### **WHO-TV FIRST ALERT WEATHER FAX**

Every weekday Monday through Friday WHO-TV distributes approximately 400 documents via Fax with Weather Alerts. This information pertains to the Central Iowa Viewing Area. Late afternoon each Sunday through Thursday weather information is gathered and migrated into a standardized form. This form includes a 2 to 3 day forecast, a written Weather Summary, Almanac history and National Travel information. The faxes are sent to a consistently updated database of area business, area hotels, private citizens, schools and government agencies.

### **WHO-TV WEATHER INFORMATION, AMBER ALERTS AND SCHOOL CLOSURES**

WHO-TV extends its internet information distribution by distributing various Breaking News, School Closings, Weather, Stocks, Sports and Local Entertainment via E-Mail to area subscribers.

### **WHO-TV EXPANDS REACH OF CORE PRINCIPALS WITH SUB CHANNELS: WEATHER PLUS & ANTENNA TV**

Weather Plus: WHO-TV uses sub channel 13.2 for Weather Plus a 24/7 weather channel using locally created weather information. WHO-TV meteorologists record weather updates of several minutes in duration and create a hourly wheel of weather information that includes 'real time' images from our local Mega Doppler Radar, local, regional; and national weather maps. WHO-TV also partners with Iowa Sports Connection to produce Off the Tee and Friday Night Lights which provide local sports scores and information. These programs run from one to four hours in durations on a seasonal and weekly schedule. Weather Plus fully complies with FCC Children's Programming requirements. WHO-TV also repurposes PowerHouse and other syndicated programming on an irregular basis. This platform also supports all WHO-TV community event and news content initiatives with ongoing promotional announcements and Public Service Announcements.

Antenna TV: Provided by Tribune Broadcasting uses sub channel 13.3 to provide standard definition repeats of classic programming. Antenna TV fully complies with FCC Children's Programming requirements. This platform also supports all WHO-TV community event and news content initiatives with ongoing promotional announcements and Public Service Announcements.

**ANIMAL RESCUE** Saturdays 7

Syndicated program, that also qualifies and E/I Educational and Informational, which focuses on education and interaction between humans and pets for the edification of children 13 to 16 years of age. This show prepares viewers for the challenges of different animals and different lifestyles that impact those choosing and raising pets.

Missing is a weekly half-hour series focusing attention on the plight of missing children.

**BIZ KIDS** Saturdays 8:30

The E/I series, “State to State”, travels to every entertaining nook and cranny of America. The hectic dazzle of the Big Apple. The rawhide spirit of Wyoming. The revival of St. Louis. The innovation of Silicon Valley. The Music of New Orleans and Austin. The Vegas Glitz. The LA Glamour. The highest peaks. The driest deserts. The biggest events. And the hidden gems. This E/I series, “Family Style with Chef Jeff” features award – winning chef and motivational speaker, Jeff Henderson, as he teaches viewers how making the right choices in the kitchen can lead to life-changing experiences for the entire family.

### **ON THE SPOT Saturday 11**

This E/I series puts everyday people on the spot by asking them questions they should know the answers to, but often don’t. The show’s questions vary by subject. The show is produced to be both entertaining and educational.

### **WHO-HD CHILDREN’S NON-BROADCAST EFFORTS AND SPECIAL PROJECTS WITH EDUCATIONAL AND INFORMATION VALUE FOR CHILDREN**

CHANNEL 13 WEATHER LAB AT THE SCIENCE CENTER OF IOWA Each weekday, children from all over central Iowa interact with WHO-DT Meteorologists at our satellite interactive weather studio located at the Science Center of Iowa. Each Monday and Thursday during the quarter, our meteorologists conduct a 30 minute interactive presentation called “Storm School” for children 14 and under. Not only are there discussions about weather, but also television production and the magic “green screen” plus children see our live weather broadcasts at noon each day and receive educational weather handouts.

THE GOLDEN APPLE AWARD Each month during the school year, WHO-DT and a corporate partner honor one teacher in our viewing area that goes beyond the call of duty. Nominations are taken from letters written by children at the school that think their teacher should be recognized. Then on the last Monday of the month, we visit the school and surprise our deserving teacher with the honor at a school assembly. It teaches children appreciation of all teachers and motivates other teachers to aspire to achieve the same recognition from their students.

#### NATIONAL BALLOON CLASSIC

This annual 8-day event is geared directly to families and secondarily to children. The event has great entertainment value but also deals with the physics of what makes hot air balloons fly. Patrons are allowed up-close to talk with pilots as they fill their balloons first with cold air and then hot air. There are also many children's activities that take place each day of the event.

#### WORLD FOOD AND MUSIC FESTIVAL

This 3 day event in the heart of Des Moines focusses on educating and celebrating every culture in our community through food and music. In 2015, more than 120,000 Iowans...including thousands of families...took part in children's entertainment and educational activities.

#### CHILDREN'S INTERNET SAFETY

WHOTV.com made available a free, downloadable Internet safety eBook, Growing Up Online, containing a unique learning tool that provides parents and teachers important information to help initiate conversation with children about online safety. With half of all kids under the age of eight using Internet connected devices, and one in three children cyber-bullied, it is more critical than ever to educate kids on using technology safely. Growing Up Online is a media-rich eBook that provides easy-to-use content on navigating the digital world in an engaging way and was available as a free download for a variety of tablet devices in both English and Spanish.

Dear Affiliate Partner:

To assist you in complying with the reporting requirements for children's television and the requirement that stations air "core" children's programming, we are providing you with episode-specific descriptions (the '**NBC Kids**' educational and informational programming block) as set forth in the attached Community Relations Quarterly Children's Programming Report for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2016. The report includes information to help prepare FCC Form 398. Please note that we have not included the specific dates and times for each of the programs as that may be station-specific.

This report is divided into the following categories:

1. Educational Objectives & Show Summaries: NBC Kids for both 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2016 and 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2016.

2. Core programming: Regularly scheduled programming furnished by the NBC Network that is specifically designed to serve the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under. Each of these programs is identified on-air as educational and informational with the "E/I" icon, and is similarly identified to the national listing services. To assist stations with the preemption report section of FCC Form 398, we have added specific episode numbers. Please note that the age target for NBC Kids programming is identified as 2-5 years old.

3. Other programming: Programming furnished by the NBC Network that contributes to the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under, but is not specifically designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children.

4. Public service announcements targeted to children 16 and under.

5. Non-broadcast efforts that enhance the educational and informational value of NBC Network programming to children.

The regularly-scheduled children's programming and promotional content furnished to you by the NBC Network during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2016 complied with the commercial limits of the Children's Television Act, and 47 C.F.R. §§ 73.670(a)-(d), provided that you broadcast and distributed such programming as furnished to you by NBC, and did not add any promotional or advertising content thereto other than as directed by NBC via weekly postings on APT.

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*Note Regarding FCC's Video Description Rules:* The programs supplied in the NBC Kids block are video-described to provide a better viewing experience for blind or visually impaired children. *Under the FCC's video description rules that became effective on July 1, 2015, full-power affiliates of the ABC, CBS, Fox and NBC networks that are located in the top 60 television markets must provide 50 hours per calendar quarter of video-described programming during prime time or in children's programming. A video described program may be counted toward the 50 hours when it is originally aired and on one re-airing. Although much of the programming aired with video description is likely to be newly produced, stations may count any program they are airing for the first or second time with video description after the effective date, even if the program aired on that station without video description prior to the effective date. Similarly, a station may count programming toward its 50-hour obligation even if that programming has aired elsewhere with video description, as long as it is airing with description for the first or second time on that station.*

**EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES and SHOW SUMMARIES**  
**[AGE TARGET 2-5]**  
**July 2, 2016 – September 24, 2016**

In compliance with the Children's Television Act regulations that became effective January 2, 1997, the **NBC Kids** programming block features an on-air icon (E/I) indicating that each program is "educational and informational" for children. **This icon is displayed throughout each program.** Also, in compliance with the regulations, the following document, which includes "early educational and informational" objectives of **NBC Kids**, must be placed in your public file.

The **NBC Kids** programming block also meets the requirements for video-described content, as established by the Twenty-first Century Communications and Video Accessibility Act, effective October 8, 2010. Full-power affiliates of NBC that are located in the 25 television markets with the largest number of television households must provide video-described content at any time they are providing children's programming. Each episode of content can be aired no more than twice in the calendar year.

Each of the programs listed below, which make up the three-hour **NBC Kids** programming block, is specifically designed to serve the early educational and informational needs of children ages 2-5. All of the programs have educational objectives and messages that are core to the content and appropriate for the program genre.

On July 2, 2016, NBC Kids aired six shows returning from the previous quarter: **Floogals, Nina's World, Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave, Astroblast, Chica Show, and Noodle and Doodle.** On July 9, 2016, **Astroblast** left the schedule, and a new show, **Terrific Trucks**, made its premiere and remained on the schedule with the five other shows until September 24, 2016, the last Saturday of the quarter.

**Floogals** is an animated show starring three space aliens--Fleeker, Flo, and Boomer--who have been sent to earth to explore, investigate, discover and report their findings to their superiors at Floogal headquarters. The diminutive Floogals are no taller than a large safety pin and their visual perspective is literally the point of view of the show. With the multiple challenges of their size and ignorance of all things Hooman (AKA humans), the Floogals have a lot of work on their hands. They are engaged in the dual processes of discovery and problem-solving, as nothing on earth is familiar to them. Much like young children, they begin by encountering something new and then go through a comedic multi-step process of watching, listening, touching and note-taking until they've figured out the meaning and purpose of what they discovered. They also comprehend how their discovery fits into the Hooman universe.

**Nina's World** is an animated show based on a six-year-old Latina, who lives in San Antonio, Texas with her parents, who own the local bakery, and her Abuela (grandmother). Her Tio (Uncle) Javier lives nearby and there are lots of children and adults from several different cultures in the apartment complex and neighborhood where she lives. Nina's best friend is Star, a stuffed starfish pillow character brought to life by Nina's imagination. Each episode features Nina taking on a challenge, solving a problem, or finding a way to help others. She is very confident about her abilities, which sometimes gets her into trouble. However, with encouragement and chiding from Abuela, Nina learns about how to plan her "work," take responsibility for her actions, and correct her mistakes.

**Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave (RRTD)** is an animated show that puts an emphasis on logical thinking and the use of language through fun problem-solving adventures. The trio, **RRTD**, is guided by Hatty, an erudite hamster who wears a hat full of questions. The three characters agree that they would like to take a particular adventure and rev up their Roly-pods, enter the Spin-Again transport vehicle, and arrive at their destination. Once there, Hatty challenges them to make decisions and choose options that will lead to success or failure with their quest. Once their mission is complete, they review their effort, assemble the Roly-Pods, and head home. Their adventures are varied. They might go climb a mountain, design their own fairy tale, or build a sand castle.

