This EEO Public File Report is filed in the public inspection file for Station WHQR (FM) pursuant to Section 73.2080(c)(6) of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") rules.

No vacancies were filled during the period covered in the report except for a news reporter from Report for America. The candidate is initially selected by Report for America that recruits nationally. They launch a two-month, comprehensive recruitment campaign targeting an assortment of constituencies including college journalism programs and career services office, college media outlets, state press and journalism professional organizations and collegiate journalism organizations. Report for American funds 50% of the annual salary for the first year, 33% of the annual salary for a second year, and 20% of the annual salary for a third year. They provided six candidates and all candidates were interviewed.

1. Outreach Initiatives

The employment unit engaged in the following broad outreach initiatives in accordance with various elements of FCC Rule 73.2080 (c)(2).

Establishment of an internship program designed to assist members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment. July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023. WHQR-FM participates in a formal internship program with the University of North Carolina – Wilmington Graduate School with two positions of significate responsibility filled each year. Special effort is made to recruit women and minorities. One of the interns works with the Development Director. This intern does all the media promotion of the Station, is trained to be the webmaster, creates the marketing materials and press releases, and outreach. The other intern works under the Program Director and learns the operations of

running a radio. They learn to record and prepare programs for broadcasting, recording promotions, scheduling automation, and programs logs. The interns work to enhance their education in journalism and broadcasting.

<u>Establishment of training programs designed to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for higher level positions.</u> July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023 Staff is encouraged to attend conferences, webinars, and continuing education that will enhance their jobs and train them so they can seek higher level positions.

<u>Participation in other activities designed by the station reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.</u> All full-time vacancies are run on WHQR-FM weekdays on a "run of schedule" at least three times a day from 6am to 7pm.

<u>Establishment of a Summer Intern to assist with reporting.</u> 8-week period starting in early June, 2022. Intern is trained by the News Director and the Reporters in the News Department. The Intern is trained to assist with reporting, audio production, web content and social media management. Interns also receive training in reporting practices and produce their own reporting.

Establishment of Community Fellowship (Other Programs Designed to Promote Outreach Generally). July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023. This is a one year Journalism Fellowship for aspiring journalists who seek to develop their skills while working in a local newsroom. Fellows acquire a greater understanding of public radio and experience as a broadcast journalist. The Fellow will produce news reports and features using a lens of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Special effort is made to recruit women and minorities.
