This Sunday: America's fentanyl crisis. The highly addictive synthetic opioid -- 50 times more potent than heroin -- is at the center of the deadliest drug epidemic in American history. Fentanyl is killing more than 70,000 Americans a year. A new war on drugs emerging as a key 2024 campaign issue.

July 9

With the Iowa caucuses just six months away, mark your calendars for January 15th officially by the way, the two parties are debating what the coming campaign is going to be about: the intensifying culture wars or a referendum on the economy. President Biden is hoping to claim credit for what is an improving economy. He's ramping up a messaging tour focused on the economic agenda that he is embracing and calling "Bidenomics." Inflation has dropped for 11 straight months, from a high of 9.1% in June of last year to 4% this May. Unemployment stands at 3.6%, that is near 50-year low. And 13 million jobs have been added since Biden took office.

July 16

This week we saw some good news on the economy, inflation cooling and more signs the 2024 campaign is heating up.

July 30

Setting up a potential impeachment investigation coinciding with the threat of a government shutdown, all in the fall.

August 6

This Sunday, arrested development. Donald Trump is arrested for the fourth time and becomes the first president to have his mug shot taken. His 18 co-defendants, including his former chief of staff, also surrender after being charged for their efforts to overturn the 2020 Georgia election results.

September 3

Lawmakers will return to Washington this week to a political storm of their own making, with a Biden impeachment inquiry looking more and more likely, and uncertainty about whether the government can keep the lights on after this month.

September 10

Regional trends and viewpoints are increasingly being replaced by national ones in the worlds of business, politics, and even college football. Ad revenues and audience models are dramatically reshaping the world of college athletics, and it's destroying what were once regional conferences.

September 17