**Astroblast**, based on the book series by author and illustrator Bob Kolar, is set on a space station in an unknown solar system. Five animal characters and one three-eyed octopus of unknown derivation populate the station. Each episode begins with an everyday conversation or incident that grows into a predicament needing a solution. While these predicaments take place in a fantasy environment, the issues and resolutions resonate for a preschool audience. Through comedy and zippy action, our target audience sees how the characters learn lessons for practical living such as how to keep track of things that belong to you, practice good habits, clean up when you've made a mess, rebound from a failure or an embarrassing incident, or resist the urge to blame others for your mistakes.

**Chica Show** features a five-year-old "baby" chick that spends her days with her parents in their costume shop, the Coop. The shop's one employee, Kelly, doubles as Chica's

nanny and the ensemble is rounded out with Bunji, a large floppy-eared rabbit, and Stitches, a straw mannequin that sits in the window. In each episode, Chica develops or encounters a problem that she cannot immediately resolve. Usually her issues involve impulse control, distractibility, judgment, and inter-personal behaviors. She and Kelly usually work on the problem through an adventure—a fantasy transformation to animation— where Bunji and Stitches come alive and join Chica and Kelly for the problem-solving process. The core educational content is primarily socio-emotional development as Chica learns how to express herself properly, think before she acts, and interact with others effectively. She often learns that it takes hard work and practice to become proficient at different skills.

**Noodle and Doodle**, an instructional series, features creative expression through art and cooking projects around a specific theme. Host, Sean, drives around in a double-decker bus fully equipped with art supplies and a kitchen, ready for any assignment. The projects encourage parent engagement and often feature families working together to make something to display within the child’s home. Sean’s sidekick, Doggity, is an ever-faithful beagle who transforms into an animated character during interstitial trips to a parallel universe, set in a kitchen full of prank-playing animated characters. The art projects typically promote utilizing recycled materials in order to demonstrate that creativity can transform something intended for one purpose into something that achieves a completely different goal.

**Terrific Trucks** is a live-action series that follows the exploits of five self-driving, heavy-duty construction trucks. They include Tork, the dump truck, Stotz, the flatbed, Dug, the digger, Blinker, the mini-digger, and Sparky, the front-end loader. The trucks reside in a fully-equipped truck yard/rock quarry and work as a team on various building projects that require planning, collaboration and implementation. Each truck brings specific skills and a distinct personality to the group. They get challenging job assignments from Mr. Bill Board, a digital outdoor screen that outlines and diagrams the problem to be solved. By allocating the role each truck will perform during the project, the group merges those unique skills to fulfill their respective assignments. Unexpected problems that could compromise their success-- such as the weather, broken truck parts, or personal conflicts between the trucks--- are addressed and overcome so the job can be completed.

**FLOOGALS**

**PROJECT DUSTING [EFGL114DH]**

While cleaning the space ship, the Floogals overhear Mom Hooman telling Boy Hooman to dust and see her hand him a fluffy thing on a stick. Boy Hooman sneezes while doing his chores and leaves to get a tissue. While investigating, the Floogals notice they’ve left Floogal boot prints in the dust all over the shelves. Figuring out that boot prints might lead to their discovery, they figure out how to use a Floogal-size piece of the duster and Fleeker’s Fizzer to remove them. After noticing how clean everything is once they’ve removed their footprints, they determine that dusting is the removal of tiny particles of dirt and that some of that dust must have gotten up Boy Boomer’s nose and made him sneeze. When Mom Hooman returns, she notes that all of the furniture in the entire house is clean and praises Boy Hooman for a job well done. He is confused because he knows he didn’t dust, and after initially trying to correct her, he winds up taking the credit.

**[Educational Message: Dust is made of tiny particles of dirt, which float in the air and settle on objects around us. It can also get in your nose and make you sneeze. Dusting is the removal of those particles so that things look nice and clean. Removing dust also insures that it can’t make you sneeze.]**

**PROJECT CLAY [EFGL114DH]**

The Floogals encounter a blob on the Hooman’s table that smells like the ground outside. They test to see if it is gum or a rock, but these theories are ruled out. They observe that it is cold and that, when the clay wheel is spinning, the blob changes shape. Boomer happens upon a number of frozen figures that are made of the same material as the soft blob. Flo concludes that the soft blob, when pushed and molded, turns into the frozen figures. After accidentally smashing one of the figures, Fleeker makes his own figure. Girl Hooman loves Fleekers masterpiece.

**[Educational Message: Clay is a natural material made of tiny particles of rock. When a shapeless blob of clay is molded it can become a statue, a piece of pottery, or any of a number of other great items.]**

#### **NINA DOG-SITS [ENNW114DH]**

Nina learns the hard way that a lot more work is involved in taking care of a dog. **[Educational Message: Taking care of pets is a big responsibility. Different pets require varying levels of care; it takes more work to care for dogs than goldfish.]**

#### **NINA GETS ON TRACK [ENNW114DH]**

Nina and Abuelita are the first ones at the railroad exhibit at the library. Mr. Lambert has constructed an elaborate model train set including a city with bridges, tunnels and stores. He tells Nina that she can be the engineer while he shows Abuelita a new book. He gives her instructions and admonishes her to be very careful and proceed cautiously. She ignores his instructions and goes "full speed ahead." The train crashes, goes off the tracks, scratches one of the cows he painted, and breaks his favorite engine. She apologizes and offers to help with repairs. With Mr. Lambert's model train repair kit and Nina's painting skills, they are able to fix the train before other people arrive to see the exhibit. When Mr. Lambert allows Nina to have another turn at the controls, she promises to go much slower.

**[Educational Message: Model trains are fun to collect and exhibit, with buildings and tunnels and even trees. Certain rules are made to keep people and things safe from harm; you should always listen when given instructions.]**

### **RUFF-RUFF, TWEET AND DAVE**

#### **A FAIRY TALE ADVENTURE [ERTDR101DH]**

Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave wake up and tell Hatty what kind of stories they each like best. When Hatty asks what kind of adventure they will have, they yell excitedly, suggesting that he ask the hat. Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave wake up excited to know what kind of adventure they are going on that day. The hat reveals that they are going on a bouncy adventure. They board the Spin-Again and arrive in Bouncy Land. While there, they play games in which they find out who can jump the highest, find the bounciest thing, and that sand makes objects less bouncy. When Hatty's hat gets stuck in a tree, they choose the bounciest thing, which is a Bouncy House, to get it down.

**[Educational Message: Bouncing is when a person or an object goes up and down. Some objects (like a ball) bounce better than others (like a rock).]**

**GROWING CRAZY [EATBR101DH]**

Comet eagerly volunteers to plant-sit Zorky while Sputnik goes on an errand for a couple of days. Due to his excitement, he fails to write down the directions Sputnik gives him. However, when he compares his homemade gift to the gifts his friends bought, he starts to doubt if his gift is good enough. Comet creates new presents based on what his friends used in theirs, but fails. He then combines all the features of his friends' gifts to create the perfect gift. When he shows Sputnik her gift: a Super-Rain-Sparkle-Glitter-Plant-Music-Balloon, Sputnik is hesitant, but tells Comet she likes it. While showing her present, the balloon pops and goes zooming through the air to the ground. Comet is upset, but Sputnik says she enjoyed her present and their friendship is the only present she needs. Comet is still upset, but remembers the bookmark he made and gives it to Sputnik, who loves it.

**[Educational Message: The best gifts come from the heart; whether they are purchased or handmade is not important.]**

**CAPTAIN CHICA REDCOMB [ETCSR101DH]**

Billy comes to the shop for a pirate's hat. Chica then pretends to be a pirate with one of the Coop's costume hats. Though she is reminded frequently to put the pirate hat where it belongs, Chica misplaces it. When Billy returns to get five more hats, Kelly finds she is missing one hat from the order. After the store closes, Chica and Kelly go on their fantasy adventure to an island where they meet pirate, Captain Stitches. Kelly reminds them that they wouldn't have to go through so much trouble to find things if they put them where they belong; but, if they can't find it they should retrace their steps. Chica finally remembers she dropped the hat next to Bunji's cage. As they close the store, Kelly packs the hat to take to Billy's birthday party.

**[Educational Message: You should always put things back where they belong so they do not get lost. If not, you will have to retrace your steps to remember where you left it.]**

### **THE AMAZING CHICADINI [ETCSR101DH]**

Though Chica shows talent for becoming a magician, she gets so nervous and frightened during rehearsals for her magic show that she cannot perform at all. When the store closes, Chica and Kelly create a magic show right in the store. Chica performs her first trick well, but her second trick (turning Bunji into a daffodil) doesn't work. They move on to Chica's magic trick to make Stitches disappear, and it fails too. Kelly tells her to just have confidence and believe in herself. Chica tries again and Stitches disappears. Then, she makes him reappear. The audience is very pleased.

**[Educational Message: It takes practice and a belief in your competence to overcome being nervous.]**

#### **LET'S FLY A KITE-AIRLINE PILOTS [ENADR101DH]**

Ben, Ryan and Kayla try to play together on a windy day. They brainstorm projects to accommodate the windy weather. Sean and Noodle make Tuna Toastie Kites by recycling the bread bag for the craft project. Meanwhile, the kids collect sticks and leaves and join Sean to make kites using the recycled products, items from nature, and contact paper. The kids take their kites to the park along with their Tuna Toasties and make the most of the windy day.

**[Educational Message: When it is windy outside, you can find objects outside and in your recycling bin to make kites.]**

#### **ART-TASTIC-PAINTERS [ENADR101DH]**

Avery, Ian and Elena want to color but only have little pieces of crayons left. They begin by brainstorming ways to repurpose and use the old crayons. Sean and Noodle then melt the old crayon pieces into new multi-colored crayons in the kitchen. They also recycle the lids of the non-stick spray to make a leaf wreath, using the new crayons for leaf rubbings. The kids hang up the wreath and take the new crayons to finish their artwork.

**[Educational Message: You can reuse your old broken crayons to make new ones in order to recycle and prevent waste.]**

**[Educational Message: Just because something is old, doesn't mean it has no value. When recycling you have to carefully decide what should be discarded and what you can re-purpose.]**

Blinker is excited about the arrival of a new attachment. Tork tells her she needs to learn how to use it safely first, but Blinker thinks she can use her new bucket without a tutorial. Digby arrives to give her instruction, but Blinker refuses his help. The team's assignment is to install new light rigs. Blinker is disappointed that Digby and Dug will be doing the digging and lifting. Ignoring Tork and Digby's advice, Blinker tries to dig a hole on her own and discovers she actually does need help learning how to use the new attachment. With Digby's assistance, Blinker is able to gain proficiency and help with the light installation.

**[Educational Message: While being enthusiastic and confident when learning to use new gear is a good thing, it's important to learn proper use and safety. You will do a much better job after you learn how to use things efficiently.]**

**[Educational Message: Robots are human-like machines that get their energy from batteries. They can do all sorts of things. Even though robots are machines, they make great toys.]**

### **PROJECT CATERPILLAR [EFGL115DH]**

The Floogals are in the garden shed to check out some creatures called “caterpillars” that the Hoomans made a home for a few days back. They observe some pod-like things, a dark leaf, and also see that the leaves are all munched up. They wonder where the caterpillars went and how these new, mysterious objects got into the box. They decide to observe the box until they see how things are getting in and out. They leave Flo’s goggles to film the box for five days and, when they return, they see the winged creatures. They watch the footage of the box and conclude that the caterpillars didn’t disappear; they turned into the winged creatures, which the Hoomans call “butterflies.”

