Community & Fire Safety	Noticias	July 1	Prime	2 min	<p>ILLEGAL FIREWORKS A press conference was held to inform the public about the hazards of fireworks and to remind the public that fireworks are illegal in certain communities.</p>
Health & Community	Noticias	July 9,10 & 11	Prime	10 min	<p>NO ME OLVIDES Coverage discussed two different types of Alzheimer's and was broadcast in both of our newscasts. Coverage was designed to help the community learn more about the disease, how it affects the individual and their family members. Most importantly, viewers received crucial information about early detection and prevention of Alzheimer's from professionals.</p>

Fire Safety	Noticias	July 31	Prime	2 min	<p>KIDS IN CAR DURING HOT WEATHER</p> <p>The report helped parents understand how dangerous it can be to leave a child in a car. Interviews with officials demonstrated what could happen in situations like these and gave crucial information to the community about this issue.</p>
Community, Immigration & Human Rights	Noticias	Aug. 4	Prime	1:30 hr	<p>FRONTERAS ENCONTRADAS</p> <p>Special community program targeted at informing the community about the influx of undocumented Central American children to this country. Viewers were able to participate through social media in this community debate by asking questions or leaving comments regarding the topic. The pros and cons of the issue were covered by an excellent group of panelists which included immigration lawyers, political</p>

					analysts, consuls, writers and film directors. Panelists were each given one minute to answer questions from the moderator and public.
Community	Noticias	Aug.18	Prime	2 min	SPECIAL CHILDREN The report covered the group “Suenos y Esperanza”. This group, which dedicates its’ time to singing and dancing is composed of talented kids with disabilities. Coverage was meant to inform the public and those that might benefit from this group’s efforts, and other groups like it, that provide services to those with disabilities.
Community	Noticias	Sept. 22	Prime	2 min	MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES Coverage focused on marijuana dispensaries affecting a local community area. Coverage included interviews with upset parents and residents in that neighborhood. An attempt was made get comment from local authorities, but they refused to respond. Coverage was designed to educate the public on the affect of these dispensaries and gauge community attitude.
