Week of Jan. 2-6

WOLF POPULATION (environment) – The Wisconsin DNR is extending the deadline to comment on the new wolf management plan. Community members have until Feb. 28 to comment. The plan doesn't call for a specific population goal, but rather deciding whether to reduce the population, keep them stable or let me grow.

HELMBRECHT HEARING (violence) – A hearing is set for February in a 2016 Eau Claire County homicide case. Shane Helmbrecht was charged with first degree intentional homicide in the shooting death of his neighbor, Jenny Ward. Helmbrecht was found incompetent to stand trial and ordered to a mental health facility. The victim's sister says Helmbrecht is no longer in the facility. She says this new hearing is to determine if he goes back to the facility or if a new competency hearing will take place.

MEALS ON WHEELS VOLUNTEERS (health) – Meals on Wheels makes sure seniors who cannot cook or who are homebound have access to nutritious meals. However, the service needs more drivers to be able to adequately serve community members in need.

SOBER SECTION (health) – The Green Bay Packers have a "Section Yellow" available for fans who don't want to drink during the football game. It allows people to be around others who make the choice to be sober.

ADULT VACCINATIONS (medical) – With the start of a new year, medical professionals say it's a good time for adults to make sure they're up-to-date on vaccinations. This includes for the flu, shingles and tetanus.

Week of 1/9-13

OVERDOSE DEATHS (addiction) – The La Crosse County Medical Examiner says her office is seeing what she describes as an "alarming" number of overdoses to start the new year. She says the office is investigating five potential overdose cases since January 1. She isn't sure on the exact mixture of the drugs, but says fentanyl is believed to be involved.

SEASONAL AFFECTIVE DISORDER (health) – Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) is a form of depression impacting people during winter months. Signs of SAD can be a lack of energy and difficulty sleeping. A behavior care therapist recommends getting moving and getting outside even for a few minutes when you can.

SAFE HARBOR BILL (children) – State Senator Jesse James is circulating legislation to make sure victims of child sex trafficking are not prosecuted for prostitution. James says the children are the victims in these crimes and should be treated as such. He believes passing this legislation will also help in the prosecution of perpetrators of sex trafficking.

CADOTT SCHOOL REFERENDUM (education) – The Cadott School Board voted to put a referendum question on the April ballot. It will ask voters to approve \$9.965 million for capital improvements and technological improvements.

SHOOTING SUSPECT ENTERS PLEA (violence) – The second suspect in a fatal shooting in Eau Claire pleads not guilty. Michael Purnell pleaded not guilty to all charges, including first degree intentional homicide, in the death of an Altoona man. Another man, Xavier Thompson, is also charged in this case and previously pleaded not guilty. A third suspect isn't in custody yet.

Week of 1/30-2/3

Sex Offender Ordinance (violence) – An Alderman in Chippewa Falls wants the city to update its sex offender ordinance. The city has an ordinance saying sex offenders can't go near certain community spaces. Heather Martell wants the ordinance to go beyond city-owned property spaces like licensed daycares.

Menomonie Substance Abuse Initiative (substance abuse)— Menomonie is starting a new program to help combat drug addiction. Project Hope includes a quick response team made up of a law enforcement officer, social worker and a paramedic. The goal is to get people help for their addiction instead of putting them in jail.

Dunn Co. Officer Involved Shooting Folo (violence) – The Wisconsin Department of Justice released the name of the man shot and killed during an officer-involved shooting. Nicholas Ciccarelli is the man shot and killed by officers. According to the DOJ, Ciccarelli broke into someone's home, fired a gun, and then stole that person's vehicle. After being stopped by law enforcement, he got out of the car and moved his gun toward one of the officers. That's when shots were fired at him. He died at the scene.

Eating Disorders Awareness (health) – Eating Disorders Awareness Week is later in February. One doctor says there's a pre-conceived notion something with an eating disorder must be thin, but that's not the case. Eating disorders including binging, purging, excessive exercise and repetitive weighing.

Wear Red Day (health) – The first Friday in February is National Wear Red Day to raise awareness about cardiovascular disease and stroke in women. Cardiovascular disease is the number one killer among women.

Hospital Solar Panels (environment) – The new Gundersen Tri-County Hospital in Whitehall is expected to open its doors in August. The hospital got a \$1 million federal grant, which will be used to help pay for solar panels on the hospital.

