## Local Public Notice Requirement for New Translator Application Filing

Section 73.3580(g) of the FCC's Rules requires you to give notice of the submission of an application for a new FM translator station as follows: one time in a <u>daily</u>, <u>weekly</u>, <u>or biweekly newspaper</u> of general circulation in the community or area served by the translator. The notice must made immediately following the tendering for filing of the application. (If there is no newspaper published or circulated in the area served, the applicant must determine an appropriate means of providing the required notice to general public, such as posting in the local post office or other public place.)

To assist you with meeting this obligation, a sample text for this notice follows. Please note that you will need to fill in certain information as indicated. After publication, you should ask the newspaper for an Affidavit of Publication reflecting the date and text of notice. The Notice and Affidavit should be retained with your station records.

## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

On August 28, 2013, the State University of New York filed an application with the Federal Communications Commission in Washington D.C. for a construction permit for a new FM Translator Station at Stony Brook, New York. The application proposes that station will operate on channel 297 with an effective radiated power of .006 kW, from [insert transmitter site location]. It is intended that the station will rebroadcast the signal of WUSB, Stony Brook, New York, channel 211.
