City Manager Michael Beedie explained that local handling facilities had closed, and recycled materials had to be hauled out-of-state, plus the market for recycled materials is now soft. He said it could be a year or more before cost-effective options are available to grow the program.

The house sits right at the end of Gulf Boulevard, at the very end of Navarre Beach. It's the first thing you would see if you were to come down the National Seashore from Pensacola. And it's not the first impression some residents want to create. A drive down the beach road showcases beautiful views and enviable homes. Navarre Beach has come a long way since Hurricane Ivan, but not the home at 7315 Gulf Boulevard. Since Hurricane Ivan in 2004, it's been sitting empty and showing lots of wear and tear. Neighbors have been complaining to Santa Rosa County for years, but code enforcement is a slow process. He's learned the simple truth of code enforcement: it's a slow process. The county has sent the owners a letter saying civil litigation is possible if they don't fix things up.
