ISSUES OF CONCERN TO CLEVELAND ADDRESSED IN RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING 4th QUARTER, 2021

Subject Description of Issue of Concern

1. Education

- Getting Our Babies to College 101 provides firsthand information taught to parents through easy interactive workshops. Educating families on what they can do to help their teenager be prepared for college is a top priority. The 1,000 Ties initiative enhances the quality of life for youth by teaching them skills they can use for a lifetime. With the help of men from the community young men ages 10-19 in high poverty rate cities will learn skills necessary to succeed in a job interview and break the cycle of generational poverty.
- The City Club Forum explains the ways in which education can continue innovating and improving post-COVID-19. The year 2020 sparked massive change in education as a result of the pandemic, equal parts highlighting innovative ways of teaching kids as well as the ways in which education has fallen short. Glaring issues were immediately apparent once districts went virtual: in disenfranchised areas, enrollment immediately dropped. Student learning was impacted, with many missing an entire grade or more worth of learning. As a result of the American Rescue Plan, the country's schools now have the available funds to address several key issues. But will they?
