Problem # 5: Hope Always For Those With Suicidal Thoughts

Last Saturday was World Suicide Prevention Day, a time to remember that suicide is a growing problem. In the U.S., it increased by 33% from 1999-2017, and that was before COVID. In 2019, it was the second leading cause of death for ages 10-34.

Christians aren't excluded. LifeWay research has shown that 32% of Protestant church-going respondents had a family member or "close acquaintance" die by suicide.

Back in January, there were long lines waiting for testing as the Omicron variant of COVID was rampant in Baldwin County. That is not the case now, but the numbers are going up.

“We are seeing the numbers ticking up over the last couple of months,” said Jenny Kilpatrick with the Alabama Department of Public Health. “As of right now we are at about a 30 percent positivity rate in Baldwin County. The state average is about 27 percent. We are a little bit higher than that.”
