Section 1. Issues

- A. Health:** Issues relating to general health, medical conditions and healthy lifestyles.
- B. Education:** Issues relating to education in our community as well as informative topics of general interest on education.
- C. Quality of Life:** Activities, initiatives and topics of general interest to the local community.
- D. Religion:** Guests reflect on their faith and share how faith influences their lives and decision making. Also included are faith based community outreach initiatives.
- E. Arts & Entertainment:** Interviews with local authors, artists and musicians.
- F. Government & Community Action:** Interviews with local political leaders and community activists speaking on local issues and initiatives as well as topics of local and national importance.
- G. Sports:** Guests share about local sports, athletes, and sporting events.
- H. Finance, Insurance:** Experts share about tax preparation, insurance and financial planning.

Section 2. Responsive Programs

A. Health

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Healing Stream Breast Cancer Awareness" Broadcast April 5, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview and discussion with Audrey Walker, Breast Cancer Survivor and Founder of Healing Stream, Breast Cancer Awareness Organization. Our guest shares her story of being diagnosed with Breast Cancer 13 years ago and following recovery, her desire to help raise awareness of this disease among the African-American Community. Host and guest discuss Healing Stream outreach programs which educate women about the disease, stressing self-examination and Doctor visits. She also discusses the rise of Breast Cancer in men. Healing Stream will host its 14th Annual Walk for Breast Cancer Awareness October 2019. This annual event raises funds for outreach and research programs.

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 - Kevin Kita, Chiropractor" Broadcast April 19, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Jacque Howard interviews Chiropractor, Dr. Kevin Kita, who shares about good bone health and about the Korean Specific Technique he practices. He is a well-known and respected on health related issues, Chiropractic and for his book the Healing Journeys, Stories of Mind, Body and Spirit. Dr. Kita discusses how his book encourages the reader to look inside themselves when seeking answers to physical ailments. Often they are related to underlying issues which can contribute to the severity of the physical ailments a person is experiencing. Our guest also provides tips to ensure healthy spine alignment.

"Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Children's Futures" Broadcast April 24, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Brenda Cusack features an interview with June Gray, Director of Children's Futures. June shares about this 501c non-profit organization in Mercer County, New Jersey whose mission is to improve health and development outcomes for children and their families. She also discusses their collaboration with schools, social service providers, healthcare agencies, faith institutions, employers and civic associations in order to meet the goals set by this mission statement. Our guest provides information on their programs that assist parents with the demands of raising a family. These

programs are centered in the areas of Parenting, Primary Care, Child Care and Community Support.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Mental Health” Broadcast May 8, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Donna Wellons interviews Mental Health Counselor Verily Harper, and her husband, Ramone Harper who share tips on coping with stress and sadness related to celebrating Mother’s Day after the loss of a mother. Ramone also shares about his own grief when his mom passed away and how writing helped him to cope with it.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Kidney Disease” Broadcast May 16, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Trentonian, Tonya Stackhouse who shares about being diagnosed with kidney disease and in need of a transplant. She also talks about how the news impacted her life and how she coped during the two year wait to find a donor match for her. Today, Tonya is doing great, and providing support to other kidney disease patients. She is working to raise awareness and funds for research by organizing a “Walk” to take place in September 2019.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – The Practice of Yoga” Broadcast May 24, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Jacque Howard interviews Kristin Leung, Yoga Instructor. Ms. Leung shares about the practice of Yoga, different kinds of Yoga, and the self-discipline required in order to see positive effects. She also discusses what these positive effects can be on the body and mind.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Suppers Program” Broadcast June 13, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Djnaba Figueroa features an interview Kim Booker, Facilitator with the Suppers Program. Our guest shares about this non-profit organization that provides a safe and friendly setting where people can come together, especially those with food challenges and health related illnesses, and manage their own transition to a healthier life. She explains how the program brings people together, to cook together, eat together and restores the experience of the family table, and finally join to clean-up together. Each meeting provides nourishing food, social support and practices “No Judgment” and is followed by food and or health related topic. Host and guest also discuss the challenges of sourcing fresh, healthy, organic foods in Urban Communities. Joining the conversation is Fitness Expert, Eric Wall who talks about achieving good health through

adding regular exercise to your daily routine. Suppers Programs are currently available in Princeton and Trenton, New Jersey.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Epic Health Solutions” Broadcast June 28, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Jacque Howard interviews Founders of Epic Health Solutions who share their backgrounds in Public Health Administration and Epic’s mission to elevate equity and promote health for all people and insure they have what they need to be engaged in and thrive in their communities. Host and guests discuss the meaning of health inequity and explore the causes of health inequity among minorities, especially African-Americans and reasons for the disparity. Through the educational workshops they present around the country to healthcare workers and policy developers, Epic works to become part of the solution to solving our country’s health inequity crisis.