**[Educational Message: Caterpillars start their metamorphosis by eating lots of leaves to store up energy. Then, they make themselves a cocoon and, finally, they turn into butterflies.]**

When Nina has trouble learning the steps, Abuelita tells her “the rhythm of the sound” guides her feet and her spirit. Nico, who is hearing-impaired, teaches her how he “feels” the music. Following their instructions and responding to their encouragement, Nina is able to dance very well. Then she wants to dance and dance some more!

**[Educational Message: There are different ways to learn to dance. You can count the steps and you can keep up by learning to “feel” the music and move in time to the beat. People with hearing impairment feel vibrations to help them with things they cannot hear. ]**

#### **NINA BAKES BREAD [ENNW115DH]**

When Nina and Chelsea get competitive while helping Papi bake Conchas in the bakery, Papi splits up the dough so they can each make their own special version. Chelsea adds her favorite snack food, raisins. Nina is disappointed she can’t show Chelsea how to follow the Conchas recipe, but Papi tells her each baker adds their particular touch to the mix. After some consideration, Nina decides to add spicy chilies and sweet chocolate. Then she and Chelsea make their own individual colored toppings. Nina shows Chelsea what to do with them. While they wait for the Conchas to bake, they play a game in the courtyard with Abuelita. That makes the waiting time go faster. Nina loves Chelsea’s raisin Conchas. Mami, Papi and Abuelita think Nina’s chocolate chili Conchas are perfect, but they’re a bit too spicy for Chelsea.

**[Educational Message: Recipes give you the prescribed amounts of ingredients required to make a dish, but adding a little something special of your own can make it different and uniquely yours.]**

Hatty tells them that they can use their five senses to help them find their friends during the game. They also use their five senses to help Hatty find his hat.

**[Educational Message: If something goes missing, you can use your five senses (hearing, seeing, smelling, touching, and tasting) to help you find it.]**

#### **A SINGING ADVENTURE [ERTDR102DH]**

Tweet wakes up singing a pretty song. The hat reveals that they are going on a singing adventure, and Tweet is excited. They board the Spin-Again and arrive in Music Land where everything makes music. Tweet wants to find a band that she can sing with. They explore high sounds and low sounds and assemble a band composed of Dave playing the drums, Tweet playing a bell, and Ruff-Ruff playing some musical pads on the ground.

**[Educational Message: When singing, you can produce many different notes, high or low. You can also join a musical group composed of your friends playing different instruments, so you can all make music together.]**

### **CHICA SHOW**

#### **CHICA ROCKS [ETCSR102DH]**

A customer comes into the store because she is practicing for a rock 'n roll talent show and wants the blonde and hot pink wig that Chica is wearing. Chica wants to play an instrument too, but she is frustrated because it takes practice just to learn the beat.

During the fantasy segment, Chica and Kelly are on a concert stage with Stitches. Bunji, the band manager, offers to help them if they practice. Together they work on their piano, guitar, and percussion skills until their performance is really great. Upon their return, Chica immediately gets to practice and seems to have mastered the beat.

**[Educational Message: In order to get better at something or to develop your talent, you must take the time to practice.]**

#### **CHICA TWINKLE TOES [ETCSR102DH]**

Sandra comes into the store for a tutu to wear for her ballet recital. A beautiful tutu emerges from the dress-up rack when Chica pushes it out where Sandra can see it. After Sandra demonstrates a pirouette, Chica wants to be a ballerina. She tries to skip the preparation and go straight to a pirouette but discovers you have to practice to be

proficient. When Kelly and Chica go on their fantasy adventure, Bunji becomes the dance instructor and Chica practices the pirouette but it turns out to be the “wing and spin,” a new ballet movement. Back at the Coop, Kelly and Chica continue to practice their moves.

**[Educational Message: When you want to learn something new, start with the basics and keep practicing in order to improve.]**

Isabella, Lola and Malyn finish story time where they listened to a mermaid tale. They want to play in their own mermaid adventure, and brainstorm with Sean to make a mermaid tail costume. Sean and Noodle make fish cookies while the girls find bubble wrap and items from the home to make their mermaid tails. In Doggity’s segment, the crew makes mini-blueberry cheesecake bites. The kids use the recycled materials to make the mermaid tails. They take the tails to act out their adventure and enjoy the special treat.

**[Educational Message: You can creatively design projects, like mermaid tails, to act out your story time, using materials found in your home.]**

#### **MULTI-PURPOSE MAYHEM [ETRT104DH]**

Sparky is excited about a new attachment. Tork asks if she’s gone over the instructions for her new bucket with Bill Board. The team is tasked with tearing down an old picnic area to make way for a safe place for families to play in anticipation of a big festival on the weekend. Tork tells Sparky to use her old bucket until she learns how to use her new attachment efficiently and safely. Against Tork’s advice, Sparky uses her new bucket, but breaks paving stones that were to be re-used. Tork is able to save the day by trading the broken stones for mulch.

**[Educational Message: You need to read instructions about new equipment and listen to directions when tackling new jobs. Rushing ahead without proper preparation could lead to costly mistakes.]**

### **THE SELFISH TRASH TRUCK [ETRT104DH]**

The truck-wash water truck is empty because Stotz used all the water. Hauler, the garbage truck, needs help at the garbage dump moving a large heap of garbage to make way for a new waste management building. This upsets Stotz who, aside from being freshly washed, has an aversion to dirt. When Blinker dumps garbage on his bed at the dump, Stotz admonishes the crew to be more sensitive to his feelings. Blinker reminds him that he might have done the same when he used up all the water at the truck-wash. He agrees and though it's tough for him, he assents to be loaded up with garbage to help them work more efficiently. While cleaning up after the job Stotz has the idea to stay in the wash longer, but remembers it wouldn't be thoughtful. He says, "Thinking of others is what makes us a team."

**[Educational Message: Even though it may be difficult, it's always important to think of others and consider their needs and feelings.]**

They notice that same pleasant sound when they land on the black and white keys. Having discovered the name of the object is "piano," they determine it must be a musical instrument. When Boy Hooman comes back, his mother admonishes him to practice, which he must do in order to improve.

**[Educational Message: A piano is a large musical instrument. Keys on the outside are attached to hammers inside. When you depress the keys the hammers hit special strings that produce sound. As with any musical instrument, practicing helps you make beautiful music.]**

#### **PROJECT BIRTHDAY CAKE [EFGL116DH]**

The Floogals have the house to themselves. They want to try out their new Fizzer Add-Ons; Boomer's Food Finder, Flo's new Fizzer Cam, and Fleeker's Voice-Controlled Hands-Free Auto Steering for his Fizzer. Downstairs, Boomer detects food but they can't find any. When Fleeker's Auto Steering crashes his Fizzer into a picture of outer space they discover that it's actually cake. They can't figure out why Mom Hooman would cover her cake with paint. They discover the paint is actually frosting. Noticing numerous references to the number 8, they determine the cake and the decorations must

have something to do with Boy Hooman's 8<sup>th</sup> birthday. They figure out how to make and color the frosting and finish redecorating it just in time. Watching Boy Hooman blow out the candles and enjoy his special cake, they see that having a cake decorated in this way makes it much more fun to eat.

**[Educational Message: For special celebrations like birthdays, cakes are covered with a powdered sugar and water mixture called frosting, which can be turned into many colors with food coloring. Cake decorations may also illustrate different themes. Decorated this way cakes are extra fun to eat.]**

#### **NINA'S SPECIAL DRESS [ENNW116DH]**

**[Educational Message: It is good to be sensitive to other people's feelings. It's also good to be honest. If you have something difficult to tell someone, try to find a respectful way to tell the truth.]**

#### **NINA HUNTS FOR TREASURE [ENNW116DH]**

When Nina tells Abuelita how excited she is about the possibility of finding jewels during the upcoming Treasure Hunt, Abuelita tells her that many things can be considered a treasure, like a rare flower, an amazing painting, or a special granddaughter. Nico, Chelsea and Nina take turns using the metal detector finding treasures around the courtyard. Though Nico and Chelsea find things, Nina doesn't have the same luck and gets grumpy. Trying again, she finds a rock that she doesn't think has any value. Mr. Lin takes Nina, Chelsea, Nico and Abuelita to his store where he puts the rock in a tumbler to "clean" it. Abuelita tells Nina it's never a good idea to judge anything or anyone by what you see on the outside, explaining that what's inside counts most. Sure enough, the rock turns out to hold a fish fossil; a rare treasure indeed!

**[Educational Message: A treasure is not always a sparkly object; it's includes anything and anyone that has a special value to you.]**

#### **A MOUNTAIN ADVENTURE [ERTDR103DH]**

Tweet wakes up wanting to hang her homemade flag up high, so she and her friends

brainstorm some high places to put it. Hatty's hat reveals that they will be going on a mountain adventure, so they all board the Spin-Again to travel to the mountain. They find the path to the mountain, but encounter a tree in their path, so they resolve to go under it. Farther down the path, there is a muddy puddle in their way and they decide to go around it. Later, there is a river in their way and they decide to build a bridge to go over it. They finally make it to the mountain having learned how to get past objects in their way. Tweet is able to put her flag on the high mountain.

**[Educational Message: You can avoid obstructive objects by going around, above or under them.]**

### **A BEACH ADVENTURE [ERTDR103DH]**

After waking up, Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave learn that they are going on a beach adventure. They get on the Spin-Again and travel to the beach. Upon arriving, they all agree to build a sand castle. Tweet finds a bucket and shovel and they start building, but a wave washes it away. The wet sand, they discover, holds its shape better than the "crumbly" dry sand. Dave proposes that they build their castle out of wet sand on the dry sand, so it holds its shape but is beyond the reach of the destructive tide. They build a beautiful castle and decide to let a crab live there.

**[Educational Message: When at the beach, you can build sand castles with your friends. Wet sand works better than dry sand to build with.]**

When Chica lassos one person too many, she finds out that it's also a rule to not use a lasso inside. She becomes frustrated because of all the rules. On their fantasy adventure, they go to a ranch where Chica is the boss and suspends all the rules. Soon there are lots of problems: Stitch and Bunji fall off a fence they've climbed, and the noise Chica and friends make sends horses bolting from the barn. When they return to the Coop, Chica resolves to follow the rules.

**[Educational Message: Rules are made for a reason and are there to ensure that everyone can be safe, courteous and orderly.]**

#### **ICKY, STICKY, CHICKY [ETCSR103DH]**

There's an emergency at the Coop; Kelly can't find a costume for a customer who wants to be a caveman. Kelly and Chica disappear into a "cave" deep beneath the clothing rack. Mom and Dad then decide they need to figure out a better way to better manage inventory. Chica makes signs that illustrate the types of costumes. However, she doesn't want to wash to remove the glue and other decorations that got stuck in her feathers. During the fantasy adventure, Kelly and Chica are outside in a prehistoric forest and get really dirty with mud. After bathing in a pond, the group plays again when they are clean and realize it feels pretty good to not be messy and dirty.

