

The Whole Heart Soution

Joel Kahn, MD is a Clinical Professor of Medicine at Wayne State University School of Medicine and Director of Cardiac Wellness, Michigan Healthcare Professionals PC, and author of *The Whole Heart Soution*. According to Dr. Kahn, more than 75 percent of cases of heart attacks, strokes and other cardiovascular disease events are preventable. He explained how lifestyle choices can make a huge difference in the development of heart disease and he said changes in diet and exercise can often reverse the disease.

Paul Tough, former editor at the New York Times Magazine, nationally recognized writer on poverty, education and the achievement gap discussed a groundbreaking anti-poverty initiative called the Harlem Children's Zone. Raising Kinder Kids


Thomas Lickona, PhD, is a Developmental Psychologist, Professor of Education Emeritus at the State University of New York at Cortland, author of *How to Raise Kind Kids: And Get Respect, Gratitude, and a Happier Family in the Bargain*. Dr. Lickona has led the character education movement in schools for forty years. He outlined the tools that parents need to foster peace and cooperation at home. He explained how changes in our culture have made it harder than ever to raise kind kids. He offered suggestions for parents to deal with technology and the use of media by kids.

Apps and Tracking Data

Irwin Reyes, a Researcher in the Usable Security and Privacy Group at the International Computer Science Institute led a study that found that more than 3300 Android apps from the Google Play Store are improperly tracking kids and are potentially violating federal law. He outlined the types of data that is being collected and what is being done with it. He believes similar results are likely with iPhones, but Apple's closed system prevents a similar study of its users. He offered advice to parents who are concerned about their children's privacy.





African Americans and Blood Pressure

Kevin Fiscella, MD, MPH, Associate Professor of Family Medicine and Community & Preventive Medicine at the University of Rochester School of Medicine & Dentistry discussed his groundbreaking research that found that the lives of nearly 8,000 black Americans could be saved each year if doctors could figure out a way to bring their average blood pressure down to the average level of whites. He talked about the reasons behind the gap between the races in controlling blood pressure, and the possible ways to reduce that gap.

Students Against Bullying


Curbing bullying has long been a focal point for parents and schools, but Elizabeth Levy Paluck, PhD, Associate Professor of Psychology and Public Affairs at the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University found that the answer may not lie within rules set by adults. Her team of researchers from Princeton, Rutgers and Yale found that students themselves, particularly those most connected to their peers, were able to reduce and resolve conflicts 30% more effectively than traditional methods used by adults.



Safety Standards of Childcare Facilities

Sarah J. Clark, M.P.H., Associate Research Scientist, Department of Pediatrics at the University of Michigan's C.S. Mott Children's Hospital co-authored a poll that found that 62 percent of parents report difficulties finding childcare facilities that meet their health and safety standards. The poll also found that only half of parents considered themselves "very confident" at discerning which childcare options were truly safe and healthy. She outlined the most important questions that parents should ask when evaluating childcare providers. She said 82% of parents would be in favor of a national standard for health and safety for childcare centers and in-home childcare providers

Emergency Room Errors

Medical errors cause roughly 250,000 deaths per year in the U.S. **Benjamin H. Schnapp, MD**, Assistant Professor, Assistant Emergency Medicine Residency Program Director in the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health co-authored a study that examined errors in Emergency Rooms. He found that, even in chaotic ERs, doctors typically have the right medical information but might not act on it in the best way. He talked about the patterns he found in patients who are most vulnerable to errors. He offered suggestions for patients who want to prevent errors when they visit an ER.



At Risk Youth

Jill Gonzalez, contributing editor at Popular Mechanics magazine, author of *Big Ideas: 100 Modern Inventions That Transformed Our World* discussed her report that examined today's at-risk youth. She said about one in nine young Americans today is neither working nor in school, exposing them to greater risk of poverty, violence, drug abuse and homelessness. She explained how these risk factors follow young people into adulthood. She discussed the importance of education and social services.



Your Brain on Digital



The Danger of Plastic


Patricia Hunt, PhD Meyer Distinguished Professor in the School of Molecular Biosciences at Washington State University is the geneticist who discovered the dangers of the endocrine disrupting chemical bisphenol A (BPA) in plastic products twenty years ago. Her latest study examined the effects of several BPA alternatives. She found that that these replacements impact reproduction in mice in much the same way as BPA. She offered advice to consumers on how to avoid products that may contain these hormone-disrupting compounds.

Liz Weston, Certified Financial Planner, personal finance columnist at Nerdwallet.com said, effective Sept. 21, consumers can freeze and unfreeze their credit files for free at all credit reporting agencies. Did you know that the average life expectancy of a sex trafficking victim is just seven years once the trafficking begins? This is such a disturbing statistic, but one that brings a sense of urgency to our fight against this horrific crime.

The average age an individual is first exploited into sex trafficking is just 12 years old. About 2 million children are exploited every year in the global commercial sex trade. Women and girls make up 96% of victims of trafficking for sexual exploitation.

