¹47 C.F.R. S 73.6001(b) states that Class A television broadcast stations are required to:

1. Broadcast a minimum of 18 hours per day, and
2. Broadcast an average of at least three hours per week of locally produced programming each quarter.

Locally produced programming is defined in 47 C.F. R. S 6000 as programming:

1. Produced within the predicted Grade B contour of the station or within the predicted Grade B contours of any of the stations in a commonly owned group; or
2. Produced within the predicted DTV noise-limited contour of a digital Class A station broadcasting the program or within the contiguous predicted DTV noise-limited contours of any of the digital Class A stations in a commonly owned group; or
3. Programming produced at the station's main studio.