2/13-2/17

Home and Garden Show (business) – The 44th Home and Garden is happening this weekend at the Chippewa Valley Expo Center. More than 115 vendors are on hand to help with your home improvement projects. The event also includes educational seminars on building a home, home design and landscaping.

3M Layoffs (business) – An associate with 3M says approximately 53 of roughly 675 employees at the Menomonie plant were laid off this week. The company says the layoffs are due to slower than expected growth and sales.

Congressional Art Competition (children) – Congressman Tom Tiffany's district office is accepting submissions for the 2023 Congressional Art Competition. All high school students in the 7th Congressional District are eligible and encouraged to participate. This year's theme is "A Day in the Life of Wisconsin." Winners will be displayed in the U.S. Capitol.

Homicide Trial Set (violence) – The two people accused of killing an Altoona man are set to go to trial next year. Trials are scheduled for Brandon Gaston and Tracey Clark in March 2024. They accused of killing Dennis Schattie of Altoona. His body was round in the Rock River in Illinois in April 2022.

Week of 2/27-3/3

Transit Transfer Center Update (business) – After a challenging search, the City of Eau Claire has a developer to build apartments on top of the new Transit Transfer Center. The company out of lowa is buying the space to build with payments from the city for reaching certain benchmarks. The plan is to have 80 residential units with at least half of them being affordable housing.

Big Meth Bust (substance abuse) – The West Central Drug Task Force had one of its largest busts ever following a traffic stop. Investigators found more than five pounds of meth with a street value around \$118,000. Dalton Clayton was arrested & charged in the case.

CVTC Rural Funding (health) – Chippewa Valley Technical College is getting a \$1.8 million grant for rural health care. CVTC will use the grant to target rural communities to help high school students enter the health field.

House of Gouda (business) – A new store just opened in the former Pier 1 Imports location in Eau Claire. House of Gouda is operated by Marieke Penterman. Penterman is known for her gouda cheese. This particular store is focusing on making your own charcuterie boards.

Black Essence Event (cultural development) – UW-Eau Claire held its final event of Black History Month. The Black Essence event featured local artists and focused on the spoken word, music and art.

Marshfield Layoffs (Health or Economy) – The CEO of Marshfield Clinic Health System announced 346 layoffs statewide. Marshfield also isn't filling 500 open positions. The CEO says complications in the industry from the past few years are factors in the layoffs.

Dog Cognition Study (science) – Biology students at UWEC are trying to find out how dogs learn. Students in the Animal Behavior class are conducting research at emBARK Dog Training in Eau Claire to learn more about how dogs understand the world around them.

Week of 3/27-3/31

GUILTY VERDICT (violence) – A man is found guilty of killing four people whose bodies were found in Dunn County. Antoine Suggs was convicted of four counts of intentional homicide in Minnesota. He was charged with killing four friends in St. Paul and then driving their bodies to Wisconsin. He left the bodies in an SUV in a cornfield in Dunn County. He faces up 160 years in prison.

EASTER BUNNY (children) – The Easter Bunny visited Eau Claire Burger King locations to take free photos with children. The locations also had activities for families including games and coloring. Santa has visit before, but this is the first time the Easter Bunny has made an appearance at the Burger Kings.

DELTA AIRLINES SUSPENSION (business) – Delta Airlines announced it's suspending service from the La Crosse Regional Airport to the Minneapolis/St. Paul International airport. The suspension begins June 4 with no restart date yet. The suspension is being blamed on staffing issues, specifically a pilot shortage.

January 1

This morning we are taking a deep dive into the social media platforms that profit from grabbing onto and monetizing our attention to the tune of billions of dollars a year and with almost no regulation. A majority agree: social media's influence on our democracy and our national security is a big problem. Sixty-four percent of Americans believe social media has been a bad thing for our democracy — two-thirds of the country — creating polarization and division, and eroding civility in our politics, all of this according to a new Pew survey. It's an attention economy whose business model depends simply on persuading you that you and your way of life is somehow under attack in order to buy your time and attention, as whistleblowers from these companies have come to Capitol Hill to warn us about.

