Program Description: WIOH airs at least one – and usually three – public service announcement(s) during virtually every hour of its broadcast day. The announcers choose from a variety of announcements sponsored by town government offices, local public and private schools, community organizations, civic organizations, religious groups, charities, hospitals, children's welfare organizations, etc. Announcements are typically sponsored by organizations located in the Concord-Boston area, though several are provided by national and international organizations. Announcements average approximately 15 seconds in length.