B. Education

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Benefit Concert for Literacy” Broadcast April 3, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Darlene McKnight features an interview with performing artists, Norman Marcelle and Tammi Journan. Our guests share about their love for reading and how important good reading skills are to student success. With a desire to help children in the Trenton, NJ area struggling with reading, they decided to put their talents to good use and host a benefit concert to support literacy programs in Trenton. Their ensemble will perform in concert on April 6th, at the Big Easy Café. Proceeds will go to purchasing books and to provide tutoring for children in grades K-12.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Neisha Walker, Literacy” Broadcast April 5, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program host, Vonte Leak interviews Neisha Kelly, Writer. Neisha shares about his love for reading and writing and his outreach work in the community teaching young people reading and writing skills to improve educational success and open up a world of possibilities for them. He also shares about the reading program he started at work.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Isles Youth Institute” Broadcast April 17, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Anita Wemple, spotlights the Isles Youth Institute, Trenton, New Jersey. Our host interviews Isles Youth Services Representatives, Stacy Heading, Ludovic Andre and Anthony Richards who share about Isles Youth Institute. With a less than 50% high school graduation rate among the youth population in the City of Trenton, Isles offers

out of school youth the opportunity to earn their GED, participate in job development and training programs, learn leadership skills, and participate in community service projects and mentoring programs. Isles Mission is “Self Reliance through Education” and our guests explain how the program’s primary focus is on student achievement and placement in post-secondary education, advanced vocational training, and career oriented jobs. Isles, encourages pride of community in their students through participation in a variety of service projects. This year they have partnered with the Trenton Thunder Field Program, and will renovate the West Trenton Little League Field in preparation of opening day.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Sprout University” Broadcast April 25, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Lisa Austin-Granville interviews Danielle Miller-Winrow, Founder of Sprout University. Danielle shares about the school geared for children from infancy through grade 9 that offers joyful, meaningful, and creative learning programs. Danielle shares how the school is dedicated to cultivating academics, character building, and performing arts through programs geared to prepare children for a lifetime of learning. She also shares about the dance elective, in which children will have the opportunity to perform in a Dance Competition in South Korea.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Mayor’s Summer Youth Employment Program” Broadcast April 26, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Michelle Thompcans, Director of the Mayor’s Summer Youth Employment Program and Aniya Warner, Youth Employment Program Participant. Ms. Thompcans shares about the Summer Youth Employment Program, now in its 4th year, which is collaboration between the Trenton Mayor’s Office, The Princeton Regional Chamber of Commerce, Rider University, and Mill Hill Child & Family Development. The program for Trenton Youth 16 – 21 years of age, offers them entry level summer employment with local non-profits, private businesses, or city government. Michelle discusses the job readiness training youth receive at Rider University prior to starting employment in July. The program focuses on resume writing, interviewing skills, giving and receiving feedback and presenting a professional image for success in the workplace. Aniya shares about her own personal experience as a participant in the 2018 program.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Trenton Public Schools” Broadcast May 1, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Tona Buck interviews Christina Clark, Trenton Public School District

Educator. Christina, a 35 year Educator in the Trenton Public School System shares about teaching in urban schools and the needs of the children in these communities. She also discusses the need for dedicated educators who care about every child and their family as well as the lack of basic teaching supplies like books, paper, school supplies and computers.

"Trenton Talks: Today's Topic – Update from the President of Mercer County Community College" Broadcast May 2, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Vennie Stansbury features an interview with Mercer County Community College President, Dr. Wang. Dr. Wang shares about Open Enrollment for Summer and Fall Classes, Non-traditional Degree Programs offered by the college, Certificate Programs, Athletic Programs, Scholarships, and the new MCCC, Trenton Campus.

"Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Isles Youth Institute GED Program" Broadcast May 29, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host DeNay Taliaferro interviews Stacy Heading, Program Director and Damir Johnson, Participant. Mr. Heading shares about Isles GED Program for youth 16-24 yrs. who have dropped out of high school and are committed to working for a better future for themselves and their families. Interested candidates come into the program as "Participants" and during the first 30 days of the program must prove they are driven, be able to work with others, and accept and understand authority. Those who make it through the first 30 days become "Students" and begin the process of preparing for the GED test and create a plan for their future. Students are supported through the process by Mentors. Damir shares his experiences as a student in the Program.

