He mentioned the disaster has "thrown our budget a little out of whack," but that it's worth it. The president also stopped by Calvary Chapel Puerto Rico, handing out food, paper towels and batteries. The president praised FEMA, saying he'd never seen someone working so hard in his life. The FCC is working to make funds available to expedite repairs for communications in Puerto Rico. 90 percent of cell phone sites on the island are still out of service. The navy hospital ship comfort also arrived today. It docked in San Juan after 4 days at sea. Medical teams will provide necessary care to those in need. Puerto Rico residents are thanking President Trump for his visit there today. Many said they were proud of him for showing up. Two weeks after hurricane Maria most of the island is still without power and there's little cell service.

Grand Isle to the Mouth of the Mississippi could see as much as a four foot surge. A possible storm surge of 7 - 11 feet is expected from Waveland, Mississippi to the Alabama border and a surge of 6-9 feet in Mobile Bay.  Nate is expected to bring up to ten inches of rain for much of the Southand there are warnings that tornados could appear through tomorrow afternoon. Hurricane Nate rocketed through the Gulf at twenty-eight miles per hour over twelve hours which makes it the fastest forward motion of a
hurricane ever recorded in the Gulf.

Storm surge warnings are in place from the Mississippi/Alabama border to the Okaloosa Walton county line in Florida. Nate is expected to weaken quickly as it moves inland. Tropical-storm-force wind gusts are expected over the Florida Panhandle, and portions of Alabama and Georgia, through this afternoon. Rainfall levels for East of the Mississippi River from the central Gulf Coast into the Deep South, eastern Tennessee Valley, and southern Appalachians are forecasted to be anywhere from 3 to 10 inches. Across the Ohio Valley into the central Appalachians – you can expect anywhere from 2 to 7 inches of rain. In Mississippi and Alabama, more than 100-thousand homes and businesses are without power. Utility and power workers are on standby to make repairs and get the power back on, as soon as conditions are safe for them to work. Tornadoes are possible toda
