KERN COUNTY AGRICULTURE CANNOT SURVIVE WITHOUT THEM." BEATRICE SANDERS IS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE KERN COUNTY FARM BUREAU. ALONG WITH OTHER AG GROUPS, THEY ARE STRONGLY SUPPORTING A PROPOSED BILL BY DEMOCRATIC ASSEMBLYMAN LUIS ALEJO.... THAT WOULD CREATE A PROGRAM UNDER WHICH UNDOCUMENTED FARM WORKERS *ALREADY* LIVING IN CALIFORNIA WOULD BE GIVEN A WORK PERMIT. "THEY'RE THE BACKBONE OF KERN COUNTY AGRICULTURE. I DON'T THINK WE CAN SURVIVE WITHOUT SOME OF TYPE OF LEGISLATION WANTING THEM TO BECOME MORE ACTIVE HERE ON OUR WORK FORCE. BUT THERE IS OPPOSITION TO THE BILL FROM THE UNITED FARM WORKERS UNION AND OTHERS WHICH CLAIM IT THREATENS TO REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF MONEY FARMWORKERS EARN AND UNDERMINES FEDERAL IMMIGRATION PROPOSALS. "CALIFORNIA HAS NOTHING TO LOSE. WE'RE THE STATE WITH ALMOST UP TO THREE MILLION UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS, ANYWHERE FROM 500 THOUSAND TO 700

THOUSAND OF THOSE WORK IN AGRICULTURE."

THE KEY IS FOR THE PARENTS TO BE ENGAGED IN THEIR KIDS' LIVES, AND TO HAVE FUN. THE FIRST STEP IN BUILDING GOOD COMMUNICATION IS TO START EARLY. COMMUNICATION - TALKING, LISTENING, AND GUIDING IS THE CORE OF PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT. PARENTS NEED TO BE INVOLVED AND CONTINUE TO STAY INVOLVED IN THEIR CHILDREN'S' LIVES. AS CHILDREN GET OLDER, IT IS VITAL TO KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN ESPECIALLY AS THEY BEGIN FEELING INCREASED PRESSURE TO START ENGAGING IN RISKY BEHAVIOR INCLUDING SMOKING, DRINKING OR USING OTHER DRUGS. DURING CHILDHOOD AND ADOLESCENCE, USING ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS CAN INTERFERE WITH YOUR CHILD'S PHYSICAL, EMOTION, AND COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT AND CAN CAUSE SERIOUS AND LASTING DAMAGE. THE EARLIER AND MORE OFTEN AN ADOLESCENT SMOKES, DRINKS ALCOHOL, OR USES ILLEGAL DRUGS, THE LIKELIER THAT ADOLESCENT WILL BECOME ADDICTED. PARENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE SOCIAL NETWORKING SITES AND MONITOR THEIR USE OF TECHNOLOGY. PARENTS NEED TO SHOW YOUR CHILDREN THAT YOU CARE ABOUT THEM, AND PLAN FUN ACTIVITIES INCLUDING GIVING BACK TO THE COMMUNITY. PARENTS NEED TO KNOW WHO THEIR KIDS ARE HANGING OUT WITH AND KNOW THEIR PARENTS. PARENTS HAVE TO DISCUSS OR ROLE PLAY ON HOW TO EXIT A PEER PRESSURE SITUATION. MORE THAN 90 % OF PEOPLE WITH ADDICTIONS BEGAN SMOKING, DRINKING OR USING OTHER DRUGS BEFORE AGE 18. IN THE U.S. NEARLY EVERY CHILD WILL BE OFFERED DRUGS OR ALCOHOL BEFORE GRADUATING HIGH

SCHOOL. 86% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SAY CLASSMATES SMOKE, DRINK OR USE OTHER DRUGS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY. 52 % OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SAY THERE IS A PLACE WHERE STUDENTS GO TO SMOKE, DRINK AND USE OTHER DRUGS DURING SCHOOL. 36% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SAY IT IS EASY FOR STUDENTS TO SMOKE, DRINK AND USE OTHER DRUGS WITHOUT GETTING CAUGHT, AT SCHOOL. 44%, ALMOST HALF OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS, KNOW OF A STUDENT WHO SELLS ILLEGAL DRUGS AT SCHOOL. 60% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS HAVE SAID THEY ATTEND A DRUG-INFECTED SCHOOL. PARENTS CAN TAKE THE FAMILY DAY STAR PLEDGE: S-SPEND TIME WITH MY KIDS T-TALK TO THEM ABOUT THEIR FRIENDS, INTERESTS AND THE DANGERS OF NICOTINE, ALCOHOL, AND OTHER DRUGS A-ANSWER THEIR QUESTIONS AND LISTEN TO WHAT THEY SAY R-RECOGNIZE THAT I HAVE THE POWER TO HELP KEEP MY KIDS SUBSTANCE-FREE

THIS IS ONE OF THE HIGHEST SOLAR TAXES IN THE COUNTRY, AND A TYPICAL HOMEOWNER COULD PAY ALABAMA POWER \$25 TO \$50 EVERY MONTH FOR THE "PRIVILEGE" OF USING THEIR PROPERTY TO GENERATE CLEAN SOLAR POWER. (A FIVE-DOLLAR FEE WAS PROPOSED TO THE GEORGIA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, BUT WAS NOT ALLOWED BECAUSE GEORGIA POWER COULD NOT PROVE THE NEED WITH A COST/BENEFIT ANALYSIS TO SUPPORT IT.) ALSO, APCO PAYS A MEAGER THREE OR FOUR CENTS PER KILOWATT-HOUR FOR ANY EXCESS ELECTRICITY THE CUSTOMER PUTS BACK ON THE GRID. IN NORTH ALABAMA, THE TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY (TVA) CHARGES NO SUCH FEE, AND PAYS HOMEOWNERS MORE THAN TWICE AS MUCH FOR THE CLEAN ENERGY THEY ARE SUPPLYING, WHICH IS WHY THERE ARE MANY MORE SOLAR INSTALLATIONS IN THAT PART OF THE STATE. -WHAT NEEDS TO CHANGE FOR ALABAMIANS TO HAVE ENERGY FREEDOM? FIRST, WE WANT THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO RESCIND ITS EXCEPTIONALLY HIGH TAX ON SOLAR. NEXT, WE WANT TO ENSURE THAT SOLAR POWER SUPPLIERS OTHER THAN A REGULATED MONOPOLY CAN COMPETE FAIRLY IN ALABAMA TO OFFER CONSUMERS A CHOICE AS WELL AS LOWER PRICES.
