animals. According to the Buffalo County Sheriff's Office, Jeffery Owen was not taking care of pigs on the farm he runs. A deputy found nearly 20 dead pigs and at least 10 more hurt or sick.

Bank Robbery (violence) – The Jackson County Sheriff's Office is investigating a bank robbery in Alma Center. Deputies say a female suspect handed a teller a note demanding money. This could be related to a bank robbery in Black River Falls on November 26.

January 9, 2019

New Casey's Proposal (business): Casey's General Store is looking to build a new store in Eau Claire on the city's west side. The plan commission is scheduled to discuss the topic on Monday. It would go in place of a bar that's closed and an auto body shop.

Hmong Education (education): The La Crosse School Board approved a resolution supporting a bill in the state legislature that would require schools to teach Hmong history and culture.

Craft Beer Industry (economy): The craft beer industry is feeling the pinch from the partial government shutdown. Some companies in the industry need federal approval on labels, and it's a waiting game until the government opens back up.

January 23, 2019

Murder Trial Set (violence): The New Richmond man charged with homicide in the death of his 20-year-old son is scheduled to go to trial in June. According to court documents, Kayle Fleischauer is accused of shooting his son. The daughter called 911, told law enforcement she heard them fighting, and they all had been drinking.

Apartment Zoning (economy): The Eau Claire City Council approved rezoning for a proposed apartment complex, which is expected to include affordable housing units.

Make-A-Wish granted (children): Students at Chippewa Falls High School hosted "Wish Week" to raise money to grant a wish through the Make-A-Wish Foundation. A Chippewa Falls student is the recipient of the funds. She and her family leave in 10 days on a Caribbean cruise.

February 5, 2019

Bar Becomes School (Education) – The La Crosse School District is purchasing The Brickhouse bar in downtown with plans of moving the district's two charter schools into the building.

State Theatre Update (children) – The historic theatre in Eau Claire will be the site for the Luginbill Children's Foundation. It plans to feature educational and entertainment programming for area youth.

Patterson Court (violence) – The man accused of kidnapping Barron teen Jayme Closs and murdering her parents in October is scheduled to appear in court Wednesday for a preliminary hearing.

February 14, 2019

Youth Runaways (children/youth) – Each year, nearly 20,000 WI families are confronted with a teen runaway situation, according to Lutheran Social Services. A local mother shares her first-hand experience with her daughter running away from home.

Clearing Mailboxes (health/medical): The Eau Claire Post Office reports several severe injuries for letter carriers after falling on snow or ice covered. Community members are asked to clear a path to their mailbox and around the mailbox.

February 21, 2019

Heart Attack Risk (health) – Heart attacks are on the rise among women ages 35 to 54, according to a new study. Researchers look at data involving 28,000 hospitalizations for heart attacks. The largest growth was seen in young women.

Kidney Donor & Recipient (medical) – Nearly a year after a man wore a shirt to a Brewers game asking for someone to donate a kidney to him, he met the woman – hundreds of miles away – who donated her organ.

Flooding Risk (agriculture/environment) – The latest flooding outlook from the National Weather Service says there's a concern for major flooding potential come spring after a record-breaking month of snow in February.

Pancreatic Cancer (health) – After an episode of Jeopardy!, host Alex Trebek announced he was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, a local health professional talks more about what the diagnosis means. According to the American Cancer Society, the five-year survival rate with pancreatic cancer is three percent. However, Trebek vows to fight the cancer and hopes to beat the odds.

Immunization rates (health) – According to the WI Department of Health Services, western Wisconsin has the lowest vaccination rates in the state for children younger than two. Vernon County was lowest in the state in 2017 at 44 percent.

Meal Packing (education) – Students and staff at UW-Stout in Menomonie spent part of the day packing more than 25,000 meals. Most of the meals will be donated to local food pantries in Dunn County. Child Sex Assault (violence) – A Fall Creek man convicted in 2015 of false imprisonment and child enticement is charged in a new case. He's accused of sexually assaulting a 15-year-old girl.