**[Educational Message: When you get icky, sticky and dirty from playing or doing a project, be sure to clean up the mess you made, including the mess that gets left on yourself.]**

#### **DOWN ON THE FARM-FAMILY ON VACATION [ENADR103DH]**

Sean and Noodle make the smoothies. In Doggity's segment, the crew makes healthy traveling snack boxes to have for a lunch on the go. The kids come and use the leftover milk to make magic-milk using food coloring and soap, and then capture the reaction on paper. The kids share the smoothies with their family and show their aunt and uncle how to make the magic-milk pictures.

**[Educational Message: You can make a healthy smoothie and magic-milk pictures using milk].**

### **SWEET MEMORIES-SWIMMERS [ENADR103DH]**

Samantha and Jessica want to help make their grandparents' wedding anniversary special. They brainstorm ways to make a sweet memories cake using tropical fruit to remind them of their honeymoon in Hawaii and cake-toppers using old pictures. They recycle the oil bottle lid for the cake-topper. In Doggity's segment, the crew makes hearty stuffed pasta for hard-working construction workers. The kids bring their photos to make the cake toppers. They take the cake home to surprise their grandparents and celebrate their anniversary with them.

**[Educational Message: You can bake a cake to celebrate a special moment for someone you love and create a personalized topper to personalize it making it extra special.]**

#### **MAKING THE GRADE [ETRT105DH]**

Sparky explains to Blinker about patching pot holes and shows her how adding dirt to an area then smoothing it out accomplishes that. Blinker thinks it's easy. Sparky tells her to remember to take her time and leave herself a way out. The team's assignment is to dig a hole for a new community swimming pool and Blinker is assigned to do the grading. However, as a result of a recent rain the mud is too wet and slimy to dig. Duggy makes an attempt, but Tork determines it would be best to return the next day. Blinker ignores all their advice, goes in to grade, and, predictably gets stuck. Duggy has to tow her out. They leave with plans to return the next day when the mud has dried out.

**[Educational Message: If a job can't be done properly, you should wait to finish it when it can be done well. Haste can result in a costly mess.]**

### **TERRIFIC TRUCKS, TERRIFIC TESTS [ETRT105DH]**

It's Annual Terrific Truck Testing Day, where the team is tested to make sure each truck remembers how to do job his or her job right. Any trucks that don't pass the test will have to turn in their Terrific Trucks license plates. Everyone works hard to prepare for the test while Sparky grumbles that she's so good she doesn't need any preparation. Except for Sparky, all of the trucks do their best and pass. Sparky brings her bad attitude to her assignment and fails at loading a dirt pile into Tork's dump bucket. When she fails the test, she adjusts her attitude as she's now determined to show what her A-game is all about. Knowing she'll have to turn in her Terrific Trucks license plate, she says good-bye to the team. Tork then tells her she passed the test on her second try with her good attitude and determination to do her best.

**[Educational Message: If you work with a good attitude and do your very best you will be able to do a really good job.]**

The quest continues as the group sees one of the hoomans go into the tent wearing pajamas. Now they wonder if it's a house with a bed, but not strong and sturdy as the real house. Just like children, they are afraid at night when a large "cat" passes by their miniature tent.

**[Educational Message: A tent is a temporary shelter that is used for experiences where you sleep outdoors. The process of using the tent is called "camping," and it includes outdoor meals, star watching and sleeping overnight.]**

#### **PROJECT ALUMINUM FOIL [EFGL117DH]**

The Floogals are hungry and they the Hoomans preparing food for a picnic. When they return to the kitchen table, they see no food, but lots of shiny food-shaped objects instead. They wonder about the shiny metal. When Flo falls off the counter and bumps her head, she discovers that the metal is actually super thin and can wrap around objects like Girl Hooman's doll. Once she can get back up to the counter top she can share her information with her friends. Fleeker and Boomer orchestrate a quick escape when the Hoomans return and they hear Dad Hooman describe this metal as aluminum foil.

**[Educational Message: Aluminum foil is very thin shiny metal used to wrap food to keep it protected, fresh, and clean. The food can then be transported in a container and unwrapped when it is ready to be eaten.]**

**[Educational Message: It's very important to be responsible. That can include cleaning your room before going out to play. Taking shortcuts that don't get the job done is never a good idea. You may have to go back and do it all over again.]**

#### **NINA'S BROTHER FOR THE DAY [ENNW117DH]**

Carlos agrees to share his brother, Nico, with Nina for the day so she can report on having a brother for a school assignment. During the day, Nina not only learns what it's like to have a brother, but how people like Nico, with a hearing impairment, use their other senses to get along in the world. In answers to her many reporter-like questions, she discovers lights that blink when the doorbell is rung, phones that vibrate instead of ringing, how touching is one way to get their attention, and that writing and drawing are alternate ways to communicate. She gets lots of pictures of Nico and Carlos communicating with ASL (American Sign Language). She even learns to sign the word, "Awesome."

**[Educational Message: There are many ways you can communicate with people who have a hearing impairment. You can use touch, write things down, draw pictures, or use sign language. If you live in the United State, American Sign Language is taught to both deaf and hearing people.]**

#### **A PIRATE ADVENTURE [ERTDR104DH]**

They all love the treasure they found.

**[Educational Message: Maps can help you navigate through an unfamiliar place.]**

Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave wake up and Hatty's hat tells them that they are going on a farmyard adventure. They board the Spin-Again and get to the farm. Hatty finds a note from Farmer Fred that outlines the jobs that need to be done that day: take the cows to the milking barn, gather eggs from the hens, and pick some strawberries. They complete all these tasks successfully and make a delicious farmyard meal: milkshakes, strawberries and scrambled eggs.

**[Educational Message: At a farm, you can pick strawberries, milk cows and collect eggs from hens. You can also make a healthy and delicious meal from the food produced at the farm.]**

After a customer comes into the store for a Viking costume, Chica wants a Viking costume of her own. Encouraged by her mother, Chica immediately starts gathering materials for her own costume. She sees two large curved carrots that she could use as decorative horns for her helmet and with glue from Kelly, completes her project. However, in the process of rushing around, Chica isn't considerate of others; she bumps her father in the head and pushes him out of the way while digging for supplies. Her Dad reminds her to be courteous. He also reminds her to feed Bunji before leaving at the end of the day. Chica realizes she has a problem because the carrots she used were meant for Bunji's dinner. While on a fantasy adventure with Kelly, she meets two rude and obnoxious Vikings and convinces them to have better manners.

**[Educational Message: Having good manners shows others how much you care about their comfort and sense of well-being.]**

### **SKATE-O-RAMA-AIRLINE PILOTS [ENADR104DH]**

Matt and Molly are having a party and want to make invitations. They brainstorm with Sean to use items from their home to make ice skate invitations. Sean and Noodle make hot chocolate to drink and warm up. They recycle the vanilla lid to use in the invitations. In Doggity's segment, they make ground-crew granola as an energizing treat for pilots. The kids bring ribbons for the laces, and then cut out and fashion ice skates to use for the invitation. The kids use the invitations and then take the hot chocolate to drink and warm up after skating.

**[Educational Message: You can fashion creative invitations for a special event using elements you find at home.]**

Instead of crushing one car at a time as advised by Tork, Sparky, who considers herself a natural leader, decides to do more to get the job done faster. When the crusher gets jammed, Sparky realizes he should have listened to Tork's advice. They start over and get the job done quickly and efficiently.

**[Educational Message: To be a good leader, you need to use good judgment and think about the best way to accomplish each part of a complicated job. Having a great idea does not mean it will actually work when you try to use it.]**

### **THE HUNT FOR THE LOST BUCKET [ETRT101DH]**

Blinker leaves her forks out after changing them out for her bucket. Tork thinks she should put them away, but she doesn't heed his advice. The team has to clear rubble from the road where a storm deposited tree branches, dirt and rocks. It's impassable and the construction crew can't get to their jobs until it's cleared. Blinker needs her branch cutter

for the job, but can't find it. Sparky and Tork start the job, but can't continue until Blinker cuts up the branches. She has to admit to Tork and Sparky that she can't find it. After checking everywhere, Blinker remembers she left it near the materials pile and it has to be dug out. Blinker has learned her lesson and once the job is done she puts all her attachments away in one place.

**[Educational Message: It's important to always put things where they belong when you are finished using them. If you don't, you won't know where to find your things when you need them again.]**

**[Educational Message: Singing is something we do to make music and express our joy. It is lots of fun and can be done anywhere you are allowed to make a little noise.]**

#### **PROJECT VACUUM [EFGL118DH]**

The Floogals hear a loud whirring noise and run to hide under a chair. When Boomer ventures out from their hiding space, he is trapped by suction and barely escapes. Mom Hooman calls it a vacuum. Could it be a pet? Their investigation takes them to the closet where the vacuum is kept. Flo presses a button and notes this is how the vacuum can be brought to life. Then she sees that it is plugged in and infers that this is a machine that can "eat" things. Flo remembers that the Hoomans called it a cleaner and now they know this machine is a vacuum cleaner.

**[Educational Message: Vacuum cleaners are machines that suck up dirt and other materials that dirty the floors and furniture in a house. The vacuum cleaner works by sucking the dirt into a container where it is collected.]**

Because it's a very hot day, Nina wears her sunhat and stays in the shade while playing in the courtyard with Carlos and Chelsea. When leaves start falling off the tree, the kids become concerned that the tree is sick. It holds special memories for each of them so they try to see what they can do to make it better. They try watering, although they're not able to get sufficient water to the tree. They also do some things they know would make them feel better. Chelsea dances for the tree, Carlos reads to it, and Nina wraps it in a blanket. Mami calls the children in when a thunderstorm begins. As they watch the storm from the window, they express concern for the safety of the tree. Afterwards, they see how much better the tree looks and question whether their loving care helped at all. Abuelita tells them that when you love something you make sure it is well cared for and credits their love and attention as important elements in the recovery of the tree.

**[Educational Message: When we love something we want to take care of it and give it loving care. In the case of plants and trees it means making sure they have lots of water, sun and good soil.]**

#### **A COLLECTING ADVENTURE [ERTDR105DH]**

Ruff-Ruff collects sticks, Dave collects round things, and Tweet collects seashells. Ruff-Ruff comes across a round pile of sticks, but just before Ruff-Ruff takes them, Hatty explains that these are for a bird's nest and that he should look elsewhere for sticks. They have fun collecting objects, and then they head back home.

**[Educational Message: A collection is a group of things that all go together because they are the same type of thing. Birds collect sticks to build their nests.]**

Chica wants to go to outer space, but she's worried about making the journey because she'll get homesick and lonely. She narrows her choices and Kelly and Chica depart with Stitches as the pilot. They meet Lunar (Bunji), commander of the Moon and play ball. Lunar shows Chica how she can still see "home" from the moon and that is why travel is important. You can learn to see things differently. They play a few games together and head home for more fun.

