The conventions are over... official nominations for the Presidential contenders are in the books and now... the name of the game is convincing voters. Words, perceptions, images, emotions... are all in play and will be used to sway Americans before they mark their November ballots.

But there may only be so much persuasion can do because according to my distinguished guest... conservatives and progressives simply think differently about politics, based on their world view which likely came from their family structure. Strict father or parent model emphasizes self-discipline and respect for authority and a reward/punishment reference. A nurturant parent model features empathy, obedience out of respect and love, and a more collaborative model is key.

Dr. Lakoff contend these unconscious metaphors drive our political reasoning. Let's find out how this is playing out in the 2016 Presidential race...

First... how do we know this... how did you come to this conclusion? Brain vs mind...

How much is taught versus hard wired?

Perception...why is Hillary disliked when on paper she's done everything right, and Trump an extreme? Likeability... labels...why things stick...group think, herd mentality...like popularity in high school.

Authority and morality go together... hierarchy ...western culture...

Winning...strong even if wrong...

Fear vs optimism

Causation... immediate gratification or effect vs long view...

Language... words are not neutral

Complex ideas vs simple solutions...even if factually impossible.

Swing voters... a combination.... how do their brains process and how to win them?

How does once side sway the other linguistically...how do we sway our "crazy" friends and relatives?

Timing is an issue...because the disease (protein build-up) can start decades before symptoms... new drug testing can then take a long time. (patent life issues?...not a money maker for drug companies. what about the govt, as a public health issue?--bump in funding--congress on drug exclusivity time-line, ACA)

When was the last time there was a massive breakthrough? Few and Far between.

Author, "Ethical Borders: NAFTA, Globalization and Mexican Migration" teaches immigration law & policy

"Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents," or DAPA (blocks DACA expansion) DREAMers? Original DACA remains in place... other programs?

The DREAM Act (acronym for Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors) is an American legislative proposal for a multi-phase process for illegal immigrants in the United States that would first grant conditional residency and upon meeting further qualifications, permanent residency.

The White House announced the programs in November 2014, issuing a five-page guidance memo enabling qualifying undocumented workers to receive temporary relief from the threat of deportation and to apply for programs that could qualify them for work authorization and associated benefits.

The Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents (DAPA) targets the nearly 4.3 million undocumented parents of citizens and lawful residents, and the second program expands the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), initiative aimed at non-citizens who came to the country as children.

The state of California...boasting the 8th largest economy in the world, comes in dead last in per capita spending on services for residents with developmental disabilities.

As the most populace state in the nation there are 33-million people making their lives in the Golden State... but about 4-million of our friends and neighbors, are trying to do so...while coping with a disability.

Certainly society and science have made strides in recognition, acceptance and assistance...but funding and accessibility to supportive programs continues to be a challenge, even as California has rebounded from the great recession. SCOTUS rulings or non-rulings on labor-- On June 28th, the U.S. Supreme Court denied the petition from nine California public school teachers to rehear their First Amendment challenge to mandatory union fees. The plaintiffs petitioned the Court to rehear their case after a 4-4 decision was issued in the wake of Justice Scalia's death. When the split decision was issued, it was not accompanied by an opinion on the merits of the argument. All that was issued was a one-line statement that the decision was split 4-4.

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court handed organized labor a major victory on Tuesday, deadlocking 4 to 4 in a case that had threatened to cripple the ability of public-sector unions to collect fees from workers who chose not to join and did not want to pay for the unions' collective bargaining activities.

A ruling allowing workers to refuse to pay the fees would have been the culmination of a decades-long campaign by a group of prominent conservative foundations aimed at weakening unions that represent teachers and other public employees. Tuesday's deadlock denied them that victory, but it set no precedent and left the door open for further challenges once the Supreme Court is back at full strength.
