Program Description: Dr. Laurie Hunter, Superintendent of the Concord Public Schools ("CPS") and Concord Carlisle Regional School District ("CCRSD"), responded to the COVID 19 pandemic's effects on the districts' operations by hosting online virtual video conferences every Friday afternoon from early April through June 19, 2020. She was joined in these "virtual coffees" by other district administrators and members of the Concord Public School Committee and Concord Carlisle Regional School Committee (NOTE: The Concord Carlisle Regional School District is WIQH's licensee). The Superintendent and other administrators updated viewers/listeners on school operational changes as a result of the pandemic, and answered questions posed by audience members. WIQH began rebroadcasting the conferences beginning April 25.

Subjects discussed included but were not limited to: school closure status; transition to remote learning; frequently changing remote learning resources; adjustments to remote class schedules; access to school materials and staff; student mental health; how families are coping with the school closures and what the school systems can do to assist families; special education students' support services; food pantry service instituted by the school systems in response to the crisis; testing, assessment, and grading during remote learning; how course credit will be awarded during the second semester of the school year; specific needs of graduating seniors in relation to college admissions; standardized testing changes and waivers; cleaning and maintenance of school facilities during the shutdown; pandemic impact on school budgets; alternate end-of-year ceremonies for students graduating and moving up to different schools in the system; summer plans and resources for families; possible scenarios for the start of the 20-21 school year.