We officially opened our home on January 2, 2018, and we welcomed our first resident on January 15, 2018. Our home can house up to twelve women at a time, and we offer a 12-month program where the women receive intense counseling, emotional healing, supportive mentors, and the opportunity to discover their interests so that they can enter college or the work force upon graduation from our program. In addition, we provide after care services to ensure that each of our graduates has an ongoing community of support. We are so excited to be in this phase of the healing work that we have set out to do, and you are an integral part of that process.

We'd like to take this opportunity to thank you once again for your contribution to our 2017 Golf Tournament. Last year, we raised just over \$18,000 through the generosity of our sponsors. As you can imagine, an epidemic like this doesn't go away with one successful fundraising event.

Koepka takes lead at PGA, goes for another major

ST. LOUIS — Two-time U.S. Open champion Brooks Koepka took a step toward adding a third major to his short list of victories.

Koepka bullied rain-softened BelleRive on Saturday on the front nine and built a four-shot lead, only to run into bad patch that brought a strong list of contenders into the mix — including Tiger Woods — going into the final round of the PGA Championship.

Even with back-to-back bogeys on the back nine, Koepka had a 4-under 66 for a two-shot lead over Adam Scott, the 2013 Masters champion who has been struggling through his worst season in nearly two decades. Scott had a 65 to

he led briefly in the final before fading.

Now, he gets another shot, and it most likely will take another round like Saturday.

“Not just myself, but everyone’s going to have to shoot low rounds,” Woods said. “It’s soft, it’s gettable, and you can’t just go out there and make a bunch of pars.”

Koepka was at 12-under 198 and will play in the final group of a major for the first time. He won in the penultimate group at the U.S. Open each of the last two years.

He already burnished his reputation two months ago by winning a U.S. Open on two entirely different courses — one at Erin Hills with a record-tying score of 16-under par, the other

turning back the hands of the clock.”

As easy as it looks at times, BelleRive can still bite at any moment.

Jordan Spieth found that out on a hole that effectively ended his second bid for the career Grand Slam. From well right of the 12th fairway, he tried to hit through a gap and instead

caromed off a tree and out-of-bounds, leading to triple bogey and falling back to 4 under for the tournament. He had to settle for a 69 and was eight shots behind, with 27 players in front of him.

No one paid more dearly than Woodland. Three shots behind at the turn, he and Kevin Kisner were in a front bunker. Woodland went over the green onto a slope at the back of another

bogey on No. 10, running six shots behind, and still managed a 71 to stay within three shots of the lead, along with Jon Rahm (66) and Rickie Fowler (60).

The biggest buzz, as always, belonged to Woods.

Coming off a three-putt bogey on the fifth hole, Woods ran off three straight birdies to get in range, only to stall on the back nine like he has done so often this year. He hit a 4-iron so pure on the par-5 17th hole that he immediately began walking off to it, and thousands of fans roared when it settled 20 feet from the hole for an eagle that could have brought him within one of the lead.

He missed. And then he missed the next from 4 feet for birdie and ended his day with 10 straight pars. Woods had to settle for a 66, and by the time every one else came through the 17th hole, he slipped back to a tie for sixth, four shots out of the lead.

That's the same position he was in going into the final round of the British Open at Carnoustie, where

PGA TOUR victory, one in Europe and two in Japan. He wound up with triple bogey, and scrambled to get back in the mix.

"Really confident going into tomorrow with the way I fought the last eight holes," he said.

Koepka almost headed down that direction. He had to make an 8-foot par save on the 13th. He couldn't save par with a 100-foot bunker shot on the 14th after a poor drive, and his tee shot on the 15th settled behind a tree, forcing him to take relief with a penalty shot. He got up and down to escape with bogey. And as Woods was moving into position for a potential eagle, Koepka made a 10-foot par save on the 16th.

"To avoid making three bogeys in a row was very big," he said.

Woods and Fowler were among those just happy to get off the course. They had to finish their second rounds on Saturday morning because of rain that delayed Bellerive late Friday afternoon. Woods played 29 holes, while Fowler played 26.


Ten players were within four shots of the lead, which includes defending champion Justin Thomas (68), Jason Day (67) and Stewart Cink, the 2000 British Open champion who played with Woods and matched his 66.

"It's a pretty intense environment out there. It's fun," Cink said. "Hearing the crowd, and Tiger's performing great, it was like





He was also a member of the International Relations Committee, Vice Chairman of its Subcommittee on Africa, and was appointed by President George W. Bush to serve as the Congressional Delegate to the 58th General Assembly of the United Nations.

Houghton is the founder of the John Quincy Adams Society and is also a founding member of the Republican Main Street Partnership, which seeks to strengthen the political center. Houghton was also Co-Chairman of the Washington-based Faith and Politics Institute.

The only former CEO of a Fortune 500 corporation to serve in the House, Houghton joined Corning Glass Works (now Corning Incorporated) in 1951 after graduating from Harvard University and serving as a Marine during World War II.

Before entering Congress, Houghton served on the boards of several major corporations, including Procter & Gamble, IBM, Citicorp, N.Y. Telephone, B.F. Goodrich, and Genentech.
