NURSES RELIEVED (HEALTH/MEDICAL) – Two nurses at HSHS Sacred Heart Hospital in Eau Claire talk about the last year and a half. They say they're finally starting to see relief as more people get vaccinated. While COVID-19 causes a heavy chest (difficulty breathing). The nurses say it caused them heavy hearts having to deal with so much. While they hope to never see another pandemic, they say it's their job as healthcare workers to help people, and they would do it over and over.

EAU CLAIRE PFAS (ENVIRONMENT) – Four water wells near the Chippewa Valley Regional airport have been shut off due to detectable traces of PFAS. Test results in June 2020 and April 2021 found levels of PFAS above newly recommended guidelines put forth by the DNR. City officials say community members don't need to stop drinking the water. 12 wells are still in use with either no trace of PFAS or levels below safety recommendations.

Triple Homicide (violence) – Three bodies are found at the entrance to a quarry between Holmen and West Salem. Two quarry workers found the bodies around 5 a.m. Friday. Hakes Wellness (business) – A new clinic opened in Chippewa Falls to provide health and wellness specifically to law enforcement officers. The facility offers mental and emotional support to first responders.

Youth Vaccinations (youth/health) – The Eau Claire City-County Health Department is focusing efforts on vaccinating more young people. The health department says while young people typically don't get seriously ill, if they're not vaccinated, they can spread the Delta variant more easily to others who might get severely sick. People younger than 35 years old are falling behind in vaccination rates compared to older populations.

Burglary Suspect Sentencing (violence) – One of the three suspects in a burglary at an Eau Claire golf course changes his plea to guilty and is sentenced to four years of probation. Nicholas Mason is one of three people charged in the June 23rd incident. The owners of the golf course chased the would-be ATM burglars down, and even jumped in their truck.

8/12/21

ECASD mask requirement (education) – The Eau Claire Area School District is changing course, say students in PK through 8th grade will be required to wear masks when the new school year starts. The district superintendent sites a rise in COVID cases for the new policy. The district plans to make a decision about 9th through 12th grades on August 25.

Fiber Optic Internet Provider (business) – Metronet, a fiber optic internet provider is breaking into Wisconsin through the Coulee Region. The company is investing \$12 million for construction of the project. While La Crosse is the entry point for Metronet in the state, the company plans to expand to other cities.

Bus Driver Shortage (children) – First Student is looking for more bus drivers for the upcoming school year. The company would like to hire 10 to 15 more drivers. The company serves the Altoona and Eau Claire Area School Districts. It says it will be ready for the start of the school year on September 1st but would ideally like to have more drivers in place soon.

8/13/21

Vaccine Mandates (health) – With more vaccine mandates popping up, we spoke with a UW-Eau Claire law professor who says – for the most part – employers, businesses, and even some levels of government have the ability to issue their own vaccine mandates. Dr. Eric Kasper says it's possible to be fired for refusing the shot, if a worker does not meet certain exemptions such as religious beliefs or medical conditions.

Farmland Damage (agriculture) – An ATV driver is believed to be responsible for damaging farmland in Barron County. The damage happened in a field just west of Barron. The sheriff's department says it's seeing a rise ATV complaints with drivers being reckless and going off trails.

8/16/21

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING (education) – A large number of parents turned out to the Eau Claire Area School District's board meeting to protest the mask mandate for students/staff in Pre-K through 8th grades. Some parents want masks to be optional, while others applaud the district's decision. 18 people participate in the public comment portion of the board meeting.

BACK TO SCHOOL EVENT (children) "We Care Eau Claire" hosted a Backpack giveaway at Phoenix Park for families in the Eau Claire Area School District. We Care Eau Claire is made up of a group of people from churches in the Chippewa Valley. The backpacks were divided by grade and included all the supplies needed for the start of school.

STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS (education) – Western Technical College is using \$700,000 in federal funds to help alleviate student debt. Outstanding balances have been eliminated for students from spring 2020 to spring 2021 in hopes of helping the students be able to continue their education.

8/27/21

College and COVID (education/health) – The Eau Claire City-County Health Department and La Crosse County Health Departments are concerned about a possible significant increase in COVID cases as college students return to campus. One year ago, Eau Claire County was averaging nine new cases a day. This year, the county is averaging 30 a day. Colleges in both counties are requiring masks indoors, regardless of vaccination status. The health departments encourage college students to get vaccinated.