**[Educational Message: If traveling far from home, enjoy the adventure of being in new places and you can take something familiar with you if it helps to keep you happy when you are away.]**

#### **CHICA THE ARTIST [ETCSR105DH]**

A father and son come into the store and want an artist's costume. When the father shows his son's beautiful painting, Chica is prompted to share her picture of a cow. Kelly doesn't realize it's a cow, nor does she lavish as much attention on Chica's picture, which makes Chica feel less confident about her work. On their fantasy adventure, Chica, Kelly, Stitches, and Bunji go to a museum where Stitches and Bunji pose for Chica next to a bowl of fruit and vegetables for a painting. Kelly (as Lavender Lilac) is a patron who delights in Chica's work and purchases her artwork. When they return to the store, Chica is confident enough to give Kelly a drawing of Bunji. Kelly notices something special; Chica's unique signature of polka dots.

**[Educational Message: Being a good artist is about enjoying the process of expressing your vision and feelings through painting and drawing. Develop your own style because your vision is what's most important.]**

#### **MAGIC TIME-CIRCUS [ENADR105DH]**

Sean and Noodle make pretzel wands with disappearing dip. Doggity makes a big-top pasta salad for a healthy boost for circus performers. The kids use rubber gloves and recycled salt containers to make the hat and rabbit for a magic trick. They put on a magical show and enjoy the special treat together.

**[Educational Message: You can make your own magic show from items around your home.]**

### **OUR NEW BOOTS-CONSTRUCTION WORKERS [ENADR105DH]**

Sydney and Edison got new snow boots and want to do a craft with the empty boxes. They brainstorm with Sean to make a snow-scene diorama. They collect sticks and pinecones along with cotton balls to make snow. Sean and Noodle make potato snow boots for a snack. Doggity makes waffle-i-cious countdown cookies for some astronauts. The kids bring their items and work with Sean to create dioramas. The girls take their dioramas and snack home to enjoy with their family.

**[Educational Message: You can recycle big boxes by making dioramas.]**

### **TERRIFIC TRUCKS**

#### **OVER TORKED [ETRT102DH]**

Tork notices the team is busy playing and popping wheelies. He attempts to set a good example by taking on some difficult tasks, but they're not paying any attention to him. A job comes in and the team discovers the supervisor at the quarry needs help digging and sorting rocks, dirt and clay from the quarry wall. Dug digs, Sparky and Blinker load the materials onto Tork, and when he is filled up they are ready to take a break. Tork, continuing his quest to set a good hard work example, takes on too much and is unable to dump the load because he's too tired to lift. Encouraged by Sparky and Blinker to take a much needed break, Tork rests up and is then able to complete the job. He realizes that in order to work hard you need to take breaks to maintain your strength.

**[Educational Message: When you need to work hard, you have to get lots of rest. Getting enough rest will help you maintain your strength so you can do your best.]**

#### **HOME BASE BIG WIG [ETRT102DH]**

Blinker, encouraged by Tork, is getting in some truck training with a block tower puzzle. Tork tells her he thinks she's ready to take on bigger jobs. The team discovers the next job is digging a subterranean parking garage – their biggest job ever. Blinker is too small for this job so Tork asks her to watch over Home Base, reminding her to keep calm and think things through. When the water pressure in the truck-wash gets low, Blinker tells Bill Board to increase the water pressure level. While she's fooling around and making a mess, the increased pressure causes a pipe to burst. She panics at first, and then remembers to calm down and think through the problem. She tells the crew to shut off the water valve. They dig up the pipe and replace it. The water pressure is restored by the time the team returns.

**[Educational Message: When confronted with a problem, stop and think of what it will take to fix the problem. Then break down the solution into the steps it will take to accomplish your goal. Take the steps in order and complete them one by one to get the job done.]**

## **FLOOGALS**

### **PROJECT TABLE TENNIS [EFGL119DH]**

Hearing a noise they can't identify, the Floogals undertake a quest of discovery. They hear Boy Hooman reference table tennis and paddle. Though Boomer is sure there is food since tables usually hold food, their investigations turn up no knives and forks. An object Boomer thinks is an egg falls off the table and makes the sound they initially heard.

Through determining what they know of that's round and bounces and rolls they discover that what they thought was an egg is actually a ball. They remember that Hoomans often use balls in their games. Flo and Boomer use the bicycle pedal to toss the ball back up to the table, but when it seems that they will lose control of it, Fleeker instinctively utilizes the paddle to keep it on the table. Flo and Boomer use other objects they find on the table and soon the Floogals themselves are engaged in a game of Table Tennis.

**[Educational Message: Table tennis is a game played on a table with a light, bouncy ball that is hit with a paddle.]**

### **PROJECT MAGNET [EFGL119DH]**

Boomer crashes on the table while attempting to land his Fizzer during a flying lesson. As a result, Flo's Fizzer falls and lands in Boy Hooman's school bag. There the Floogals notice something they can't identify. Boy Hooman returns for his bag while they are investigating. They hide, and he zips up his bag with Flo's Fizzer inside. Mom Hooman calls him out of the room. Flo and Fleeker hurry to recover her Fizzer while Boomer investigates the unidentifiable object. In the kitchen, he determines that it only sticks to metal and discovers many things like it throughout the kitchen. Mom and Boy Hooman return; discovery is avoided when Boomer employs the magnet to zip open the school bag enabling Flo to retrieve her Fizzer.

**[Educational Message: Magnets are hard metal objects that can pull other metal objects toward them, and stick to them as well. Magnets come in a variety of shapes and sizes that can be used in many different ways.]**

turns out to be unhelpful. Finally, Abuelita helps Nina understand what helping and packing is all about: thinking and planning ahead about how things will fit in each container, then making suggestions or asking questions before she acts.

**[Educational Message: In order to be a good helper you need to first figure out what sort of help is needed. If you are figuring out the best way to make a number of things fit in one space, think about all the sizes and shapes involved and even draw a diagram to see if your approach will work.]**

### **NINA CAMPS IT UP [ENNW120DH]**

Once Nina's family has arrived at the camp, Nina discovers she is going to miss a lot of things from home, but that there are also lots to do that might be very exciting. She finds out that she will need to walk to the bathroom, listen for sounds to determine what kinds of animals are around, observe her surroundings to see different kinds of plants, cook over an open fire, and sleep in a tent without her mattress from home. Soon Nina adjusts to her new environment and is excited to experience everything that camping has to offer.

**[Educational Message: New experiences, such as camping in the wild outdoors, might be scary at first but there is so much to discover and learn, you will soon adjust and be able to enjoy the beauty and benefits of nature.]**

#### **A GARDENING ADVENTURE [ERTDR106DH]**

Then, they water their plants and learn that it takes time for them to grow.

**[Educational Message: Seeds need soil, sunlight, water, and time to grow into plants. Also, you can use tools to plant the seeds.]**

#### **A FLYING ADVENTURE [ERTDR106DH]**

Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave emerge from their sleeping pods and discover that they are going on a flying adventure. When they arrive in Flying Land, where everything can fly, they find a paper airplane that they throw to see how far it goes. Tweet wishes she could fly as far as a bluebird and the group decides she should take flying lessons from this bird. When she can't stay in the air that long, they resolve to give Tweet a few balloons to help her stay in the air. She is able to fly with the balloons, but can't get down. She unties the balloons one by one and discovers she can still fly without them.

**[Educational Message: It's always good to get help from others when you are trying to learn something new. You can start with a teacher who is an expert and then get help from your friends so you can improve.]**

Later, after a little boy comes to the shop for a baseball costume, Chica dresses up like a ball player and she and Kelly attempt a game of catch. Chica is unable to catch the ball and feels like giving up because she is not the best, despite Kelly urging her to practice. On their fantasy adventure, Chica takes a chance and tries three new games and is really good at just one. She realizes that fun is just as important as being a winner. When they return to the store, Chica is willing to give baseball a new try.

**[Educational Message: You can have fun at games even if you don’t win or perform the best. The most important thing is that you give games a try, do your best and have fun, win or lose.]**

### **SUPER CHICA! [ETCSR106DH]**

Chica feels bad because Bunji has gone missing because she left the cage door open while getting his food. Even though Chica accepts responsibility for Bunji being lost, everyone pitches in to find the rabbit. After her parents and Kelly help out, Dad finds Bunji sneaking a nibble of the food left on the floor. Chica is glad Bunji was found but really wanted to be the one to undo her own mistake. On the fantasy adventure, Chica, Bunji and Kelly are “super heroes” in a city where Mr. Bubbledeedoo (Stitches) has become a nuisance because he’s blowing way too many big bubbles. In order to stop Mr. Bubbledeedoo, they have to work as a team and Chica understands that in some cases, it takes teamwork to solve a problem.

**[Educational Message: It is not always possible that one person can be the super problem-solver. Sometimes it is necessary to work with a group in order to get the job done and the problem solved.]**

### **A FAMILY VALENTINE’S DAY-ASTRONAUTS [ENADR106DH]**

Elena, Julian and Katherine want to show their parents they love them for Valentine's Day. They brainstorm with Sean to make Valentine's cards and collect photographs from their home to include in the cards. Sean and Noodle make cheesy macaroni with vegetables and recycle the macaroni box for their craft. The kids work with Sean to make pop-up cards to show their parents how much they love them. They take the cards and the cheesy macaroni to have a special Valentine's Day.

**[Educational Message: You can make a card to show your parents how much you love them for Valentine's Day.]**

#### **THE ROCK CRUNCHING RUNAROUND [ETRT106DH]**

Sparky is disappointed that there's a job and tries to rush the team so she can get to the show. In her haste, Sparky scoops and loads the rocks before they're broken down. Tork tells her she's got to stick to the plan because she has skipped the most important step. The quarry's sorter cannot handle the large rocks, so he dumps out all the rocks to be pulverized. They have to start all over. Sparky gets it and slows down, stays on task and the team completes the job. She understands that she can see the show the next time, but Stotz has taken a quick detour and surprised her with a number of truck-cessories.

**[Educational Message: It is important to take your time and pay attention to all the steps and details required to complete a job. If you rush you might miss a step or make a mistake, which will slow you down and make the job take even longer. ]**

#### **BLING RIG OVERLOAD [ETRT106DH]**

Stotz rolls in with boxes of upgrades. He's going to enter a World Famous Sensible Semi Competition. Tork tells him he's already amazing. He's a Terrific Truck. The team is to fill potholes around home base with recycled asphalt. Stotz is not needed for that job so he gets all his upgrades installed. When he doesn't get the response he expects from his teammates and realizes his fancy upgrades will prevent him from doing the things he normally does, Stotz decides to enter the competition without all the bling. Dug and Tork load and move asphalt while Sparky and Blinker grade to smooth the potholes. The job is finished just as Stotz returns with the blue ribbon. The judges said he showed real "confidence and sensibility" by not showing up with all the doo-dads.

