TODAY WE UPDATED VIEWERS ON THE MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE IN SEATTLE. STARTING APRIL 1, NEXT YEAR- COMPANIES WITH MORE THAN 500 EMPLOYEES HAVE 3 YEARS TO FGRADUALLY INCREASE PAY FOR THEIR MINIMUM WAGE EMPLOYEES TO 15-DOLLARS AN HOUR. COMPANIES WITH FEWER WORKERS WILL HAVE 7 YEARS. SOCIALIST COUNCIL MEMBER KSHAMA SAWANT WANTED THE WAGE HIKE TO BE PHASED IN EARLIER BUT SHE WAS SHOT DOWN. LOCAL FRANCHISE OWNERS ARE NOT HAPPY WITH THE PLAN. THE INTERNATIONAL FRANCHISE ASSOCIATION HAS ALREADY FILED A SUIT CALLING THE PLAN UNFAIR AND DISCRIMINATORY. OTHER COUNCIL MEMBERS ARE DEFENDING THEIR VOTE TO RAISE THE WAGE.

TODAY WE UPDATED VIEWERS ON THE IMPACT OF THE MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE AND HOW IT WILL DIRECTLY EFFECT VIEWERS.11 YEARS AGO, MATT HOLLBECK BOUGHT THIS SUBWAY FRANCHISE IN BALLARD. HE STATED THAT HE ALSO PAYS FOR RENT, PAYROLL, INSURANCE AND THE FOOD AS WELL AS ROYALTY FEES TO SUBWAY (TO USE THE CORPORATE NAME). EVEN THOUGH HOLLBECK ONLY HAS 8 EMPLOYEES-HIS SHOP IS CONSIDERED A 'BIG BUSINESS` UNDER SEATTLE`S NEW MINIMUM WAGE LAW.THAT MEANS HE HAS ONLY 3 YEARS TO PHASE IN 15 DOLLARS AN HOUR.HOLLBECK SAYS HE`LL HAVE TO RAISE PRICES UP TO A DOLLAR PER SANDWICH, AND SCALE BACK HEALTH CARE BENEFITS FOR HIS WORKERS.CHUCK STEMPLER, WHO OWNS AN ALPHA GRAPHICS STORE IN QUEEN ANNE, IS ONE OF 600 FRANCHISEES PLANNING TO FILE A FEDERA LAWSUIT TO STOP THE WAGE INCREASE. CHUCK SAYS IT WILL DIMINISH HIS PROFIT SIGNIFICANTLY. ATTORNEYS FEEL THE ORDINANCE VIOLATES THE COMMERCE AND EQUAL PROTECTION CLAUSES OF THE U-S CONSTITUTION.ON TWITTER, SOCIALIST COUNCIL MEMBER KSHAMA SAWANT SHOWED NO SYMPATHY: "ENOUGH WITH THE BLAME GAME! ORGANIZE, GO TO CORPORATE HEADQUARTERS AND RENEGOTIATE YOUR RENTS'.