January 8

What we saw this week was a decade in the making. Since the downfall of the Bush presidency, the Republican Party has had an identity crisis, from the Tea Party to the Freedom Caucus, Republicans know what they are against, but they can't seem to agree on a vision of what they're for.

January 15

We often joke that a week is a lifetime in politics. Well, we just lived one of those weeks where we just had a lifetime. We are just two weeks into 2023, but it's already clear this year is going to be defined by a brutal and confrontational political climate with probably a lot of gridlock. Thursday the White House acknowledged that more classified documents had been found in a garage at Biden's home in Wilmington, as well as in an adjacent room. And the president's public comments produced more questions than answers.

January 22

Boy, our democracy and our politics, they feel like we're at a breaking point. We have rising political violence fueled by election denialism, economic brinksmanship in Congress, a Supreme Court, relationships between the justices so strained after an unprecedented leak, they've yet to issue an opinion this term. And trust in the court from the public, never been lower. And this morning, we're waking up to reports of another mass shooting with at least 10 dead at a Lunar New Year event in Monterey Park, California.

January 29

After the murder of George Floyd, there seemed to be a bipartisan consensus that something had to be done on the national level, but nothing happened. Now we're watching this brutal beating of Tyre Nichols in Memphis, Tennessee, and asking: How can this be happening again?

February 5

A Chinese spy balloon has set off a diplomatic crisis, deepening mistrust between the United States and China, and triggering political finger-pointing here at home before being shot down on Saturday. The U.S. military first detected the balloon over Alaska's Aleutian Islands last Saturday. It was spotted by civilians on Wednesday over Billings, Montana. Montana, by the way, is also home to Malmstrom Air Force Base, which houses 150 intercontinental ballistic missile silos. There were sightings of this balloon over Missouri and Kansas on Friday, and of course over the Carolinas on Saturday. The FAA had to close airspace and pause flights at three airports, in order to allow the F-22 fighter jet to shoot down this balloon six miles off the Carolina coast with a single air-to-air missile.

February 12

For the second day in a row, and the third time in a week, the U.S. military has shot down suspicious, high-altitude objects over North America. U.S. fighter jets downed unidentified objects over Alaska on Friday and Canada on Saturday.

February 19

Fifteen days after the U.S. shot down a Chinese spy balloon and after a canceled diplomatic trip to Beijing, tensions with China have now escalated again to accusations that China may be supplying Russia or may supply Russia with lethal aid in its war against Ukraine. On Thursday, the President did try to turn the temperature down a bit with China, acknowledging that the three unidentified objects shot down over Lake Huron, Alaska and Canada were not tied to China, but were likely simply research blooms.

February 26

As the war in Ukraine enters its second year, the question is what will victory look like? It's pretty clear no one involved – not the United States or our European allies, Ukraine or Russia – can afford for this war to be in the same place it is today going into year three, a year from now. And yet both sides, President Biden in a surprise visit to Kyiv and Vladimir Putin this week in Moscow, prepared the world for a drawn-out conflict.

March 5

This may be the week where we saw the 2024 presidential campaign kick into full gear, and not just on the Republican side.

March 12

It was a week, to borrow a phrase of "Everything Everywhere All at Once." Global instability and threats to democracy at home, and it ended in the second-largest bank collapse in U.S. history. All of it adds to the uncertainty many Americans have been feeling for a few years now. On our southern border, the kidnapping of four U.S. citizens in Mexico -- and murder of two of them – just over our border, raise tensions on the charged issue of border security, prompting calls for President Biden to try to crack down on cartels.

March 19

We're going to begin with the economy. Three years ago this week, we probably need a little perspective here, folks, the world began a complete shutdown. Countries began sealing their borders and "social distancing" became a catchphrase. This impacted our economy. Three years later, after 760 million reported Covid cases worldwide, nearly 7 million deaths from the

virus, we'd all like to memory hole Covid. But the fallout has been impossible to ignore. Forty-seven percent of Americans admit it. They say their lives will never return to pre-pandemic normal, according to Gallup. Inflation, of course, has been a big fallout from this shutdown, and it remains stubborn.

March 26

This week left no doubt; Donald Trump is still in charge of the Republican Party. Just a few hours after Trump's false claim that he was going to be arrested in the Manhattan hush money case last Tuesday, the Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy announced that House Republicans were launching investigations into Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg.
