SHE'S NOT JUST CONCERNED ABOUT THE SAFETY OF THE KIDS WHO PLAY AT THE LAKE, THIS IS A VERY SMALL COMMUNITY, AND THE KIDS PLAY ALL OVER IT. I KNOW OUR KIDS GO ALL OVER TO DIFFERENT HOUSES AND VISIT. I WOULD THINK IF THE ARREST WAS DONE WE SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST BEEN NOTIFIED THAT THERE HAD BEEN AN ARREST. SHE SAYS THE FACT THAT THIS COULD HAPPEN AND NOONE KNOWS IT IS CONCERNING, AND IS A GOOD LESSON TO THE COMMUNITY MOVING FORWARD. MAKE A POINT OF KNOWING YOUR NEIGHBORS MAKE A POINT OF KNOWING NOT ONLY YOUR DIRECT NEIGHBORS, BUT THOSE IN YOUR COMMUNITY.
