

FOX 10 Xtra News airs 1 hour of live news each weekday @ 7PM. In addition, the station produces a 2 hour streaming live news show each weekday @ 10AM, "FOX 10 News Now."

This report highlights the issues that were of greatest importance during the months of January, February, and March 2023.

On the chart that follows we list the stories we covered in these topic areas including the date, specific newscast and on-air format. Here is a key to estimate how much time we allocated to each story:

RDR = reader

Anchor reads script with no video. Typically 20 seconds

VO = anchor voice-over

Anchor reads script with video. Typically 20-30 seconds

VOSOT = anchor voice-over/"sound on tape"

Anchor reads script with video. Story includes sound bite from interview subject. Usually 45 seconds

LIVE VO = live voice over

Reporter live in the studio or field with extended video and information. Typically 1 minute

LIVE VOSOT = live voice over/"sound on tape"

Reporter live in the studio or field with extended video and sound bite from interview subject. Usually 1 minute, 45 seconds

PKG = reporter package

A self-contained story narrated by an anchor or reporter An anchor usually introduces the story Including anchor introductions, stories typically run 1 minute, 30 seconds

LIVE PKG = live reporter including reporter package

Same as PKG above, except a reporter introduces the story live from the scene
