



KSAZ FOX 10 News airs 9 hours of live, local news each weekday plus another 10.5 hours of local news and sports on weekends (a total of 55.5 hours a week), more than any other station in Arizona. In addition, the station produces a weekly half hour public affairs show, "FOX 10 Newsmaker Sunday."

KSAZ FOX 10 News is committed to covering the issues most important to Arizonans. With more airtime devoted to live, local coverage, as well as significant investment in equipment and personnel to gather information, FOX 10 is uniquely positioned to deliver on its promise to provide the most responsive and relevant content in high profile time periods. This report highlights the issues that were of greatest importance during the months of January, February, and March 2020.

On the chart that follows we list the stories we covered in these topic areas including the date, specific newscast and on-air format. Here is a key to estimate how much time we allocated to each story:

RDR = reader

Anchor reads script with no video. Typically 20 seconds

VO = anchor voice-over

Anchor reads script with video. Typically 20-30 seconds

VOSOT = anchor voice-over/"sound on tape"

Anchor reads script with video. Story includes sound bite from interview subject. Usually 45 seconds

LIVE VO = live voice over

Reporter live in the studio or field with extended video and information. Typically 1 minute

LIVE VOSOT = live voice over/"sound on tape"

Reporter live in the studio or field with extended video and sound bite from interview subject.
Usually 1 minute, 45 seconds

PKG = reporter package

A self-contained story narrated by an anchor or reporter
An anchor usually introduces the story
Including anchor introductions, stories typically run 1 minute, 30 seconds

LIVE PKG = live reporter including reporter package

Same as PKG above, except a reporter introduces the story live from the scene

1/2/20	10PM	VO	IN THE BORDER BATTLE. A CHANGE IS ON THE HORIZON, FOR PROCESSING IMMIGRANTS AT THE BORDER. AUTHORITIES WERE SENDING MIGRANTS TO TEXAS BY BUS, -- BEFORE THEY WERE RETURNED BACK TO MEXICO. BUT NOW, U-S CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION WILL IMMEDIATELY SEND THEM BACK TO MEXICO, -- WHERE THEY WILL AWAIT THEIR IMMIGRATION COURT PROCEEDINGS. THIS IS AN EXPANSION OF THE CONTROVERSIAL MIGRANT PROTECTION PROTOCOLS THAT WENT INTO EFFECT IN JANUARY. BORDER OFFICIALS SAY THE PROGRAM HELPS CURB AN INFUX IN PEOPLE ARRIVING AT THE BORDER. CRITICS ARGUE IT PUTS MIGRANTS AT RISK BY EXPOSING THEM TO VIOLENCE AND ILLNESS IN CROWDED SHELTERS OR LIVING ON THE STREETS.
1/9/20	9PM	VO	IN THE BORDER BATTLE, CONSTRUCTION OF THE U.S.-MEXICO BORDER WALL CAN MOVE FORWARD AFTER A FEDERAL APPEALS COURT FREES UP CONSTRUCTION MONEY. THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION WANTS TO USE MORE THAN 3 *BILLION DOLLARS -- DIVERTED FROM MILITARY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS -- TO PAY FOR 175 MILES OF BORDER WALL. LAST MONTH A FEDERAL JUDGE BLOCKED THE MONEY FROM BEING USED. BUT A FEDERAL APPEALS COURT SAYS THE FUNDING CAN BE USED TO BUILD THE WALL, OVERTURNING THE LOWER COURT RULING. THE MONEY IS PLANNED FOR 11 PROJECTS IN CALIFORNIA, NEW MEXICO, TEXAS AND ARIZONA.
1/16/20	5AM	VO	THIS IS AN UNUSUAL STEP, A FEDERAL JUDGE OVERSEEING A TRIAL ABOUT CONDITIONS AT A TUCSON BORDER FACILITY WILL VISIT THE CENTER TO SEE THE CONDITIONS FIRST HAND. THE SUIT CLAIMS THE FACILITY IS PLAGUED BY EXTREME OVERCROWDING, FREEZING TEMPERATURES AND UNSAFE CONDITIONS THE BORDER PATROL SAYS THE FACILITIES ARE DESIGNED FOR SHORT-TERM STAYS FOR ADULTS.