**[Educational Message: You don't have to decorate yourself with a lot of fancy things to prove that you are good looking. Be your best self and prove that you are sensible and sensational. ]**

### **PROJECT MAIL [EFGL120DH]**

While hanging out near the front door, Fleeker is struck on the head by a pile of unidentified objects that came through the hole in the door. They observe that all of the rectangular papers have the same thing written on them as well as a sticker. They follow Mom Hooman after observing her prepare a birthday card for her sister in the same manner. They see a hooman dressed in blue carrying similar objects and watch Mom Hooman deposit her sister’s card in a blue box. When Flo flies down into the box to investigate, she discovers that the box is full of cards and envelopes. She notes that while all the mail that was delivered to the Hoomans had the same thing written on the outside, the writing on the all the envelopes in the box is different. When her Fizzer’s battery dies, Flo must devise a way to get out of the box. In the end they not only discover what mail is but utilize it too.

**[Educational Message: Mail is a way of sending and receiving messages that are written on paper. Put a letter or card in an envelope, and on the front, write the name and address of the person you want to send it to and glue a stamp in the corner. After it is sent, a uniformed mail carrier will get it and deliver your message to the intended recipient.]**

**[Educational Message: Spending time outdoors and discovering new things in nature is lots of fun. Using your imagination to recreate your adventures with your friends can even turn a rainy day indoors into a fun and exciting time.]**

### **NINA'S KICK-OFF [ENNW121DH]**

It's time for soccer season and Nina is stoked to practice with Carlos' older brother, Nico. They learn to go through the paces of different drills. Carlos is too busy showing off to benefit from his brother's skill and disrupts the practice. When Nico gives up helping the kids, Nina tries to figure out a way to help the boys. She remembers what Abuelita told her about avoiding a battle: calm down, take a breath and count to five before you start a fight with someone. It turns out that Carlos is jealous of his brother's skill and doesn't recognize that he could be good at soccer if he just practiced. It turns out that Carlos has the potential to be a really great goalie.

**[Educational Message: Focus is important when practicing any sports activity. If you and a sibling or friend have an argument, it sometimes helps to stop the fussing, breathe deeply and count to five so you can both calm down. Then, it might be possible to talk and solve the problem.]**

Dave comes up with his own dance, and discovers that blue pandas *can* dance.

**[Educational Message: Tempo is the speed of a piece of music, and rhythm describes the beat of the music. Also, everyone has his or her own style of dancing.]**

#### **A KITE ADVENTURE [ERTDR107DH]**

Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave are playing with "flappy flying things," which Hatty tells them are kites. His hat reveals that they are going on a kite adventure. They all pack their kites and board the Spin-Again. When they get to Windy Land, they fly their kites and discover that kites need wind to blow in order to fly. To find the wind, they look at the windmills to see where it is blowing. They are able to get their kites flying again, but they break when they all crash. They make a new kite out of sticks, cloth and string from the old broken kites. When the wind blows, the new, big super kite flies.

**[Educational Message: Kites need wind in order to fly; objects like windmills can help you locate where the wind is blowing. Also, if your kite breaks, you can use the materials from the old kite to make a new one.]**

Bunji pushes a big box up a long hill just to see Stitches open it, but the package isn't for Stitches. He pushes the big box back down the hill and waits for Kelly. Now they can deliver the mail properly and deliver a teeny-tiny package to Stitches, who reveals that inside is a remote control button that inflates a Bouncy House.

**[Educational Message: When you rush, you are likely to make mistakes. It is important to practice patience. One approach is to do something else enjoyable while you wait.]**

### **CHICA'S BIG COMB CIRCUS [ETCSR107DH]**

Chica, Mr. and Mrs. C and Kelly decide to organize a big circus performance in the shop. Everyone takes a role and Chica becomes the ringmaster. She has definite ideas about how to manage the circus and it doesn't include listening to the ideas of others. No one's act is satisfactory, according to Chica. On the fantasy adventure with Kelly, Chica finds herself as ringmaster to another circus. She enforces a roll call, and pronounces that "her" circus is great, but it needs to become "amazing." Each performer must change their act. Chica's expectations are too high and the new acts do not work. The performers all quit and Chica realizes that she should have listened to her performers and let them do what they do best.

**[Educational Message: When you are the leader, it is important to listen to ideas from your team so you can figure out what they can do well and help make your project a big success.]**

**[Educational Message: You can find lots of fun things to do with the babysitter when your parents are away.]**

#### **TRAINS-CONSTRUCTION WORKERS [ENADR107DH]**

Sophie, Kristin and Ryan want to make a train to play with while they are at the train station. They brainstorm to make a lunchbox train and a special snack shaped like

passengers. In the kitchen, Noodle and Sean make passengers out of baked vegetable mash to put in the train. For the craft, the kids work with Sean to make the train out of items from their empty food boxes and recycled paper towel rolls and lids. The children return to the train station to watch the trains go by and enjoy their snacks.

**[Educational Message: You can get creative and construct your own toy train with recycled items from your lunchbox.]**

It turns out that the sound was that of a leak in the hose to Stotz's new air brakes. The leak causes his air brakes lock and he gets stuck. They have to get a crew member to help them. Once he's been repaired, they are able to get back to work and catch-up so the job gets completed on time.

**[Educational Message: When you're working, sometimes it's very hard to concentrate and think clearly. Loud music is fine when you are playing or dancing but not when you work.]**

### **THE MINI TRUCK DREAM TEAM [ETRT107DH]**

Sparky is learning to be a leader while Tork is taking a break. Blinker is anxious to lead as well. Tork tells her if she works hard and practices she too will soon be ready to lead. While the rest of the team is off demolishing a highway ramp to make way for a new one, Blinker begins to stack a pile of sand. During a break, she naps and dreams her sister, Zippy and Digby show up to help her. As their leader, she devises a plan, solves problems, delegates tasks and completes the job. When the team returns and Tork compliments her on the completed sand stack, she's not so sure if it was a dream after all.

**[Educational Message: When you have a chance to lead a team, don't forget to develop a task for each team member. If you have to change your task, then consolidate your workers to focus on one task together to achieve your goal.]**

concludes from the footprint, ears, and nose, that the critter must be a rabbit. They pull out a carrot to see if the critter will follow. Sure enough, a huge rabbit eats the carrot. The Hoomans flush the rabbit out of its hiding place and realize they have to put their vegetables under a cage to prevent the rabbit from invading the garden.

**[Educational Message: Rabbits are furry, long-eared animals that love vegetables and will invade a garden. It is important to enclose the garden so the rabbit cannot enter and the vegetables are protected.]**

### **PROJECT JEWELRY BOX [EFGL123DH]**

Girl Hooman has a beautiful box with a pretty girl dancer twirling around inside. Boomer thinks the little girl is trapped inside and needs his help to get out. The Floogals go on a mission to rescue the little girl in the box. They make several attempts to get inside the box, but Flo finally figures out that the hole on the side is for a key. Once they open it, they see that the girl is not real and is a decoration for the box. But Flo knows the musical box is a container for all of Girl Hooman's beautiful trinkets.

**[Educational Message: A jewelry box is a special place for keeping necklaces, earrings and other items we call jewelry and treasures. A jewelry box can be locked and often plays music when opened.]**

#### **NINA LEARNS KARATE [ENNW123DH]**

Nina starts the day with a lot of energy, leaping around, knocking things over and making a mess of a cake in the bakery. Abuelita thinks it would be a good idea to take all of that energy and run around in the park. There she and Nina see Eddie practicing Karate for his test later in the day. Abuelita explains to Nina that Karate is a Japanese martial art where

you test your body, mind and spirit. Eddie teaches Nina a kick and a punch that she takes to the bakery where she frightens Mrs. Goldstein and knocks things over. Papi takes Nina to the community center where there is a Karate class being taught. Nina joins in and learns a few basics; she ends her day demonstrating those concepts to Mami.

**[Educational Message: Gaining proficiency in any area requires focus, hard work and lots of practice. If you do these three things, you can excel at anything you try to do. It even takes practice to learn to focus and be still.]**

#### **A BIRTHDAY ADVENTURE [ERTDR108DH]**

It is Hatty's birthday and they all head to his birthday party to play fun games. The Spin-Again takes them to Party Land where, upon arrival, they all realize they don't have a present for Hatty. They all agree the present should be a surprise. They play a number of really fun games at Hatty's party. While playing the games, Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave collect items for Hatty's present. They surprise Hatty with a present that pleases him very much.

**[Educational Message: Games are a great way to have fun at a friend's birthday party. Also, you can surprise your friend with a thoughtful present at their party.]**

Stitches, also a fairy, cannot fly so he knows something is wrong. No one knows exactly what's wrong, but they all try to help Stitches "feel better." A series of long trenches have been dug at the farm for a new drainage system and are ready to be covered up. They need to be filled with gravel instead of dirt so excess water can flow away from the plants into the pipes that will carry it away. It's Blinker's chance to participate in his first big job. In an effort to impress Tork and show him he can handle this big job, he rushes, breaks down and has to be repaired. Tork tells him that part of being responsible is knowing when to rest. Blinker slows down and completes the job with no other problems. On their way back, Tork tells him how proud he is and that he thinks he's ready for another big job.

**[Educational Message: It's very important to proceed carefully and safely with any task. You must always try your hardest but doing your best work also means knowing when it's time to take a break.]**

**eraser, it will remove your drawing from the paper. A pencil is really a fancy stick after all.]**

### **PROJECT HAMSTER [EFGL124DH]**

The Floogals come across an amazing house-like object with tubes and water and wheels in it. At first they think it looks like a space house. Fleeker gets trapped inside and realizes there is a little creature in the cage with him. Flo and Boomer have to find a way to rescue Fleeker. Girl Hooman opens the cage door and Fleeker is released, but the hamster escapes. They chase the hamster and drop him back in the cage so it looks like nothing happened in the bedroom.

**[Educational Message: Hamsters need food, drink and lots of toys that encourage them to exercise. The door to the hamster's cage has to be kept shut because if the hamster escapes it will be very hard to catch him.]**

#### **NINA'S THANKSGIVING [ENNW122DH]**

While Mami and Papi are anticipating a small, quiet family dinner for Thanksgiving, Nina winds up inviting a number of other guests. The oven has gone on the fritz in Chelsea's apartment so her mother has nowhere to bake her turkey. Nina invites her to use the bakery oven. Mrs. Goldstein is alone, so Nina invites her to join them. The Kapurs share corn on the cob from their garden for the dinner and Nina invites them as well. Just as Papi wonders aloud how they'll feed everyone, Tio Javier shows up. Through all of this, Nina repeatedly reminds everyone that Abuelita has said it's not the food but the people that make Thanksgiving special. Kelly receives a call from Kenny who tells her that he is having a music party and needs a lot of instruments to be delivered to his house right away. They all go on a search to find all the instruments in the Costume Coop. Jet offers to deliver the instruments in a large washtub he found but Chica doesn't want to share the washtub. Eventually, Chica relents and Jet delivers the instruments. When the shop closes, Kelly and Chica head to a Jamboree to perform in the band. Chica won't share any of the instruments and tries to use all of them on her own. When she performs solo, trying to play all the instruments, she is awful. Chica realizes that she has to share the instruments with her friends to make the band sound good. They go back on stage and the crowd loves them.

