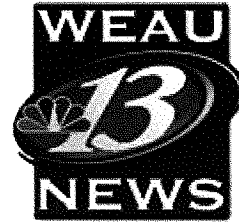

**Children/Youth**

**APRIL 1**

School Board/Sports Facilities (education): The Eau Claire Area School Board voted to accept an anonymous \$1.2 million donation for new sports facilities at Memorial High School with contingencies. However, the donor notified the school board during the meeting the offer was withdrawn.

Visitor Center (education): The plan for a new Visitor and Admission Center at UW-Eau Claire is moving another step forward. The Eau Claire Plan Commission approved rezoning and the site plan. The proposal now goes to the Eau Claire City Council for approval. The hope is to start construction on the building this year with completion by 2020.

Bloomer Layoffs (economy): The layoff at Iron Mountain Trap Rock Company's Chippewa Sand Facility in Bloomer is being extended. The layoff began in October, and it was supposed to last less than six months. However, the layoff is being extended indefinitely.

Homicide Charges (substance abuse): Homicide charges are now filed in Jackson County after a December crash that left one person dead. According to the criminal complaint, Donald Ames was driving when he failed to navigate a corner. The passenger in the truck died. Ames is charged with multiple counts, including homicide by intoxicated use of a vehicle.

Sex Offender Home (violence): Discussion continues about a place for registered sex offenders to live after release from prison. One proposal included using county land in Fairchild, but community members are opposed to that option.

**APRIL 21**

Mental Health in the Chippewa Valley (Health) – A community assessment found mental health to be the top health issue in our area. We take a closer look at the resources available locally to help people with mental health concerns, and community members talk about what still needs to be done to improve access to mental health resources.

Free Bus Rides (environment) – For Earth Day, Eau Claire Transit is teaming up with the Chippewa Valley Transit Alliance to offer free bus rides as a way to get more people to use public transportation as opposed to their own vehicles to help promote cleaner air.

Easter Breakfast (family values) – A church in Menomonie hosted its annual Easter Breakfast Sunday morning before church. The church puts the breakfast in the budget each year so the tradition of bringing families together can continue.

## **MAY 1**

Child Abuse Detection (children) – A Wisconsin child abuse case is leading to a proposed bill in Washington aimed at helping more people detect child abuse earlier. The bill would put \$10 million into a demonstration training program.

Measles Outbreak (health) – The nationwide measles outbreak hasn't hit Wisconsin yet, but experts say that could change, especially in areas with low vaccination rates.

Alzheimer's Grant (health) – The Wisconsin Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at UW-Madison is set to get a \$3 million dollar grant for research. Azura Memory Care in Eau Claire says more funds can help find new treatment options and eventually a cure.

Excellence in Education (education) – Around 100 students and educators were honored at the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Excellence in Education banquet. Students are honored for leadership, overcoming adversity, and academic achievement.

## **MAY 9**

Blue Ribbon Award (education) – Flynn Elementary in Eau Claire raised a flag in honor of the school receiving the National Blue Ribbon Award last year. The school is one of only three in the Eau Claire Area School District to earn the award since it began in 1982.

Bowl for Kids' Sake (children) – The annual bowling fundraiser is taking place in Eau Claire. It's the largest fundraiser of the year for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northwestern WI.

Workforce Solutions (business) – A community conversation took place to talk about how area businesses can have a more inclusive workforce. The discussion talked about the importance of hiring people with disabilities in the community who are capable of working.

Flooding Costs (environment) – From mid-March to early May – the utilities department in the City of La Crosse spent \$100,000 on flood mitigation. Workers put in more than 740 man hours, 264 of those hours were overtime.

## **MAY 19**

Triathlon Training (children)– The Eau Claire Kids Triathlon is coming up June 1, and a practice session was held today for kids to let them know what to expect. The event is open to kids ages seven to 14.

Tribute to Troop 3055 (business) – A local business – Bravo Salon and Spa – organized a community cleanup day as a way to pay tribute to the four people killed during a Girl Scout Troop highway cleanup project in November.

## **JUNE 3**

School Boundaries (education): The Eau Claire Area School Board delayed a vote on elementary school boundaries. Instead, the board sent the plan back to the Demographic Trends and Facility Planning Committee to develop guidelines for transitioning student and families impacted by the decision. The recommendation and the transition plan will go back to the school board for a vote on July 22.

Feed the Kids Program (children): The Salvation Army in La Crosse is kicking off its annual Feed the Kids program. It provides lunch to children during the summer. The program serves around 300 lunches a day.

Baby Death (violence): A Wood County couple is charged in the death of a newborn. An autopsy revealed the baby died from blunt force trauma and strangulation. The mother is charged with homicide and neglect. The father is charged with neglect and obstructing an officer.

## **JUNE 13**

Wood County Shooting (Violence) – Wood County Sheriff Shawn Becker released new information about this week's officer-involved shooting. He says deputies struggled with a man with a knife. One deputy fired his weapon – hitting and killing the man, hurting a civilian, and hurting another deputy.

Water Quality Task Force (environment) – Wisconsin's Water Quality Task Force held a public hearing in La Crosse to gather input from concerned citizens related to clean water. The task force will later make recommendations for potential changes in the state when it comes to water quality.

Veterans' Mental Health (health) – Lawmakers are pushing a new bill called The Service Act. Right now, veterans can only get help for combat-related mental health issues at the VA for years after they get discharged. This proposed bill would eliminate the time limit.

Meth Treatment (addiction) – A closer look at why meth addictions can be hard to treat, the types of treatments available for meth addicts.
