Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. <u>Food Insecurity:</u> Experts say 1 in eight people in America experience food insecurity every week. It's estimated that as many as 6% of Dubuque residents are dealing with some sort of food insecurity. That's nearly 6,000 people, many of who are kids under 18.
- B. <u>Domestic Violence</u>: Domestic violence deaths in Iowa in 2022 were down slightly from 2021 but is still a big issue for Iowans
- C. <u>Volunteer Opportunities:</u> Many people are willing and able to volunteer their time and talents but aren't sure where or how to volunteer.
- D. <u>Child Hunger</u>: 1 in 4 students will be affected over the holidays when school is closed and school breakfast and lunch is not available. For many students this may be their only daily food source.
- E. <u>Holiday Toy/Clothing Drive</u>: People are struggling every Holiday to provide Christmas gifts for their family. These include more than toys including clothing, shoes, gas cards, and more

Oct 2, 2022	7am	30 minutes	Morning Wake up	Food insecurity: Conducted an interview with Judy Faulhaber of Big Apple Bagels, a breakfast restaurant in Dubuque. Judy was putting on an event called "Stocktoberfest," which was predicated on raising money and nonperishable goods for the Dubuque Food Bank. Spoke with Judy about her mission to continue to help Tri-State families in need amidst the ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Big Apple Bagels wound up raising over \$1,000 in monetary donations and were able to provide over 5,000 meals with all the food they collected.
October 7, 2022	8am	30 minutes	Morning Wake up	Domestic violence: Conducted an interview with both Jordan Offtender and Courtney Chaffee, Associate Director of Public Relations of Riverview Center. Both talked about their 2022 "Duck Derby," which involves people purchasing ducks that would be dropped in the Galena River to "race" for a chance at monetary prizes. The funds raised help Riverview Center. In addition to having a 24/7 crisis hotline,

				Riverview Center also works with victims of sexual assault and domestic violence in the Tri-State area.
October 11, 2022	8am	30 minutes	Morning Wake Up	Wolunteer Opportunities. Conducted an interview with Josh Jasper of Resources Unite, a nonprofit located in Dubuque that places volunteers with individuals or organizations that are looking for help. Jasper and his organization were part of the aforementioned "Stocktoberfest" event. Jasper talked about all the good Resources Unite does for the community, such as providing residents with a food pantry at which to shop, diapers and wet-wipes for parents making suboptimal income, and free beds to children in need.
December 2, 2022	8:10am	30 minutes	Morning Wake Up	Child Hunger. Conducted an interview with Danielle Meyer, a Dubuque resident who holds an annual collections campaign known as "Belly Bags." Meyer enlists in the community to collect food items for kids about to go on holiday break, whose parents might be unable to prepare them their regular meals due to their work schedule. Meyer spoke about the donation process, her own drop-off/delivery method, and how every year, this campaign sees more and more donations.
December 5, 2022	8am	30 minutes		Holiday Toy/Clothing Drive. Conducted an interview with Heather Hamm of Kwik Stop/Rainbo Oil. Hamm talked about the Magical Kwik Stop Christmas campaign, which is dedicated to bringing Christmas to a select number of "adopted" local families, in conjunction with Catholic charities. Hamm spoke about how to go about donating to this cause, and that 22 families would be benefiting from Magical Kwik Stop Christmas this year: presents gifted to the families can be anything from new clothes to a bicycle, should the families have children.

In addition to the above local programming, the stations air responsive programming in the form of a weekly 30 minutes program, VIEWPOINTS RADIO. The program addresses the issues identified as significant to the community as well as a variety of other related topics.
