A NEW 15-DOLLAR MINIMUM WAGE KICKS IN TODAY FOR EMPLOYEES IN SEATAC, WE INFORMED VIEWERS -- EXCEPT IF YOU WORK AT THE AIRPORT. BUT THOSE AIRPORT WORKERS ARE FIRING BACK. AT A RALLY YESTERDAY, WORKERS EXPRESSED ANGER OVER THE RULING, THAT EXCLUDED THEM FROM THE RAISE.

LAST WEEK, A SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE RULED THAT THE PORT OF SEATTLE HAS CONTROL OVER WAGES AT THE AIRPORT, NOT THE CITY OF SEATAC. THIS MEANS THAT THE NEW MINIMUM WAGE LAW ONLY APPLIES TO 16-HUNDRED HOSPITALITY WORKERS IN THE CITY -- NOT THE 47-HUNDRED LOW-WAGE EARNERS AT THE AIRPORT.

YESTERDAY, LEADERS BEHIND THE VOTE FILED A PETITION WITH THE STATE SUPREME COURT TO CHALLENGE THE LOWER COURT'S DECISION.

SO YOU HAVE JUST OVER 1,500 PEOPLE HERE IN SEATAC THAT WILL GET THAT BIG PAY INCREASE...MANY PEOPLE THAT WORK HERE FEEL THESE EXEMPTIONS ARE KEEPING THOUSNADS OF PEOPLE DOWN AND THEY ARE FIGHTING IT.
