WAGNER FARMS PLANTED NINE ACRES WORTH OF SQUASH FOR CHARITY AT THE START OF THE SEASON. NOW THEY LITERALLY HAVE TONS OF THE STUFF, AND ARE LOOKING FOR HELP HARVESTING IT FOR CHARITY GROUPS. YOU'LL FIND MORE DETAILS AT THE WAGNER FARMS FACEBOOK PAGE.

10-04-2016 ANOTHER MILLION DOLLARS IN STATE FUNDING IS FLOWING INTO GRIFFISS BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY PARK. THAT'S THE FOUNDATION OF THE AREA'S ENTRY INTO THE GOVERNOR'S UPSTATE REVITALIZATION COMPETITION. TEN REGIONAL COUNCILS ARE VYING FOR THREE 500-MILLION DOLLAR AID PACKAGES. THE MOHAWK VALLEY'S PROPOSAL FOCUSES ON DEVELOPING THE AREA'S TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES, INCLUDING DRONE FACILITIES AT GRIFFISS INTERNATIONAL AND THE MARCY NANOCENTER. THAT'S COMPLEMENTED BY ENCOURAGING GREATER DIVERSITY IN THE AREA'S FARM PRODUCTS AND SPECIALTY PRODUCTION WHILE BUILDING AGRICULTURAL PROFITABILITY.

10-08-2016 THERE'S SOME GOOD NEWS AT GRIFFIS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT. PREMIER AVIATION SAYS IT'S SIGNED A TWO YEAR DEAL WITH ATLAS AIR TO HANDLE HEAVY MAINTENANCE ON THEIR FLEET OF BOING 747S, AND THEY'LL BE HIRING ADDITIONAL WORKERS TO HANDLE THE CONTRACT. THE NEWS COMES AFTER DOZENS OF WORKERS AT MIDAIR USA WERE LEFT JOBLESS AFTER THE COMPANY ENTERED BANKRUPTCY

10-10-16 MORE EXPENSIVE ELECTRICITY, CHEAPER NATURAL GAS. THAT'S THE PREDICTION FROM NATIONAL GRID FOR ENERGY COSTS FOR THIS WINTER'S HEATING SEASON. OFFICIALS SAY A STEADY SUPPLY OF NATURAL GAS AND FLAT DELIVERY RATES SHOULD SEE THOSE PRICES DIP TO A TEN YEAR LOW. AT THE SAME TIME CONSUMERS WILL BE PAYING ABOUT TEN DOLLARS MORE FOR ELECTRICAL POWER OVER THE SAME TIME PERIOD. FOR NOW NATIONAL GRID IS EXPECTING A RELATIVELY MILD WINTER SIMILAR TO LAST YEAR, AND NOT THE FRIGID TEMPERATURES OF THE 2013/2014 HEATING SEASON.

THE LOCAL AVERAGE IS HOVERING AT 2-43 A GALLON, JUST A HAIR UNDER THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE OF 2-45. THAT'S A JUMP OF FOUR CENTS A GALLON OVER THE LAST WEEK, AND AROUND TWENTY CENTS MORE THAN WE WERE PAYING AT THE SAME TIME LAST YEAR. ON THE BRIGHT SIDE, PRICES SHOULD STABILIZE AS SUPPLIES OF WINTER BLEND GASOLINE BUILD UP.