**[Educational Message: Taking turns and sharing with your friends is important when working as a team.]**

Cecilia and her brother, Julian, make birthday cake gift boxes to store the cookie jar in and take it to the twins' birthday party.

**[Educational Message: You can make very special gifts for your friends on their birthday.]**

Once on the job, Blinker ignores the safety rules and moves in to start crushing before it's her turn. Fear immobilizes her under the roof Dug is carefully, but precariously holding aloft. **[Educational Message: When you are doing work that has a specific procedure you should follow directions. That is how everyone stays safe and the job can be completed without problems or injuries.]**

### **DUG OUT [ETRT109DH]**

Sparky is disappointed because she fears Blinker is being awed by Dug when she thought she was Blinker's favorite. When the team arrives at the baseball field to dig a new dugout, Sparky tries to do Dug's job and is not effective. Tork tells her everyone has special skills and talents and assures her Blinker is impressed with the cool things each of them can do. Dug finishes knocking down the old dugout fence and digging a new hole. Then Sparky does what she does best, which is loading the dirt into Tork's dump bucket. Later Blinker affirms she loves Dug's digging, Sparky's loading and Tork's hauling.

**[Educational Message: It's easy to feel less important than a friend who has an ability you don't have. Be proud of your own unique abilities because they have their own value and are important to your team.]**

**[Educational Message: Rainbows occur when it rains and the sun is also shining. The sunlight goes into the spray of water and it makes the water look like a rainbow. It stays in the sky even though it looks like the curved rainbow touches the ground.]**

#### **PROJECT KITE [EFGL125DH]**

Dad Hooman takes a kite out of the shed as the family departs for the park. They leave a broken kite behind and the Floogals try to figure out what it is and what it is used for. Flo remembers that Girl Hooman said she liked to "fly" the kite, so they attempt to repair

it. First they patch the holes, and then they try to figure out how to turn it on. They think there must be controls, but just a gust of wind that lifts the spool of string, the kite and the Floogals off into the sky. When they land, they get in their portable vehicles and fly off to find the kite, which has gotten lost. After an adventuresome chase, they harness the kite and pull it back to the Hoomans' backyard.

**[Educational Message: A kite is a toy made of lightweight material stretched over a frame. The kite can fly in the wind and it is controlled by a string attached to its frame on one end and a handle held in your hand. Your hand movements can make the kite do tricks and you can wind and unwind the string to make the kite go higher and lower.]**

Based on Papi's advice about earning the money you need if there's something you want to buy, Nina and Chelsea open a Lemonade Stand so they can make \$3 for a new jump rope. When they refuse to give Carlos and Eddie free lemonade the boys decide to open a stand of their own. While the two businesses are competing for customers in the courtyard, Max the Dog gets excited, runs a little bit amok and ruins crucial elements of both stands. While cleaning up, Nina gets the idea for them to join forces, since between them they have all they need for one Lemonade Stand. Collaborating in this way the four friends are able to sell lots of lemonade in the same courtyard.

**[Educational Message: When there's something you'd like to have, think of ways to earn the money to get it. If you find you have competition maybe you can join forces, share resources and accomplish your financial goals.]**

This game teaches Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave more about opposites and allows them to have fun while doing it. The gang also makes a new hat for Hatty out of the material from their opposite game. He loves it.

**[Educational Message: "Opposite" means that two things are as different as different can be.]**

**[Educational Message: When you make a mess, try to sort things into three piles, then you will know what can be thrown away, what you can save or give away to be used again, and what you should send to a recycling center.]**

#### **CHICA'S HALLOWEEN ADVENTURE [ETCSR110DH]**

It's Halloween and everyone is dressing up in fascinating costumes. Chica thinks everyone else's costume is better than her pink pig snout and ears. There will be more time to enjoy yourself if you aren't worrying about the decisions you have to make.]**

#### **STORY TIME-CIRCUS [ENADR110DH]**

Luca and his friends are looking for something to help them carry all of their library books. Sean teaches them how to make backpacks to put their books in at their picnic. Sean and Noodle stack various meats and cheeses and put them in bread using alphabet cereal to make book titles to create Storytime Book Bites. They recycle the cereal boxes and use them for the backpack craft. Luca and his friends collect smaller boxes to use as pockets on the backpacks. **[Educational Message: You can find new and creative ways to carry your books from the library.]**

#### **FAMILY BIKE RIDE-FAMILY ON VACATION [ENADR110DH]**

Shawn and his brother are going on a family bike ride but it is too hot outside, so they ask for help to cool off before their picnic. Sean and Noodle make Bicycle Icicle Tea to help cool them off using peppermint and ice cubes. They use recycled items from their picnic to decorate their bikes with tassels and license plates. Shawn and his brother take the tea back to the family and decorate their bikes with the items they made with Sean and Noodle.

**[Educational Message: You can creatively decorate your bikes with recycled items from your everyday lunch.]**

### **TERRIFIC TRUCKS**

#### **PUSHING THE PACK [ETRT110DH]**

The team is building an obstacle course where the military trucks will train. Tork's dad, Hatch, a military truck, is on hand. When Dug overheats and starts spewing steam, Hatch tells Tork that taking breaks is very important. Tork apologizes for pushing Dug too hard and tells Hatch how much he wanted to impress him. Once he has rested up, Dug is able to complete the job effectively. Hatch tells Tork that he needn't have worried; he's always been very proud of him.

**[Educational Message: When leading a team or group, it's important to look out for your team member's safety and wellbeing. Taking breaks is very important.]**

### **DON'T PLAY WITH THE TIRE [ETRT110DH]**

Blinker is very restless because he wants to play and can't find his super bounce ball. Red T, the fire engine, tells Tork how drought conditions have made everything very dry. Tork assigns Blinker to work with Red T to clear the tall dry grass from around the electrical building to aid in fire prevention. Blinker is upset because he'd rather work with the rest of the team loading their old, used tires for recycling. He sees it as a job that's much more fun; it could be just like bouncing his ball. Bored with cutting down the grass, he makes excuses, leaves Red T to join the others and a fire breaks out. The workers extinguish it quickly and Blinker realizes how important his fire prevention job really was.

**[Educational Message: Some jobs are more fun than others, but all jobs need to be completed. Everyone must do his or her part to prevent fires.]**

#### **PROJECT HALLOWEEN [EFGL126DH]**

The Floogals encounter the scary Halloween decorations displayed around the Hoomans' house. To find out more, they decide to examine all of the spooky things to figure out what Halloween is. They observe some hanging ghosts, which they discover are just rubber balls with cloth tied around them. They also observe a hollow pumpkin and a Hooman in a costume. When they notice that Mom Hooman is not afraid of the decorations, they conclude that the Hoomans put up these scary decorations themselves. **[Educational Message: Halloween is a holiday in which people try to scare each other. The holiday consists of making Jack-O-Lanterns and dressing up in colorful costumes.]**

#### **PROJECT POPCORN [EFGL126DH]**

Boomer really wants to record the interesting crunching sound coming from the Hoomans' couch, despite Flo and Fleeker's warning to not get too close. After hearing Mom Hooman refer to the white fluffy things as "popcorn," the Floogals want to find out more. They collect small golden kernels and wonder where the white fluffy things went. The Floogals hypothesize that Dad Hooman is going to do something to the kernels to make them into white fluffy things. They encounter a machine and accidentally turn it on. A white fluffy thing pops out of the machine and they observe that one of the kernels is in the middle of it. Flo concludes that heat makes the golden kernels explode into popcorn.

**[Educational Message: Popcorn is a delicious, crunchy snack that starts as tiny, golden corn kernels that expand when they get hot.]**

Nina learns the hard way that a lot more work is involved in taking care of a dog. She and Abuelita bathe him after each event and finally settle him down just before Carlos returns.

**[Educational Message: Taking care of pets is a big responsibility. Different pets require varying levels of care; dogs require much more work than goldfish.]**

#### **NINA GETS ON TRACK [ENNW114DH]**

Nina and Abuelita are the first ones at the railroad exhibit at the library. Mr. Lambert has constructed an elaborate model train set including a city with bridges, tunnels, and stores. He tells Nina that she can be the engineer while he shows Abuelita a new book. He gives her instructions and admonishes her to be very careful and proceed cautiously. She ignores his instructions and goes "full speed ahead." The train crashes, goes off the tracks, scratches one of the cows he painted, and breaks his favorite engine. She apologizes and offers to help with repairs. With Mr. Lambert's model train repair kit and Nina's painting skills, they are able to fix the train before other people arrive to see the exhibit. When Mr. Lambert allows Nina to have another turn at the controls, she promises to go much slower.

**[Educational Message: Model trains are fun to collect and exhibit, with buildings and tunnels and even trees. Certain rules are made to keep people and things safe from harm; you should always listen when given instructions. ]**

#### **A VEGGIE ADVENTURE [ERTDR111DH]**

Hatty also shows Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave how some veggies grow in pods and some grow underground. They find lots of colorful veggies in Hatty's garden and use them to make veggie soup for lunch.

**[Educational Message: Vegetables come from plants, which grow from seeds with the help of water and sunlight. You should eat vegetables because they make you strong.]**

#### **A HAPPY ADVENTURE [ERTDR111DH]**

Everyone is in a good, happy mood except Tweet because she lost her tweet toy. The hat reveals that they are going on an adventure to Happy Land. When they get there, Hatty explains that a person's facial expression can tell you a lot about the way that person is feeling. Tweet has a sad face, and when Ruff-Ruff loses his ball, he has an angry face. When Dave hears an unfamiliar noise, his friends can tell he is scared based on his face. Ruff-Ruff is able to get his ball back, Dave discovers that it was just a frog making that noise, and Tweet gets her toy back. They are all happy and smiling.

**[Educational Message: Our faces can tell us a lot about the emotions that we are experiencing. Also, it feels good to help make a friend happy.]**

Chica wants to have a hula party but the weather outside is far too cold and windy. Kelly helps by trying to keep everyone warm inside the Coop, but Chica is upset she can't have a hula party as planned. Despite Kelly's offer of a pineapple smoothie, Chica cannot be soothed. After the shop closes, Kelly and Chica go on an adventure to the snowy mountains where Chica wears a grass skirt and lei. Not finding a sunny beach, Kelly, in the role of an old lady, dresses Chica in winter clothes. Suddenly, Chica has a fine time sledding and throwing snowballs with friends. Chica discovers that you can still have fun even if you have to make a change in your plan.

**[Educational Message: If you make adjustments when plans have to be changed you will find that you can still have a lot of fun.]**

#### **SNOW PRINCESS CHICA [ETCSR111DH]**

When Jet arrives with a special delivery package full of winter accessories, Chica puts them all on and dresses up like a snow princess. The only thing missing is the perfect princess crown. After a lengthy search, Chica gets frustrated and decides to give up on the snow princess costume altogether. During Chica's fantasy adventure, she becomes a snow princess inside her castle. Missing a crown, she is offered various replacements but nothing seems to work. But when Chica and her friends collaborate, they come up with a nice crown by using their imaginations. Chica and Kelly return to the shop, and Chica finally uses her imagination to make her own perfect crown.

