In "The Story Continues," Hoffman visits with the family of a local World War II Medal of Honor recipient; plus, she dives into the story of a Black Kansas City cowboy who is uplifting the history of Black cowboys; as well as the Black Kansas City women who preceded the national "soft Black girl" movement, in which Black women everywhere have embraced softness and luxury in their everyday lives.
