In one instance, she was able to care for her neighbor’s dog and notify her children that her mom had to be taken to the hospital. Kristin believes this is what God has called her to do. But it started after she learned about one friend, she regularly spent time with. Ruby says, "She couldn't pay for that much because she only receives \$40 a month to spend on herself and the dog." And Ruby found out this was the case for most of the residents at the nursing home. So, Ruby started granting the wishes she collected. Her mom, Amanda, is a nurse at the facility, "There's one and a half million residents in the United States living in nursing homes and 65% of those were Medicaid funded which meant that 975,000 of them get about \$40 a month." She's proud of her daughter's work, caring and loving on the people she has served for years.