**[Educational Message: Using your imagination to solve a problem is sometimes the best way to get exactly what you want.]**

Sean and Noodle make some Coconut Safari Snack Mix by taking coconut, oats, cereal and honey and baking them together into a healthy snack mix. As a special treat, they make safari-themed snack cones using paper plates and paint. They recycle the cereal bag and use it to stamp paint on the craft animal print snack cones. Hayley, Savannah and Shane take the mix and cones home to have a fun family movie night.

**[Educational Message: During family night you can make themed snacks for everyone to share.]**

#### **THE SHED DEMO STRIKE [ETRT103DH]**

While the rest of the team is collecting old bits and parts for recycling, Dug is trying to hold on to an old tire. Tork tells him it's important to choose what to keep and what to get rid of, explaining that it's important to recycle old things to make room for new equipment. When they go to the farm to knock down a rickety old tool shed, Dug refuses to do his job because of an old plow he finds inside. It takes some convincing but Tork eventually concedes that just because something is old it doesn't mean it can't still be useful. Dug pulls the plow out of the shed and proceeds with the demolition.

**[Educational Message: Just because something is old, it doesn't mean it has no value. When recycling you have to carefully decide what should be discarded and what you can re-purpose.]**

#### **THE BIG LITTLE DIG TUTOR [ETRT103DH]**

Blinker is excited about the arrival of a new attachment. Tork tells her she needs to learn how to use it safely first, but Blinker thinks she can use her new bucket without a tutorial. Digby arrives to give her instruction, but Blinker refuses his help. The team's assignment is to install new light rigs. Blinker is disappointed that Digby and Dug will be doing the digging and lifting. Ignoring Tork and Digby's advice, Blinker tries to dig a hole on her own and discovers she actually does need help learning how to use the new attachment. With Digby's assistance, Blinker is able to gain proficiency and help with the light installation.

**[Educational Message: While being enthusiastic and confident when learning to use new gear is a good thing, it's important to learn proper use and safety. You will do a much better job after you learn how to use things efficiently.]**

The Floogals find the Hooman family is going away, packing large amounts of food, mounting their bikes, and riding away from the house. In their quest to pry into the family's plans, Flo hears the word "picnic" and Boomer manages to fall into a basket of food. Flo and Fleeker jump into their Fizzers and fly behind the Hoomans. Once they decamp, the Floogals can't believe the Hoomans would make such an effort to eat outdoors. However, they realize that they had traveled the furthest away from the Hooman house since their arrival on earth. And the picnic food tasted better in such a relaxed environment. Plus, the family really enjoyed playing games and riding bikes. So, all in all, the adventure was fun.

**[Educational Message: Even though it takes a lot of work to prepare for a picnic, getting away from home to do things you enjoy with your family is a lot like combining a great feast with a fun day outside.]**

**[Educational Message: Friends often disagree. But, after taking a moment to cool down they can forgive one another for their quarrel, forget about their differences and have fun together on a project. Holi is a Hindu festival celebrating the arrival of Spring.]**

### **NINA'S AMAZING AMIGOS [ENNW126DH]**

Donning their pirate hats, Nina, Chelsea and Carlos head off to the playground to play pirates. There they encounter Aidan, a new kid in school. Carlos tells Nina and Chelsea that Aidan's not nice, but they encourage him to play anyway. Aidan commandeers the leadership of the game, throws sand in Carlos's face, and tosses Star off the slide into the sand below. Nina remembers that Dr. Kapur had advised them that in the event of bullying they should go and tell an adult. They enlist the help of Abuelita. She has a talk with Aidan who appears to use bullying to force others to respect him. But he finds out that is not the way to make friends. He promises to play nicely with the friends and he does so with an entirely new attitude.

**[Educational Message: If you are ever confronted by a bully, you should tell an adult who can intervene on your behalf. That way the adult can help the bully understand that the best way to make friends is to be friendly yourself and show your respect for others.]**

**[Educational Message: There are seven colors in the rainbow: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet. Also, you can only see rainbows when there is rain and sun at the same time.]**

### **AN EXPLORING ADVENTURE [ERTDR112DH]**

Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave are drawing when Hatty's hat tells them that they are going to go on an exploring adventure. They have a whole island to explore. Ruff-Ruff, Tweet and Dave want to find a Doggie-Birdie-Panda. At Hatty's request, they narrow down a few characteristics of the Doggie-Birdie-Panda that will help them identify it. They find a number of animals, none of which are the Doggie-Birdie-Panda. They discover that, based on the clues, they are the Doggie-Birdie-Panda. They were following themselves.

**[Educational Message: When exploring and looking for something specific, you can follow clues about its characteristics in order to find it.]**

Chica, Kelly, Bunji, and Stitches are in an Indy 500-type race. Though she is in last place, Chica perseveres and keeps going when her friends have to drop out of the race. She ultimately wins the race because she didn’t give up when others had to quit. She tries her skill on Kelly when they return to the shop and she’s able to catch Kelly at an opportune moment and tag for a “freeze.”

**[Educational Message: Sometimes a game is won based on perseverance, not by speed. Just take things at your own pace and eventually others may have to slow down or stop. Then you can move ahead and achieve your goals.]**

#### **CHICA THE BOCK-A-DOODLE BUILDER [ETCSR112DH]**

Mrs. C is taking a customer on a tour of the shop, recounting her famous costumes. Chica enters in a self-made airplane and announces that she wants to build an airport inside the shop. Despite being told by Kelly that an airport is too big for the shop, Chica persists in trying to do something “big.” She doesn’t accept the idea that “small is beautiful,” too. While on their fantasy adventure, Chica is the boss of a building company and builds Bunji a “huge” house just to fix a broken roof shingle. Bunji finds the new house overwhelming. Chica has to tear it down and return to building something much smaller. Upon her return to the shop, Chica draws a plan for new shingle for Bunji’s cage.

**[Educational Message: A large size isn’t always the most important thing you can do to make an impression. Sometimes, small things are more appropriate and just as appreciated.]**

On the bus, Sean helps Mila and her friends make teddy bear picnic baskets out of paper plates, recycled greeting cards, and the bread bags. The girls take their teddy bear bread and new picnic baskets to the park for a day of fun at the picnic.

**[Educational Message: You can use your imagination to have a special picnic for your teddy bear.]**

#### **COME TO OUR TEA PARTY-CROSSING GUARDS [ENADR112DH]**

Vanessa and her friends would like to have a tea party and need Sean's help. They decide to make teacup and saucer sets. For a snack, Noodle and Sean make mini-pancakes with ricotta cheese and berry topping. When Vanessa and her friends return from collecting the yogurt cups, Sean helps them make the teacups out of recycled yogurt cups, ricotta lids from their snack, and special salt dough he prepared. Once dry, the girls return home to have a tea party with their new teacups and delicious pancakes.

**[Educational Message: You can have a wonderful tea party with your friends when you use your imagination and your toys.]**

#### **MULTI-PURPOSE MAYHEM [ETRT104DH]**

Sparky is excited about a new attachment. Tork asks if she's gone over the instructions for her new bucket with Bill Board. The team is tasked with tearing down an old picnic area to make way for a safe place for families to play in anticipation of a big festival on the weekend. Tork tells Sparky to use her old bucket until she learns how to use her new attachment efficiently and safely. Against Tork's advice, Sparky uses her new bucket, in the process breaking paving stones that were to be re-used. Tork is able to save the day by trading the broken stones for mulch.

**[Educational Message: You need to read instructions about new equipment and listen to directions when tackling new jobs. Rushing ahead without proper preparation could lead to costly mistakes.]**

#### **THE SELFISH TRASH TRUCK [ETRT104DH]**

The truck-wash water truck is empty because Stotz used all the water. Hauler, the garbage truck, needs help at the garbage dump moving a large heap of garbage to make way for a new waste management building. This upsets Stotz who, aside from being freshly washed, has an aversion to dirt. When Blinker dumps garbage on his bed at the dump, Stotz admonishes the crew to be more sensitive to his feelings. Blinker reminds him that he might have done the same when he used up all the water at the truck-wash. He agrees and though it's tough for him, he assents to be loaded up with garbage to help them work more efficiently. While cleaning up after the job, Stotz has the idea to stay in the wash longer, but remembered it wouldn't be thoughtful. He says, "Thinking of others is what makes us a team."

**[Educational Message: Even though it may be difficult at times, it's always important to think of others and consider their needs and feelings.]**

but once they climb to the counter-top, they discover a package of bandages. They knew the word bandage was used but what was its purpose? They infer that the bandage could be used to fix a bike, and they discover the purpose of the sticky strips is to hold the bandage in place. Boomer insists he needs it because the soft inside “pillow” of cotton would be a comfort to a spot on his hip that hurts. Putting all the data together, they realize that the bandage must have been used to cover or protect the spot where Girl Hooman was injured.

**[Educational message: A bandage is a protective cover for a wound that occurs with an injury. There is a pillow of cotton in the middle of a longer piece of sticky tape that holds the pillow in place, keeping the wound protected until it heals.]**

### **PROJECT SAND [EFGL122DH]**

The Floogals are outside in the garden and hear Mom Hooman tell her children to wipe their feet before coming into the house. She doesn't like sand. Mom Hooman's remark leads the Floogals to follow a trail of sand to a large children's sandbox outside. While humorously scaling sand mountains and dodging sand falling from a sand castle, the Floogals draw several conclusions about this stuff called sand. Hooman children like to play in it. The properties of sand are unusual. When it's dry, it is soft and loose. When it's wet, the grains of sand stick together. When it is soft, your feet sink into it. When it is wet, you can pack sand into many kinds of shapes for building structures, such as a sand castle.

**[Educational Message: Sand is a favorite outdoor ingredient for children's play because so many things can be done with it. This is because sand changes dramatically, from soft to hard and from loose to dense, depending on whether it is dry or wet.]**

Diwali comes before Christmas and the Kapurs have already celebrated with flower garlands and holiday candle lamps. The lamps symbolize the inner light in all of us. Even though Dr. Kapur doesn't celebrate Christmas, the gift makes her know she's loved and cared for. Mrs. Goldstein celebrates Hanukkah, commemorating the reopening of the rebuilt temple and the miracle of the candle that burned for eight days with only enough oil for one. Mavis the postmaster does celebrate Christmas but she also celebrates Kwanza. **[Educational Message: There are many different cultural and religious events celebrated in the last two months of the year: Christmas, Diwali, Hanukkah and Kwanza are among them. While they differ in specifics, they all generate goodwill to those around them. Many involve exchanging gifts and lighting candles.]**

### **NINA CELEBRATES CHINESE NEW YEAR [ENNW124DH]**

When the Lins invite the Flores family over for the celebration of the Chinese New Year, Nina sees the beautiful red embroidered silk shirt Sky is wearing, and she wants one just like it. Her parents suggest they save together and buy the shirt for next year's celebration.
