Description: Bullying is a huge problem in Laredo that has reached epidemic proportions. People with ideas of Love, Liberty, Acceptance and Respect (PILLAR) are determined to do something about it and are reaching out to the community for help. PILLAR is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides a safe, nurturing and non-discriminatory environment where people experiencing emotional trauma due to bullying/victimization from others, suicidal ideation, or are struggling with their sexual identity, can seek supportive services to reduce the negative impact of these circumstances. Issue: Public Safety/Drinking and Driving/Public intoxication
Description: For the first time in Webb County, the District Attorney's Office in coordination with Laredo Police Department, Texas Department of Public Safety and the Sheriff's Office initiated a "No Refusal Weekend" in an attempt to deter drunk driving during Halloween celebrations. The "No Refusal" legislation allows law enforcement officials to legally acquire a search warrant for blood samples from drivers who are suspected of drunk driving. During this effort, prosecutors and judges will be available to streamline the warrant acquisition process in case the suspect refuses to voluntarily provide a breath or blood specimen. The blood will be drawn by a medical professional who will be stationed at LPD after the search warrant is issued. Impaired driving, which remains a major public safety concern, causes many crashes that result in either serious injury or claims thousands of innocent lives every year. Whenever someone runs the risk of driving while intoxicated, they not only endanger their own lives, but the lives of others on the roadway. Anyone driving with a blood or breath alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08 grams per deciliter or higher is considered legally impaired. Across the state of Texas, many departments are utilizing this "No Refusal Weekend" to combat the DWI problem. One of the objectives of the District Attorney's office is the promotion of community safety and implementing this enforcement strategy in Laredo will keep our roads safe. This special enforcement will begin at 8 p.m. on Thursday, October 31 and end at 6 a.m. on Sunday, November 3. An interview was granted to District Attorney, Chilo Alaniz in order for the 'No Refusal' program to be highly publicized and let the public know that their chances of being caught, arrested, and convicted of DWI increase during these efforts. Our message is simple: Make the right call. Don't drink and drive.