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Broadcast Intern, Vont Leek" Broadcast May 31, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Jacque's Trenton 365 Intern, Vont Leek. Vont shares about his internship experiences during his senior year of high school and his college plans. He also talks about participating in the Gentleman's Ball, his band, and his YouTube Channel.

"Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Summer Youth Program" Broadcast June 5, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Donna Wellans interviews Ramone Harper, Instructor who shares details about an exciting new summer program for Trenton, NJ youth ages 10 – 21 yrs.

The program sponsored by the African American Chamber of Commerce will focus on teaching youth how to create computer games, create apps for phones and computers, and learn about coding.

C. Quality of Life

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Funeral Services” Broadcast April 2, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Brenda Cusack features an interview with Deborah Vereen, Campbell Funeral Chapel. Ms. Vereen shares information on funeral arrangements including planning and paying for funeral services prior to death and benefit of having insurance to cover funeral costs. Also discussed is cremation vs. traditional burial.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Trenton Free Public Library” Broadcast April 4, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Patricia Hall and Rebecca Franco-Martin, Librarians with the Trenton Free Public Library. Our guests share about the Library and special programs available to Trenton residents, including children’s programs. They also provide information on how to obtain a library card, who qualifies for the card, and special library cards for NJ State Employees working in Trenton that eliminates the residency requirement.

“In the Public Interest – Tona Buck, Community Advocate” Broadcast April 11, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Vennie Stansbury features and interview with Tona Buck, Local Author, Motivational Speaker, Radio Personality, and Life Coach. Tona shares about herself, love of community and desire to help those who can’t help themselves. She is described by friends as a passionate motivational speaker who loves to help others. When there is a need, she jumps in to do something about it and has taken on many projects to empower the Trenton Community. Tona, a victim of childhood sexual abuse, recognized the undisclosed and under discussed issue of sexual abuse among the African-American Community and feels it is her responsibility to educate the community about this ever present issue. She shares about organizing Trenton’s first Sexual Assault Awareness Walk in 2018, and a bigger and better Walk for 2019, which takes place on April 13, at Cadwalader Park, Rain or Shine. Host and guest also discuss R.O.S.A., acronym for Rising Over Sexual Abuse, a non-profit organization Tona started to break the silence of sexual abuse. Lastly, our guest shares tips on how to discuss Sexual Abuse with children.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Spotlight on Donna Wellans” Broadcast April 17, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Donna Wellans, Single Mom, Actor, Playwright, Radio Host, and Christian. Donna shares about how writing, has helped her get through the difficulties life has thrown her way and what she has learned about herself through her writing, including learning to be honest with oneself, and sharing advice with others.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Free Mason, Aaron Lodge No.9” Broadcast April 18, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Steve Cooke, features an interview with Free Masons, Anthony Davis and Lewis Toval. Our guests share about the Free Masons and the 87 year history of the Aaron Lodge No. 9 in Princeton, NJ and its expansion to Hamilton, New Jersey. They also talk about the “Cornerstone Ceremony” that will take place on April 28, at the Hamilton lodge on 10 Rennie Street, Hamilton, NJ.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Gentleman’s Ball” Broadcast April 25, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Candace Gantt and Palmer Richardson, Co-Chairs of the Urban League Guild, Trenton Chapter, Gentleman’s Ball. Our guest share about the Ball which honors Outstanding Male African-American High School Seniors who have achieved academic success, are engaged in community outreach and active in their church and are well-rounded young men. They also share details about membership in the Urban League.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Purchasing Real Estate” Broadcast May 1, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Tona Buck interviews Trenton, NJ Real Estate Broker & Entrepreneur, Andre Williams. Andre shares tips for home ownership, purchasing properties to rent, as well as information on renovating and flipping properties. Our guest also explains the difference between personal credit and business credit.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – A Discussion on Race and Discrimination” Broadcast May 3, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Attorney and Fordham University Law Professor, Tanya Hernandez. Ms. Hernandez and our host discuss civil rights and race and discrimination as well as its impact on the community. Our guest also shares about a book of narratives she compiled of mixed race people.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Jacque Howard, Civically Engaged” Broadcast May 3, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Radio/TV host Jacque Howard about the latest projects he is working on. Jacque provides an update on the status of the Skate Park he was instrumental in bringing to Trenton and information on the skate programs for children, including the free boards for children with need. Jacque also shares about a Food Drive he is coordinating and the need for donations and volunteers.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Nubian News” Broadcast May 8, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Darleen McKnight features an interview with Kamau Kugrichagulia, Co-Founder of the Nubian News. Kamau shares about the paper founded in 1989 that has focused on African American and Latino businesses, leaders, activists and events affecting the African-American and Latino Communities. He also discusses advertising and sponsorship opportunities in the paper.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Haberdashery” Broadcast May 9, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Tona Buck interviews Trentonians, Terrin and Josh who share about being haberdashers and the accessories they fabricate for men. They also discuss men’s fashion and dressing up.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic: Safe Touches Only Please” Broadcast May 9, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Vennie Stansbury features an interview with Author and Community Activist, Tona Buck who shares about her new children’s book, “STOP, Safe Touches Only Please”. The book teaches children about the difference between safe and inappropriate touching, and how to talk about and report inappropriate touching. She plans on distributing 400 books to children in the Trenton Area and is looking for sponsors to support the free distribution of the books.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Mother’s Day” Broadcast May 15, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Karen Rogers features a discussion with Co-Host Vennie Stansbury about Mother’s Day celebrations and the many ways to honor our mom’s on Mother’s Day. Generally a day of happiness, our co-hosts discuss how this special day can be a day of sadness for

