The students collected blankets, sheets and money. They also made tie blankets. All the items are being donated to the nonprofit, which provides beds to children in need.

SCHOOL REFEREREDUMS (Education) – 10 schools in western Wisconsin had referendums on the ballot for the Spring Election. Many of those referendums include basic operating costs. A member of the Wisconsin Association of School Boards says state aid is not keeping up with demand, especially rising inflation and more schools are asking voters to exceed the tax levy. He says unless more money is given to schools, the referendums are likely to continue.

DEATH INVESTIGATION (Violence) – The Jackson County Sheriff identifies the victim of a March homicide as Richard Bork. His remains were found in early March on a property near Black River Falls. Bork's wife, Star Myers, is charged with homicide in his death.

April 2

This Sunday, Trump indicted. The GOP -- including many of Trump's potential primary rivals -- rallies to his defense before knowing the specifics of the actual criminal charges he faces.

April 9

This Sunday, the abortion legal wars. A Texas federal judge suspends FDA approval for the abortion pill mifepristone. Another in Washington State directly contradicts him, setting up a likely Supreme Court standoff on the abortion pill.

April 16

Debates over guns and abortion have roiled this nation for decades. This week, those debates feel a bit more intense than they have in a while and there are some deepening tensions between activists who wield power inside Republican primary circles and the overall electorate. Today marks the 16th anniversary of the Virginia Tech shooting. At the time, it was the deadliest mass shooting in U.S. history. Thirty-two people were killed. Now, sadly it's been surpassed by mass shootings in Las Vegas and Orlando. After five people were killed this week in a mass shooting in Louisville, Kentucky, six more killed two weeks ago at a school in Nashville, 2024 Republican hopefuls gathered at the NRA convention on Friday and rejected the idea that gun restrictions could somehow limit violence -- gun violence. And the NRA continued to demand unlimited political allegiance from the GOP.

April 23

This Sunday, the Biden-Trump rematch. As President Biden prepares to announce his reelection bid this week, our new NBC News poll finds voters don't want him to run again, including half of Democrats.

In a nation full of guns and growing distrust, what will it take to make knocking on a stranger's door feel safe again? And, ethics scandal. After reports revealing Justice Clarence Thomas failed to disclose real estate transactions from a wealthy Republican donor, Senate Democrats call on the chief justice to testify.

April 30

At least eight people are dead, including children, after a gunman opened fire at a suburban outlet mall in Allen, Texas, not far from Dallas, before the gunman was shot and killed by a police officer who happened to be there. This is the second-deadliest mass shooting this calendar year. When we came on the air last week, by the way, we were following the manhunt for another Texas gunman, who had fatally shot five people after he was asked by a neighbor to simply stop firing his gun in his yard. This week, six people were killed in Henryetta, Oklahoma. In Atlanta, a gunman opened fire in a waiting room at a medical office building, killing one and injuring four others. And yet despite the uptick in mass shootings this year, there's been no change in the political response to this growing gun violence crisis

May 14

What we saw this week is a Republican Party that is paralyzed by Donald Trump. Elected Republicans and Trump's 2024 rivals are eager to move on, but not sure how to take on Trump and they're terrified of alienating his supporters. It makes them desperate to follow the voters rather than trying to lead them and the paralysis is – in the party has been key to Donald Trump's strength.

May 21

This is going to be one of the busiest weeks yet in the presidential campaign, as the 2024 Republican field grows, so do concerns among some Republicans that none of Donald Trump's current rivals are going to be able to beat him in a primary.

May 28

And while official Washington is still consumed by the debt ceiling talks, we're going to take a step back this Sunday and look at a larger issue: The Supreme Court. It's never been more powerful in our lives or more broken when it comes to public trust.

June 4

Both Democrats and Republicans declared victory after voting for the same exact bill. Of course, not every Democrat or Republican is happy about that bill and that's kind of the point. Both sides had to make concessions. It's called compromise. It's what politics is supposed to be, the art of the possible. President Biden, who is constantly underestimated politically, did what he promised he would do when he came into office.

June 18

As one former prosecutor put it pretty bluntly this week, two years from now Donald Trump could be in prison or he could be president. With Trump holding a commanding lead over the Republican field, this week his opponents faced the question that will dominate this race over

the next six months: will they, can they and should they go after the former president over his federal indictment and Trump's legal issues to come.

June 25

It's been a head-spinning 24 hours as Vladimir Putin has seen the most significant threat to his power since he took leadership nearly a quarter century ago.
