This 30-minute series produced by Life in the Carolinas and hosted by Carl White focuses on the arts, music, culture, heritage, agriculture and historical significance of the communities and residents of the Carolinas region.

7/4 at 1:30pm – #1009 – “Lenoir Cruisers – Cher Shaffer – Baroque Arts” – In this episode of Life in the Carolinas we take a cruise to Lenoir, NC and visit with the Lenoir Downtown Cruisers. Then it's off to Pittsboro, NC to talk with renowned folk artist Cher Shaffer at the Rosemary House Bed & Breakfast. Then we travel back in time to learn about Baroque music and dance at the Blue Ridge Artisan Center in Wilkesboro, NC.

7/11 at 1:30pm – #505 – “Elkin Creek Vineyard – Moonshine Cobbler – Heaven's Scent” – Life in the Carolinas visits Elkin Creek Vineyard and shares a story that was one year in the making with a look at what happens all along the process of growing the grapes and then making the wine. Then it's off to The Mast Farm Inn in Banner Elk NC for a visit with the chef who shares his recipe for making Moonshine Cobbler. Our third

segment features a stop at Heavens Scent where good food and southern charm is a tradition.

7/18 at 1:30pm – #601 – “Buffalo Beals Animal Park – Teapots – Ghost Tour” – Show Host Carl White visits Buffalo Beals Animal Park in Maiden NC then visits the Bailey Cafe in Bailey NC and discovers a large Tea Pot Collection. Wilkesboro NC is the home of the a few ghosts during the Candle Light Ghost Tour.

7/25 at 1:30pm – #1005 – “Blackbeard – Outlander NC” – History is questioned as host Carl White goes to the Blackbeard Festival in Bath, NC and examines the legend of Edward Teach (Blackbeard). Then he ventures to the Leatherwoods Mountain Resort in Ferguson, NC for the annual Fraser's Ridge Homecoming, a celebration of the historical fiction book and TV series, Outlander - portions of which were based in the area.

7/25 at 10:30pm – #1104 – “Pageland Watermelon Festival” – In this episode of Life in the Carolinas, we're off to Chesterfield County, SC to explore the history, both past and present, of the town of Pageland, and visit the world-renowned Pageland Watermelon Festival.

8/1 at 1:30pm – #701 – “The Pirates of Ocracoke” – Show host Carl White visits the Graveyard of the Atlantic Museum and then takes a ferry to Ocracoke Island for the annual Black Beard Jamboree. Carl spends time talking with author and historian Kevin Duffus about his passion to find the truth about Blackbeard. There is some friendly controversy around this, though, with some locals being more interested in the legend. Carl visits the main event of the Pirate Jamboree which is the reenactment of Blackbeard's last battle by a group of actors known as "Blackbeard's Crew."

8/8 at 1:30pm – #702 – “Pottery – Songwriters 3 – Hollerin'” – In this episode show host Carl White heads to Hatterss Island in the Outer Banks, a place many pottery artists call home, where White learns how to throw pottery with Antoniette Gaskings-Mattingly of Kinnakeet Clay. Next, is a trip to Balsam, NC for the monthly event, Songwriters in the Round. Finally, White checks out the National Hollerin' contest in Spivey's Corver, NC.

8/15 at 1:30pm – #703 – “Remembering No More: Alzheimer’s Special” – In this episode, show host Carl White explores Alzheimer's Disease. Focusing on the story of Vera, a gracious lady who suffers with Alzheimer's, he explores the disease, how it impacts on patients and those who love the patients, and the efforts of the many men and women who are working to eradicate this devastating disease.

8/22 at 1:30pm – #801 – “A Fall Visit to Wilkes County” – In this episode show host Carl White visit Wilkes County for three fall events. The Annual Brushy Mountain Apple Festival, Troutacular an outdoor family fishing adventure for Kids and Carolina in the Fall, an annual Music and Food Festival.

8/29 at 1:30pm – #802 – “Crowders Mountain State Park” – In this episode show host Carl White visits NC Crowders Mountain State Park for a Park Ranger guided tour to learn about how to have a safe enjoyable visit to North Carolinas most visited State Park. Next Carl visits Waxhaw NC and learn about the historic downtown and the birthplace of President Andrew Jackson.

8/29 at 10pm - #1002 – “Women of the American Legion” – Show host Carl White sits down with several women in the American Legion who have served in various branches of the military, for a candid conversation about the challenges, victories, ongoing demands and the evolution of women in service. These veterans embody the spirit of more than 1.8 million women who have served our nation since the Spanish American War.

9/5 at 1:30pm – #803 – “Teavepaugh Apple Orchard – Tom Dooley” – In this episode show host Carl White visits the Tevepaugh Apple Orchard in the Brushy Mountains of NC to learn about this multi-generational family business and what is involved in getting apples to market. Next Carl visits on location at Whippoorwill Academy with Charlotte Barnes to learn about the Tom Dooley Files.

9/12 at 1:30pm – #901 – “Blackberry Festival – Wounded Warrior Softball” – Show host Carl White visits the North Carolina Blackberry Festival in historic Lenore and then attends a fundraiser for Hospice and Palliative Care for North Carolina. He travels to Chester to attend an annual Wounded Warrior softball game.

9/13 at 2:30pm – #1001 – “RenFest – Taylor Hicks” – In this episode, host Carl White makes his annual visit to the Renaissance Festival in Huntersville. Then, White sits down with musician and TV host Taylor Hicks at The Walker Center in Wilkesboro. They talk a bit about his music career and his American Idol win, and also talk about his TV show, State Plate, and about visiting farms and local restaurants all over the country that are dedicated to the farm to table concept.

9/19 at 1:30pm – #902 – “Honoring Our Veterans” – Show host Carl White highlights the stories of several Carolina veterans in this special episode dedicated to the courage, dedication and service veterans have given to the country. Sgt. Eugene C. Deibler (WWII, 101st Airborne) relates some of his experiences including parachuting into Normandy and his wife making her wedding dress from pieces of his reserve parachute. Staff Sgt. Bud Byers (Air Force) who after retiring, wanted to honor veterans. He started with installing a single flag pole and ended up with a beautiful tribute garden. Bill Oxford (Vietnam, Marines & North Carolina Guard) recounts his feelings of coming back from Vietnam and landing in San Francisco amid conflict with anti-war protestors at the airport. He also talks about his experience and support of the work American Legion does for veterans as it approaches its 100th anniversary.