those who perhaps were not blessed with children, have lost children, or are empty nesters. They shared their thoughts on how to make it a happy, positive day, by doing something good for someone else who is having a difficult time.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Bridging Gaps Inc.” Broadcast May 16, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Jacque Howard interviews Keara Molder, Executive Director of Bridging Gaps, Inc. Keara and Jacque discuss the work Keara is doing with young people through the non-profit Bridging Gaps, Inc. and particularly the Youth Summit. This year’s Summit will focus on tools for empowerment; such as Self-Love, Self-Care, Financial Literacy, Overcoming Bullying, Building Relationships and much more.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Community Outreach, Ms. Sara Dash” Broadcast May 17, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features a discussion with Ms. Sara Dash, famed Jazz Vocalist. Ms. Dash, the daughter of a Trenton, NJ Minister, learned at an early age what it meant to give back to your community. Following her storied career, Sara returned to her Trenton home and has immersed herself in community action work. She and our host discuss the many projects she is involved with including Mayor’s Committee for a Better Trenton, running a community food pantry, and working with children at the Sprout U School of the Arts.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Mercer County” Broadcast May 23, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Jerrell Blakely interviews Kim Cody, Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Mercer County. Kim shares about this non-profit organization which is the largest volunteer supported mentoring network in the nation. The Mercer County Chapter was founded in 1973 and continues to mentor children ages 6-18 yrs. Children are matched 1-1 with an adult mentor in order to develop a positive relationship that sees positive influences over a lifetime. Kim also shares about some of the “little” activities children and their mentors participate in such as, visiting a park, a trip to a museum, playing catch, and reading together.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Urban Agriculture, Isles Inc.” Broadcast May 29, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by DeNay Taliaferro spotlights Isles Inc. Urban Agriculture Program. Guests, Andre Thomas, Sr. Training Manager and Justin Allen, Urban Agriculture Coordinator share about Isles commitment to support community gardens across the

City of Trenton by providing technical and organizational assistance to residents and community based organizations. Our guests discuss how these community gardens play a vital role in assisting families to meet their food needs by providing fresh and nutritional foods at low cost with the added benefit of exercise, and opportunity to build community relationships. They also share about the School Gardening and Youth Education Program which works with students and teachers in over twenty schools in the Trenton area providing gardening education and cooking workshops for kids and their families.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Mercer County Senior Pageant” Broadcast May 30, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Neisha Kelly interviews Veronica Davis, 2018 -2019 Mercer County Senior Queen who shares about the competition and how she prepared for it. She also talks about the wonderful people she has met as Senior Queen and her plans to start a non-profit to assist senior citizens.

“Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Improving Water Quality, Kel-Tran” Broadcast May 31, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affair program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Kel-Tran Owners, Tom and Sean Barry. With growing concerns over lead levels and contaminates in drinking water, our guests from Kel-Tran share about what the company offers to improve the quality of the water in your home. They share about private wells, filtration, water levels, and testing water quality. They also share about the differences between whole house filtration systems and tap filtration systems.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Urban Gardens/Taste of Trenton/Stork Nest” Broadcast June 7, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard spotlights three different local programs. Jacque’s first guest, Kelly Strykarz is a gardener engaged in teaching City of Trenton residents about Urban Gardening. Kelly shares about the many ways of gardening in a City where land space is limited. She discusses roof gardens, small plot gardens, as well as a window box garden and the health benefits of growing your own vegetables and fruits (21 min). Jacque’s second guest is Bernard McMullen, Coordinator of the Taste of Trenton event. Mr. McMullan shares details of the event, the different types of restaurants that will be participating. Additional information is available at www.tasteoftrenton.com (11 min). Closing the show is Jacque’s interview with Melva Moore, and Rosina Pernall, members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority who share about their partnership with Mercer Street Friends and the March of Dimes to promote Stork Nest

in Trenton. Stork Nest is a program for pregnant women that promotes prenatal care and encourages healthy behavior during pregnancy through incentives and education. (28 min).

"Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest - Father's Day" Broadcast June 12, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, Co-Hosts Vennie Stansbury and Karen Rogers discuss the importance of honoring Father's on Father's Day and explore a Father's role in teaching their boys how to become good men and fathers. They also discuss the need for good men to step forward to mentor boys that do not have fathers in their lives and share about the many local organizations providing mentoring. They also discuss the role of a Father as conveyed in the Bible.

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Farewell to Vont" Broadcast June 14, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program brings together Hosts Jacque Howard and Vennie Stansbury and Intern Vont Leek in his last broadcast as an Intern before he leaves for college. Our hosts share about this young man who came to them 10 months ago and discuss his professional growth and stand out moments of his internship. Jacque talks about some of the great video work Vont did of the Skate Park in Trenton and at Passage Theater as standout pieces for his portfolio. Vont reminisces about his experiences as Jacque and Vennie's intern, serious moments and some of the very funny things that happened and expresses his extreme gratitude for the opportunity. Vont's dream is to host his own TV talk show.

"Trenton Talks: Today's Topic – Youth Enrichment Programs" Broadcast June 27, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Karen Hernandez-Granzen interviews Markia Francis and Miesha, Trenton, NJ residents involved in local youth enrichment programs. Our host and guests discuss the benefits of keeping our young people involved in positive activities during the summer months and the negatives of having too much unsupervised free time. Markia and Miesha share details about the programs they will be supervising this summer in the City of Trenton.

This event will provide an opportunity for homeless and low income individuals and families to get a hot meal, clothing, toiletries, and non-perishable food items as well as provide free counseling, medical and dental screenings.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest - Concerned Pastors/Connection to God”

Broadcast April 24, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this two part episode, our host interviews Pastor Harris of Galilee Baptist Church and member of Trenton’s Concerned Pastors of Trenton, NJ. Concerned Pastors is an organization of clergy striving to build a church without walls. The group is involved in community initiatives that work toward a better Trenton through improved social and living conditions in the Trenton, NJ area. Pastor Harris has been pastoring for 30 years, and shares about some of the things the Concerned Pastors are working on including involvement with Trenton’s search for a new Police Director and cleaning up the City.

Joining out host for Part 2 of this episode is Gwendolyn Howell, Author of “Connection to God”. Gwendolyn and our host discuss this book which was written to help people connect with God and stay connected to him through prayer. Our guest shares about prayer, what it is and what it can be to each person, as well as the importance of incorporating prayer into our daily lives.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest – Princeton Deliverance Center” Broadcast June 19, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Brenda Cusack features interviews with Pastor Rose Bradley and Evangelist Angelina Vargas of Princeton Deliverance Center. Pastor Rose and Evangelist Vargas share about their ministry, church services, prayer groups and most importantly the church’s food bank which feeds over 1900 adults and children monthly. Pastor Rose is humbled by the support of community neighbors and local churches who come together to assist with the food bank.

During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Brenda Cusack interviews Pastor Rupert Hall of Turning Point Methodist Church. He shares about his church founded in 2008 by the merger of two United Methodist congregations in Trenton, First United Methodist and St. Paul’s

First United Methodist came into existence in 1771, five years before the Declaration of Independence by the American Colonies and is the first United Methodist Church founded in New Jersey and the third in the U.S. The name “Turning Point” was selected to reflect the rich history of the City of Trenton, and the role the “Battle of Trenton” played during the American Revolution which was seen as a “Turning Point” of the War. Pastor Rupert also shares about Church Services, Bible Study, and Noon Services on Wednesdays as well as church outreach programs that feed the body, mind and spirit.