IT'S PUT IN A REQUEST WITH THE PENTAGON TO SECURE MONEY FOR 270 MILES OF A BORDER BARRIER AS PART OF A COUNTER-DRUG EFFORT. THE PENTAGON WILL SPEND THE NEXT TWO WEEKS TO DETERMINE WHAT MAY BE APPROVED. NO COST ESTIMATES HAVE BEEN PUBLICLY MADE AVAILABLE.
1/23/20	430AM	VO	IN THE BORDER BATTLE, A JUDGE HINTS HE MAY RULE FOR MIGRANTS IN A LAWSUIT THAT ALLEGES EXTREME OVERCROWDING AND INHUMANE CONDITIONS AT SOME OF THE BORDER PATROL'S FACILITIES IN ARIZONA. U.S. DISTRICT COURT JUDGE DAVID C. BURY CRITICIZED THE LACK OF MEASURES TAKEN BY THE BORDER PATROL TO ADDRESS PERSISTENT OVERCROWDING AND LENGTHY TIMES IN CUSTODY. HE DIDN'T SAY EXACTLY WHEN HE WOULD RULE BUT INDICATED IT WOULD BE THE END OF NEXT WEEK AT THE EARLIEST. THE GOVERNMENT SAYS LAWYERS FOR THE MIGRANTS HAVEN'T PROVEN THE BORDER PATROL VIOLATED ANYBODY'S CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS. THREE WERE HURT.. IN THE CRASH NEAR ARIVACA. THE ROADWAY WAS CLOSED FOR SEVERAL HOURS WHILE P-C-S-D INVESTIGATED. BORDER PATROL SAYS IT HAPPED AROUND 4-30 P-M YESTERDAY AFTER A 17-YEAR-OLD DRIVER REFUSED TO YIELD FOR A TRAFFIC STOP. THE TEEN WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR FIRST DEGREE MURDER.. AGGRAVATED ASSUALT, CRIMINAL DAMAGE, UNLAWFUL FLIGHT AND D-U-I.
2/6/20	5AM	VO	IF ARIZONA REPUBLICAN LAWMAKERS HAVE THEIR WAY, A BAN ON SO-CALLED "SANCTUARY CITIES" WOULD BE WRITTEN INTO THE STATE CONSTITUTION. GOP LAWMAKERS ARE PUSHING FOR A BALLOT REFERRAL THAT WOULD ASK VOTERS TO INSERT A BAN ON "SANCTUARY CITY" POLICIES IN ARIZONA'S CONSTITUTION.. GOVERNOR DUCEY CALLED FOR THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT IN HIS STATE OF THE STATE ADDRESS LAST MONTH. THIS WILL ALLOW NEARLY 200 MILES OF THE WALL TO BE BUILT FASTER IN CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND TEXAS. CONGRESS GAVE HOMELAND SECURITY SECRETARY THE AUTHORITY TO WAVE THESE LAWS IN 2005 AND THIS IS NOT THE FIRST TIME ITS HAPPENED. THE MOVE IS EXPECTED TO SPARK CRITICISM THAT THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION IS OVERSTEPPING ITS AUTHORITY.
2/19/20	5AM	VO	A VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT IS FACING SERIOUS CHARGES THIS MORNING. HE'S ACCUSED OF USING HIS CELL PHONE TO RECORD UP THE SKIRTS OF FEMALE CLASSMATES. 18-YEAR-OLD AUSTIN ROBERTS IS ACCUSED RECORDING THE INAPPROPRIATE VIDEOS. COURT DOCUMENTS SAY THE FIRST VICTIM DIDN'T WANT TO PRESS CHARGES-- SHE WANTED THE VIDEO DELETED. THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL CONFISCATED THE PHONE AND DELETED THE VIDEO. WHEN HE CHECKED TO MAKE SURE IT WAS GONE, HE DISCOVERED MORE VIDEOS OF GIRLS AND CONTACTED THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. ROBERTS WAS BOOKED ON MULTIPLE FELONY COUNTS. THE DISTRICT RELEASED A STATEMENT SAYING THEY AREN'T ABLE TO COMMENT ON THESE DISCIPLINARY MATTERS BUT THEY ARE ABLE TO CONFIRM THEY BEGAN WORKING WITH THE PHOENIX POLICE DEPARTMENT AS SOON AS THEY WERE INFORMED OF THE ALLEGATIONS.
2/21/20			<p>THE PRESIDENT BROUGHT HIS MESSAGE OF BORDER SECURITY TO ARIZONA AGAIN LAST NIGHT. BUT IN COCHISE COUNTY, ARIZONA - RANCHERS HAVE FOUND THAT THE BEST SOLUTION FOR ILLEGAL CROSSINGS SO FAR...HASN'T COME FROM THE FEDS AND IT HASN'T BEEN IN THE FORM OF A WALL. TECHNOLOGY FROM THE LOCAL SHERIFFS OFFICE IS LEADING THE WAY ON A CRACKDOWN. WE'VE TALKED WITH RANCHER JOHN LADD BEFORE HIS FAMILY'S RANCH HAS RUN ALONG THE U.S./MEXICO BORDER SINCE THE LADD'S SETTLED THERE IN 1896. "Martha McSally and Gayle Griffin got involved in it, went to ADEQ and they proceeded to get with the international boundary and water commission to fund some of teh fixes" WHILE THE SEWAGE STOPPED - THE CROSSINGS HAVEN'T. BUT, THERE HAS BEEN A CHANGE. Physical barriers have never been 100% effective. This one just got razor wire last year, but that can be cut. Ladd says the most effective thing he's seen so far, has been at the local level. Ladd partnered with the Cochise County Sheriff's office in 2017.</p> <p>The SABRE - or Southeastern Arizona Border Regional Enforcement team - doesn't use a wall. They use manpower and cameras typically used to track wildlife - that cost about a thousand dollars each - to monitor trafficked areas around cochise county. Ladd has them on his ranch "if you got packing dope on camera, you immediately had a minimum 2 years prison sentence, the first 6 months of that program they got 39 mules. We haven't had drugs on this ranch for 26 months" We went out with the SABRE team one year ago. Once a camouflaged camera is tripped - members of the team check to see if it's dope runners or human traffickers. The dope runners they can arrest and prosecute Jake Kartchner/from COCHISE STRIKE FORCE: "you're at the sheriffs office and you understand what that means right, looked at me looked at my partner and he said yea, that means two years for me" "if you're in jail for 2 years, you're not gonna make a wage, your family, they got families, kids, everything else that's just what they do, they're drug smugglers, but that's enough to deter them and quit running dope" Human traffickers are border patrol's responsibility.</p> <p>Ladd says it comes down to manpower over everything else "border patrol is not funded or prived the manpower that's needed to actually control the international boundary, part of its washington's fault, part of its bp's fault, they have a manpower shortage" Tucson sector border apprehensions increased year over year from 1698 in January of 2019 to 2,613 last month. Ladd supports a wall. But says that alone will never stop the problem "when you talk to the feds about it they say you don't know how much lawyers and judges and jail space and courtroom, well I say it's damn sure cheaper than building a four million a mile wall" WHILE BORDER CROSSINGS MAY BE UP IN THE TUCSON SECTOR. CROSSINGS IN THE YUMA SECTOR HAVE DROPPED DRAMATICALLY, EVER SINCE PRESIDENT TRUMP MADE ASYLUM-SEEKERS WAIT IN MEXICO FOR HEARINGS IN THE U-S. THAT'S THE SECOND-LOWEST NUMBER OF CROSSINGS ACROSS THE ENTIRE BORDER.</p>

