Description: The city of Whitehouse announced an ordinance set to go into effect November 1st, requiring a five dollar permit to host a garage sale. A man about to hold a yard sale this weekend doesn't think it is fair. The Whitehouse Police Department's Facebook page that announced this has received hundreds of complaints. The City Manager tells us that they're doing it to make sure residential areas are not used for commercial purposes and to cut down on the amount of sales. They will issue no more than three permits per residence, per year.

Description: Smith County Commissioners Court met this morning approving a tax abatement for beverage distributor, GG Distributing, LLC. The company will move its operations to Smith County. The Commissioners also approved creating a reinvestment zone. The General Manager of the company says they are excited to move forward with their plans. The deciding factor was that the location provided the highway access they needed to get the 30 counties and make the company move more smoothly. He also adds that there is a good work force here in the area and that he believes all of East Texas will benefit from the company being in a central location. The facility is set to open in February of 2018.

PID is one of the groups trying to fill the void left by the Lufkin Industry lay-offs and it is hoping that having the capability to produce these gear boxes will bring industry a jobs back to Lufkin. Steve Floyd, the Assistant City Manager of Lufkin, explains the gear is currently being outsourced. Somebody out of town is doing the cutting, and that is an expensive process. With this improvement, they will do the work in house and hire people. They are hoping to employ up to 15 more people by the end of 2017.

Description: An unprecedented number of Texans have been questioning the validity of our State's voting process, specifically when it comes to electronic voting, and how votes are counted and preserved. For voters, you are told to trust the system. For candidates, you're told to accept the voter's decision. But what happens when there is a recount is requested? And what happens if election officials fail to provide data, required by law, to prove this system works? Doctor Laura Pressley has been working in computer technology for nearly two decades. In 2014, she ran for City Council. Dr. Pressley says professional polls leading up to the election showed she was winning her race by significant margins, but on Election Night, it was a different story. When the votes were counted, Dr. Pressley was beaten by a 2-1 margin and she think that was an impossible result. From there, Dr. Pressley turned to the Texas Election Code to see how electronic votes are handled, and how to conduct an official recount. There are two ways to conduct a recount. The first is to simply rerun the electronic voting tabulations. The other is recounting the ballot images cast that day. Dr. Pressley opted for a paper back-up but that didn't go very well since they couldn't follow the law as far as ballot images go, so she sued. In her research, Dr. Pressley discovered the problem goes all the way to the top. In her election's division of the Secretary of State's office has been issuing waivers to counties and precincts across Texas, excusing them from producing ballot images of elections, and in some cases printing election results tapes. In the State Election Code, there is a statute stating the Secretary of State's office can modify procedures, but it doesn't say it can modify the law. In August, a proposed rule change to get rid of the paper audit log, ballot images and paper tapes altogether for the November elections. Dr. Pressley says after hundreds of Texas voters and legislators protested the changes, the proposal was postponed, but not killed, and when that time comes, Dr. Pressley plans to be there. Pressley feels this battle is happening for a reason, believing the Lord put this in her lap and she knew she would never walk away from the fight.