“Trenton Talks: Today’s Topic – Gospel Choirs” Broadcast June 20, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Zach Williams, Musician, Conductor and Choir Director. Host and guest discuss the elements that make a good choir a great choir. They also discuss the choirs of Milton Bronson, James Cleveland, Wilmington Mass, and Professor Craig’s United Voices.

Broadcast April 18, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Crystal Feliciano interviews Trenton Mayor Reed Gusciora, who provides an update on the status of road repairs in the City of Trenton, summer youth programs as well as summer job programs and some of the important topics he may discuss in his October 2019 State of the City Address.

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Trenton Water Works, Lead Line Replacement

Program" Broadcast May 17, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Trenton Water Works Representatives, Sandra Kutting and Kristin Epstein who provide an update on the \$15 million capital project to replace lead and galvanized steel water-service lines in the Trenton system. Our guests provided information on how to determine if you home is connected to water service by a lead or galvanized steel pipe and explained that galvanized steel also contains lead. They strongly recommend checking if you live in a home built prior to 1988, as during this time period it was customary to use lead and galvanized steel pipe. Our guests also provided contact information of having water tested for lead and tips for reducing your exposure. They also addressed reasons why it took the City so long to begin the replacement program.

"Trenton Talks: Today's Topic – Trenton Mayor Reed Gusciora – Update on City

Budget" Broadcast May 23, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Crystal Feliciano interviews Trenton, NJ Mayor, Reed Gusciora. Mayor Gusciora provides an update on the fight over his

proposed budget that would increase City property taxes by 11 cents on every \$100 of assessed value. Trenton relies heavily on State Aid to fund its \$208 million dollar budget. The State has approved the Mayor's Budget and advised him he has until June 8th to get his budget passed or risk losing State Aid. The fight continues in Council. The Mayor also provided information on Trenton Water Lead Levels, and the line replacement program.

"Trenton Talks: Trenton 365 – Ameani SaBabu, Community Activist" Broadcast May 24, 11:30 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Jacque Howard features an interview with Community Activist, Ameani SaBabu. Ms. SaBabu was born and raised in Trenton, New Jersey and has witnessed first-hand the downward spiral of the City of Trenton over the last decade. She discusses the Community Outreach projects she is involved with that she believes will heal the City from racism, hatred, violence and self-destruction. Ms. SaBabu is also the creator of Trenton's Buy Black event.

"Trenton Talks: Today's Topic – 2020 Census" Broadcast June 6, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host KoKo interviews NJ State 15th District Assemblywoman, Verlina Jackson. Assemblywoman Jackson, shares details on the 2020 Census and the importance of participation in the Census. The U.S. Census began in 1790 and takes place every 10 years on a year ending in "0". She shares about the importance of the collection of Census Data and provides examples of what the data is used to determine, such as the number of U.S. House of Representatives, Congressional and State Legislative Districts, School and Voting Districts as well as aiding in the annual distribution of \$675 billion dollars in Federal Funding. Assemblywoman Jackson also shared that the personal data collected during the Census is protected by Federal Law and is not shared with any other entity.

"Trenton Talks: Today's Topic – Update from Trenton Mayor Reed Gusciora" Broadcast June 20, 11:00 PM; Duration 30 minutes. This episode of our locally produced public affairs program hosted by Vennie Stansbury features an interview with Trenton Mayor, Reed Gusciora. Our host and Mayor Gusciora discuss Trenton's Art All Night event which took place on June 15 and 16th. The Mayor also shared about completion of the new Trenton High School building which will open in September for the 2019-2020 school year and include a pool, AstroTurf football field, and a Vo-Tech School. The Mayor also provided information on renovations to some of the oldest firehouses in the City, appointment of new Fire and Police Commissioners, and the Neighborhood Improvement Authority Clean-up and rewards for reporting illegal dumping. Finally, the

Mayor spoke about a two million dollar grant received from the state to renovate city recreation centers.

“Trenton Talks: In the Public Interest - Community Activists Darren “Freedom” Green and Jacque Howard” Broadcast June 26, 11:00 PM; Duration 60 minutes. During this episode of our locally produced public affairs program, host Vennie Stansbury interviews Community Activists Darren “Freedom” Green and Jacque Howard.