THE DECISION WAS MADE LAST NIGHT AHEAD OF A HEARING IN THE ARIZONA STATE HOUSE THAT WAS SUPPOSED TO TAKE PLACE TODAY. GOVERNOR DOUG DUCEY AND REPUBLICAN LAWMAKERS WANTED TO PLACE A BAN ON SO-CALLED SANCTUARY CITIES ADDED TO THE ARIZONA CONSTITUTION. HAD IT PASSED THROUGH THE LEGISLATURE IT WOULD THEN HAVE HAD TO BE APPROVED BY VOTERS. THE PROPOSAL WAS HEARD BY AN ARIZONA STATE SENATE COMMITTEE LAST WEEK. A SHOUTING MATCH BETWEEN LAWMAKERS AND ACTIVISTS TOOK PLACE DURING THAT HEARING. IT LEAD TO THE ACTIVISTS BEING REMOVED FROM THE CHAMBERS. CRITICS CALL THE BAN RACIST, SAYING IT WAS REMINISCENT OF S-B-10-70, A LAW DESIGNED TO CRACK DOWN ON ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION, MOST OF WHICH WAS STRUCK DOWN. ALTHOUGH A BAN ON SANCTUARY POLICIES IN THAT LAW WAS UPHELD. SUPPORTERS SAY THAT THE NEW POLICY WOULD PREVENT CITIES AND COUNTIES FROM ILLEGALLY BLOCKING FEDERAL IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT LAWS. LAST FALL THE CITY OF TUCSON EVEN HAD A BALLOT MEASURE WHICH WOULD HAVE DECLARED IT A SANCTUARY CITY. IT WAS REJECTED BY VOTERS. ANTI-IMMIGRATIONS GROUPS PLAN TO BE AT THE CAPITOL LATER THIS MORNING TO CELEBRATE THE DECISION, AND TO DELCARE WHAT THEY INTEND TO DO NEXT.
