IF THEY CONTINUE TO HOLD OUT THE HOSPITAL GROUP WOULD BE FORCED TO RESORT TO EMINENT DOMAIN AND SEIZE ANY OUTSTANDING PROPERTIES AT THE HOSPITAL SITE.

3/2/18-AMERICA'S GREATEST HEART RUN AND WALK WILL BE GETTING UNDERWAY TOMORROW MORNING. THE ANNUAL EVENT TO RAISE MONEY TO FIGHT HEART DISEASE HAS BECOME A CENTRAL NEW YORK TRADITION OVER THE YEARS. OVER NINE THOUSAND WALKERS AND RUNNERS WILL BE TAKING PART IN THE EVENT. MOST OF THAT ACTIVITY WILL BE HAPPENING AROUND UTICA COLLEGE AND THE SAINT LUKES HOSPITAL CAMPUS, WHERE DRIVERS SHOULD EXPECT DELAYS. IF THEY REFUSE THE OFFERS M-V-H-S WILL BE FORCED TO SEIZE THE LAND THROUGH EMINENT DOMAIN, SETTING THE STAGE FOR A LONG AND EXPENSIVE COURT BATTLE.

3/27/18-ONEIDA AND HERKIMER COUNTIES NEED TO START EXERCISING AND CUT BACK ON THE PIZZA. THEY'RE RANKED AS THE 51ST AND 54TH HEALTHIEST COUNTIES IN NEW YORK ACCORDING TO A NEW REPORT RANKING THE EMPIRE STATE'S 62 COUNTIES.
