No children's television programming was broadcast during the preceding quarter due to extenuating circumstances. WEFC-TV is licensed to a Receiver, appointed by the United States District Court for the Southern District of West Virginia and is operating pursuant to low-power special temporary authority (see File No. BDSTA-20120601APY). Until a new transmitter can be installed and made operational, the station is broadcasting programs which are repeated frequently, but do not include children's programs. When the station resumes full-power operation, the licensee intends to resume the broadcast of children's television programming. Until that happens, due to the Receiver's lack of financial resources, it is not possible to present a schedule that includes children's television programs.

This station is in receivership. On July 14, 2012, the Commission granted an application (File No. BALCDT-20100706GZW) for consent to involuntary assignment of the license of WDRL-TV to Millard S. Younts, Court-Appointed Receiver of MNE Broadcasting, LLC. The involuntary assignment was consummated on July 24, 2010.

WEFC-TV was silent from July 15, 2012 until June 1, 2011, when the station resumed operations. A request for special temporary authority to remain silent (FCC File No. BLSTA-20100802AYL) was filed August 2, 2010. That request was dismissed June 6, 2011. On June 2, 2011, WEFC-TV again went silent and a request for Special Temporary Authority to remain silent (FCC File No. BLSTA-20110610AEF) was filed on June 10, 2011. That request was dismissed on June 30, 2011. On June 28, 2011, WEFC-TV resumed operations. On July 2, 2011, the station again went silent. A further request for authority to remain silent (FCC File No. BLSTA-20110711ADE) was filed on July 11, 2011. On November 11, 2011, WEFC-TV resumed operations and the request for silent authority was dismissed on December 21, 2011. On December 28, 2011, WEFC-TV went silent again. A further request for authority to remain silent (BLSTA-20120112AAR) was filed on January 12, 2012, and that request was dismissed. On June 1, 2012, a request for STA to operate with reduced power (BDSTA-20120601APY) was filed. The request was granted June 14, 2012, and will expire December 14, 2012. On March 13, 2012, the Receiver filed an application (BALCDT-20120313AAK) for consent to assign the license of WEFC-TV. That application was granted April 20, 2012, but has not yet been consummated. On June 1, 2012, an application (BRCDT-20120601AKV) for renewal of license of WEFC-TV was filed. That application is pending.

The proposed assignee of the license of WEFC-TV is installing a new transmitter. When that transmitter is installed, WEFC-TV is expected to resume broadcasting children's television programs.
