However, the number of truant age children, 12 and up for ten unexcused absences went from 53 in 2013-14 to 105 in 2014-15. According to the report, Jacksonville ISD has more instances of truancy than Tyler, even though Tyler has 4 times the population. Stewart says that is another problem the district plans to focus on and get better handling and to prevent.

The incident was ruled accidental and the people who lost their lives here are believed to have been using a propane stove for heat. A small leak in a gas line allowed propane to fill the home, causing the explosion. While propane gas is efficient and cost-effective, there are still potential dangers since propane is highly flammable. The residents in Coffee City decided to use their propane tank inside, which is a huge safety risk because the fumes are also very dangerous. Propane gas tanks should always be standing up, should be tested for leaks, should have proper ventilation, and the tank should never be brought into the house.

Description: Segments of Toll49 in Tyler have been opened since 2006 and ridership have been steadily rising ever since. However, the road conditions aren't improving with this increased traffic. TXDOT has suggested a progressive pavement plan for the toll road. They have also seen more traffic than originally expected, but plans are in the works to make some significant improvements in terms of the existing road with a possible overlay, and they will also be expanding the road to the north later this year.
