October 8

This Sunday, war in Israel. Prime Minister Netanyahu declares Israel is at war after Hamas militants launched a surprise attack from Gaza. Hundreds have been killed and thousands wounded. Israeli soldiers and civilians have been taken as hostages.

October 15

This Sunday, striking back. Israel gears up for a major military operation, ordering more than a million in Gaza to evacuate and vows to destroy Hamas as the war intensifies.

October 22

The U.S. is stepping up its military readiness across the Mideast, citing "escalations by Iran and its proxy forces," as the U.S. and Israel prepare for a widening war.

October 29

The nation is reeling after a week which saw the 10th deadliest mass shooting in modern American history with 18 people between 14 and 76 years old gunned down at a bowling alley and bar in Lewiston, Maine. Also, the war between Israel and Hamas which has entered its next stage.

November 5

The war in Ukraine is raging: the largest armed conflict in Europe since World War II. Russia now controls about 18% of Ukraine. NBC News now reporting that U.S. and European officials have begun quietly talking to the Ukrainian government about what possible peace negotiations with Russia might entail to end the war. President Biden has proposed \$105 billion dollars in emergency support for Ukraine, Israel, and other national security threats.

November 12

Israeli strikes are pounding Gaza City, as ground forces close in on Gaza's largest medical complex, Al-Shifa hospital, which Israel says sits on top of Hamas' main command center, claims Hamas and Al-Shifa staff deny.

November 19

It took weeks of excruciating secret negotiations involving U.S., Israeli, Qatari and Egyptian officials, and personal pressure from President Joe Biden to persuade a reluctant Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu to accept a four-day cease-fire that has so far freed 26 Israeli hostages from Hamas.

December 3

Pregnancy risks. Allyson Felix, the most decorated U.S. track and field athlete of all time, speaks out about the Black maternal health crisis. Three of the fittest, healthiest women in the world are facing these complications. I think it shows how dangerous it is to give birth today in America as a Black woman.

Top U.S. officials are toughening their tone, urging Israel to do more to spare civilians after the collapse of a fragile truce between Israel and Hamas.

December 10

The abortion fight. The Texas Supreme Court temporarily blocks a pregnant woman from an emergency abortion. Will the state force her to continue her pregnancy? And, new charges. President Biden's son Hunter is indicted for the second time this year. Nine new criminal counts including tax evasion and filing false returns. What will be the political impact?

December 10

In many ways this week has felt like an inflection point with Israel's war against Hamas intensifying and claiming more lives and tensions boiling over here at home about how to address hate speech.

December 17

In just hours there will be more urgent talks on Capitol Hill between Republicans, Democrats and White House negotiators as all sides aim to reach a deal to ramp up security at the border, a part of a larger package that would also provide more aid to Ukraine and Israel.

December 24

This morning, Meet the Press unveils a special series called Meet the Moment. From authors to activists, to community leaders, poets and scientists, the voices outside of our politics shaping conversations that matter.

December 31

The U.S. surgeon general calls it the defining public health crisis of our time: Mental health. One in five adults experience mental illness every year. Depression rates are at an all-time high. A third of adults report being diagnosed with depression sometime during their lifetimes — a figure that is rising. Nearly 50,000 Americans died by suicide last year, more than any year on record. The president says we are falling short.