Lake Altoona Sedimentation (environment/agriculture) – Community members living on or near Lake Altoona say they're fed up with a decades-old problem of sedimentation build up, and they want something done about it. Neighbors say the sediment build up keeps them from boating on the lake or even swimming in the water. While this is not a new issue, the DNR says it's still looking for solutions. People in the area hope to find a solution to get them back on the water.

Homicide Plea (violence) – The man charged in the shooting death of an Eau Claire teenager enters a not guilty plea. Austin Vang says he and 14-year-old Marwan Washington were playing around with the gun. He forgot it was loaded when he shot Washington in the neck. Vang is still in jail on a \$50,000 cash bond.

9/2/21

Xcel Rate Hike (business) – Xcel Energy customers may see a rate increase next year. Xcel is asking the state to allow it to raise rates to fund projects to lower its carbon emissions. Rates could up by about \$5 next year and \$4 the following year.

Labor Day & COVID (health) – Health officials worry about another increase in COVID cases following Labor Day weekend. Eau Claire County is averaging 40 new cases each day. One year ago, the county averaged 12. People are encouraged to stay home. If you are traveling, it's best to stay with people you live with and wear a mask indoors regardless of vaccination status.

9/13/21

DEATH INVESTIGATION (violence) – The Dunn County Sheriff's Office is investigating a quadruple homicide. The sheriff's office says four people were found dead inside and SUV with a Minnesota license plate. That SUV was found in a cornfield. Anyone with information about that black SUV or another dark SUV that may have been traveling with it should contact authorities.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF MENOMONIE COVID PROTOCOLS (children) – After more than 1,000 students in the School District of Menomonie have had to quarantine since September 1st, the school board met to adjust COVID protocols. The board lowered the quarantine time to seven days for students with a negative test. Families can decide whether to quarantine if their children are deemed as close contacts of a positive case. If someone in their household tests positive, students must quarantine.

9/17/21

SUICIDE PREVENTION (health) – September is suicide prevention and awareness month. In the Coulee Region, people can call 211 for community resources and a 24-hour crisis line.

RIVER RESCUE REUNION (children) – A two-year-old boy is reunited with the first responders who helped save his life. Last month, the little boy fell in the Chippewa River while

on a walk with this family. Police officers first on the scene started CPR until other first responders arrived. The boy was in a medically induced coma, but is now out of the hospital and doing well.

HOMICIDE SUSPECTS (violence) – Both suspects in connection to a quadruple homicide investigation in Dunn County are now in custody. Darren Osborne was taken into custody earlier this week. He is charged with four counts of hiding a corpse. Antoine Suggs turned himself in at a police department in Arizona today. The men are suspects in connection with the deaths of four people from the Twin Cities area. The bodies were found in a field in northern Dunn County on September 12.

9/23/21

KIDNEY DONOR (health/medical) – An Eau Claire woman is still waiting for a kidney donor. We first did a story with her in August when billboards were going up around the area in hopes of finding a donor. A donor did end up matching with her but backed out. She's trying to stay positive while hoping her four-year wait for a match will send soon.

BYSTANDER INTERVENTION (cultural development) – The Eau Claire Library is hosting a bystander intervention training to help people get comfortable with intervening when they witness someone being harassed. The training is the last program in a series on structural racism. The training was specifically requested by members of the Asian American Pacific Islander community. The class will teach people different strategies for combatting discrimination.

9/30/21

Attempted Kidnappings Plea (violence) – A Chippewa Falls man charged with three counts of attempted kidnapping pleads not guilty due to mental health issues. A judge ordered a doctor's evaluation in the next six weeks. Cory Gudmanson is due back in court December 10th.

Museum groundbreaking (children) – Ground is broken on a new building for the Children's Museum of Eau Claire. The hope is for the new building to open in November 2022. The museum is still hoping to raise about \$7 million for the project.

Oktoberfest (economy) – After missing last year due to the pandemic, Oktoberfest is back in La Crosse for its 60th anniversary. Organizers say the economic impact of the event is about \$15 million dollars for the Coulee Region.
