The test of bravery in a life a death situation... fortunately, most of us will never realistically have to face that test...but many of us probably wonder what we'd do "if... "

Imagine IF we lived under ISIS control would we have the guts to smuggle out video to inform the world? If our place of work were bombed to silence us...would we return to that work each day for the greater good? Would we find ways to survive prison camps and human trafficking and still reach back and help others after we'd made our own escape?... Or be clever and determined enough to flout a dictator's chokehold on information by flying balloons with leaflets or drones with USB drives over the DMZ?

Every year at the renowned Oslo Freedom Forum the world gets to meet such inspirational human rights advocates. They come together to testify with their stories and brainstorm about ways to better the human condition of the oppressed of our planet.

The Bay Area got to experience meeting many of these same inspirational people this past week as The Human Rights Foundation brought them to San Francisco's own Freedom Forum.

Today yopu will meet two of these brave, young, human rights advocates who, through their own suffering are now working to ease the suffering of others. In the second half of In Depth today, We will introduce you to Hyeonseo Lee... a defector from North Korea now working to help other country women who like her, escaped into China only to be hunted by police and driven into the clutches of traffickers.

But first, Rosa Maria Paya from Cuba... president of the Latin American Network of Youth for Democracy, and is a member of the Cuba Decides campaign. With the new thawing of relations between the US and the Cuban regime...Americans have become eager to know more about the island nation so close to us...yet off limits for so long. But Paya... who lost her democracy advocate father to a mysterious car accident widely believed to be a regime assisination... says the most important thing to know about Cuba is that its people are still very much oppressed.

Now meet Hyeonsao Lee.... who escaped North Korea at 17...was forced to live underground in China for a decade before successfully defecting to South Korea....only to go back and lead her family out of North Korea on a long a treacherous escape through Laos and Cambodia. Her incredible story is documented in her memoir The Girl with Seven Names. Hyeonsao Lee is now dedicated to rescuing other North Korean women driven into sexual slavery in China after escaping the Kim regime.

Hyeonseo Lee is a student, activist, and North Korean defector... now starting her own non-profit called NorthStar...for guiding light... to help rescue others victimized because of their desire for freedom from the Kim regime. With just days to go until the General Election... the airwaves, social media and mailboxes are crammed with political ads. It costs a lot of money to run a campaign... and that need in American politics opens the door to favors and influence that goes way beyond one person, one vote.

And in recent years, unlimited and anonymous money has been playing a big role in who gets elected, how they legislate once in office...and the public policy we have to abide by.

The so-called Dark Money donors are known only to themselves and the candidates and legislation they support... and are not bound by law to be revealed to voters. Dark Money...and other vast amounts of identified money form much more than a simple quid pro quo between elected officials and donors... it finances an intertwined network of political influence with long tentacles.

it's become easier for all of us to track the identified political donors, those who accept their money, and related legislative votes.

Daniel G Newman...President and Co-Founder of MAPLIGHT.ORG... a nonpartisan research organization that tracks money's influence on politics and public policy.

One of Maplight's latest projects is DARK MONEY WATCH...an attempt to shed some light on sources of hundreds of millions of dollars to campaigns...and whose origins are unknown to voters.

ISSUE: HOW VOTERS THINK

This first weekend following a stunning presidential and general election, many of us are still trying to figure out what happened, and why.

We may all be Americans but there seems to be little we recognize in each other... at least politically ... that's familiar or consistent. What words, perceptions, life experiences...drive our world view and political decision-making?

Cognitive linguist Dr. George Lakoff...Professor Emeritus of UC Berkeley.... Author of several books including Moral Politics - How Liberals and Conservatives Think... Don't Think of an Elephant...The Political Mind... (psycho- linguist)

He theorizes that conservatives and progressives simply think differently about politics, based on their world view which likely came from their family structure. Strict father or parent model emphasizes self-discipline and respect for authority and a reward/punishment reference. A Nurturant parent model features empathy, obedience out of respect and love, and a more collaborative model is key. Dr. Lakoff contends these unconscious metaphors are what drive our political reasoning...and now, what have given us the results of the 2016 General Election.

ISSUE: COVERED CA

<u>KCBS In Depth</u> November 20, 2016 6:30am 30 Minutes

1.5 million Californians have healthcare under the state created, state run health insurance exchange we know as Covered California. It is a participant in the federal Affordable Care Act many of us know as Obamacare... and through that legislation an expansion of Medicaid (the federal version of medical) these federal subsidies allow for additional health coverage for some 12 million Californians...

What happens now with a republican congress and senate and a president elect who have all promised a repeal of the ACA?

We are joined this week on InDepth by Peter Lee, Executive Director of Covered California:

Regardless of the outcome of the presidential election...and renewed promises to

repeal the Affordable Care Act, or, Obamacare... California's Health Insurance Exchange continues to encourage new sign-ups during this open enrollment time frame.

Covered California Executive Director Peter Lee says no matter what happens in Washington D-C in the near future, any change of policy will take time and Californians can enroll for guaranteed coverage through 2017...and that the standard of coverage will remain high as enacted in Obamacare. Lee tells KCBS' Jane McMillan he is concerned about that standard being maintained should the A-C-A be completely repealed and a lesser replacement take it's place.

By the way, the deadline to sign up for health coverage through Covered California and be covered as of New Year's Day is December 15th. We have a link to Covered California on our website, cbssf.com.

Nearly one and a half million residents of California currently have health insurance coverage through the state's health care exchange, Covered California, created under the provisions of the Affordable Care Act...A-C-A..or... Obamacare.

Because of the expansion of Medicaid through the A-C-A, another 12 million Californians are covered. So, what happens to this coverage if the promises of the Republican House and Senate and the President-Elect are kept to repeal the landmark legislation?

Nobody really knows. But, Covered California Executive Director Peter Lee says coverage through the Golden State's exchange is guaranteed through 2017 and he's encouraging people to sign up.

And, Lee tells KCBS' Jane McMillan he continues to debunk some of the stubborn arguments against it:

ISSUE: PUPPY MIND

ISSUE: The 75th Anniversary of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor

Mr. Michael Mickey Ganitch now of San Leandro... was born in a farming town near Akron Ohio in 1919... and upon joining the navy in California, was assigned to the flagship of the Pacific Fleet based at Pearl Harbor Hawaii:

Mickey Ganitch is making the journey back to Pearl Harbor this December 7th to mark the 75th Anniversary of the attack.

That Sunday morning, just across the channel from Mickey and the Pennsylvania, was Charles Chuck Kohler, now of Concord, but then a 17-year old from far northwest Minnesota on the adventure of his young life.

Chuck says just as he'd figured out what was going on, he was ordered, with others, to take cover in a ditch... that didn't sit well with him.

And he didn't obey it! He and another sailor grabbed a 30 caliber machine gun, ran to some parked PBY boat planes, mounted the gun inside and started shooting:

Like Mickey Ganitch, Chuck Kohler served in the Pacific theater throughout the war...

For your service.. and your continued devotion... Thank you...

On December 7th, Chuck Kohler will be speaking at the annual lighting ceremony of the Mt Diablo Beacon which commemorates the attack on Pearl Harbor. He...and Mickey...and all the survivors and their loved ones ask that we all spare a thought that day.
