A long-time sibling rivalry came to a tragic end this morning in Red Bank. Police tell us the brother is now dead, and the sister in the hospital with self-inflicted stab wounds. 63-year-old, Glenda Forrest, is charged with the first degree murder of her brother. Police tell us they had been to their home numerous times before. The siblings' cousin called police after Forrest confessed to what had happened. When police arrived, they found Forrest shouting in pain from self-inflicted stab wounds to her stomach, and Barnes dead in the bedroom. Apparently with several stab wounds. Neighbors say the siblings Kept to themselves, and feel like they live in a safe neighborhood.

UTC STUDENTS HOLD VIGIL FOR FORT HOOD VICTIMS

As families mourn loved ones lost in Texas ... students at UTC are taking a few minutes to remember them.

Tonight, they held a candlelight vigil around the campus' American flag.

Navy veteran and UTC student Daniel Wagner organized the event.

He told me it's important for people to pull together and show their support.

Current and former service members along with students surrounded the campus flag pole. With candles in hand, More than 20 people stood in silence for several minutes to reflect on the 3 dead soldiers and 16 wounded in yesterday's shooting at Fort Hood.

The coordinator for veteran student services told everyone there tonight that they should take that time to remember the men and women who put themselves in harm's way so others don't have to.

"We do have people here who understand what it's like, and people understand what it's like to have loss, so we just want to show that we're all a family, it doesn't matter if it's not at home or it is here. We just want to show that we're together and we're praying for the families that won't be able to enjoy the things that we do," said Daniel Wagner.

Army ROTC members lowered the flag to half-staff.

Those who attended told me they have friends or family member who are in the military, so they recognize the dangers they may face.

As for the victims in yesterday's shooting.

Three are in serious condition and may need more surgery.

They suffered gunshot wounds to the neck, spine and abdomen.

The rest are in fair or good shape and four soldiers have been released from the hospital.

#### WOMAN FINDS BOYFRIEND DEAD IN APT.

Chattanooga police are searching for answers tonight after a man is found dead inside his apartment.

Investigators say the victim's girlfriend discovered him dead inside the PineWood apartments.

She called police just before nine this morning.

Investigators haven't yet reached any conclusions.

But two neighbors told us last night they heard five or six gunshots in the area, but didn't call police.

Right now police are calling his cause of death undetermined.

They have not released the victim's name, pending notification of his relatives. We'll keep you updated.

#### MAN SHOT IN HUNTING ACCIDENT

A man is shot in a South Pittsburg hunting accident early this morning.

Wildlife resource officers say it happened along Irondale Road around 7 a.m.

Two men were out with their children hunting turkey when one of them was shot.

Authorities haven't released the name of the 41-year-old man.

They say a helicopter took him to the hospital and they don't know his condition right now. We'll keep you posted as more information is released.

#### ARSON SUSPECTED IN DODDS AVE. FIRE

Investigators suspect arson in a morning fire on Dodds Avenue.

It started about 10:30 at a building that houses two businesses -- the Blue Spot Lounge and Mercury Cab.

The fire gutted the lounge's side of the building..

Investigators are trying to figure out how a fire started at a business with no power, and no one supposed to be there..

A man seen walking around the area when the fire started was handcuffed, and led away.. We're told he was questioned and released, and has not been charged..

BAIL DENIED FOR TEEN CHARGED WITH MURDER

Bail is denied for a teen charged in the Lookout Valley murders.

15 year old, Jacob Allison, remains in the Hamilton County Juvenile detention center tonight.

Today, Allison had his first appearance before a magistrate judge.

The teen is charged of three counts of first degree murder and one count of first degree attempted murder...

heavy charges for a kid who just entered high school.

"In my humble opinion the kid didn't really understand what was going on. At 15 how do you understand the fact that you are facing three life sentences," said Sam Marrs, a court administrator.

A transfer hearing next month will determine whether Allison will be tried as an adult or child. 19-year-old Derek Morse is also charged in the murders.

Police say they're still searching for a third suspect.

#### PROBATION SENTENCE FOR DRUG-STEALING PHARMACIST

A Chattanooga pharmacist accused of stealing and using drugs from the pharmacy where she worked... pleaded guilty in court today.

Kimberly Hawkins admitted to theft of property and possession of a controlled substance. Police say she stole oxytocin from a Bi-Lo pharmacy earlier this month.

She told investigators she snorted the crushed pills.

Medical experts say substance abuse is too common among healthcare professsionals.

They say easy access and high stress situations are potential causes, and that's it's dangerous to those beyond the user.

As for Kimberly Hawkins, the judge ordered her to serve an 11-month probation sentence. She must also complete several public work days and go through a drug screening process.

According to the 2013 national assessment of educational progress.

38-percent of high school seniors scored at or above "proficient" in reading.

That is about the same as the results from 2009.

When broken down by race, asian-pacific islanders did best in both categories.

African-Americans scored the lowest in both reading and math.

Public schools in connecticut and arkansas showed improved scores in both categories.

#### CHATTANOOGA MAN ARRESTED FOR TATTOOING MINOR

The mother of a 14-year-old boy who illegally got a tattoo -- wants the man responsible for doing the ink -- behind bars.

Joey Williams has since turned himself in -- admitting he gave the teenager a tattoo without his parent's permission.

Police say Joey Williams was an unlicensed tattoo artist and gave a 14-year-old boy a tattoo back in February.

Police say Williams did the boy's tattoo at the Red Roof Inn on Shallowford Road.

According to the affidavit, Williams told police the boy said his mom was waiting outside in the car.

And, obviously WIlliams took the minor's word.

The health department inspects tattoo parlors four times a year.

They say doing a tattoo outside of a licensed facility is a huge risk.

The teen's mother didn't want to talk with us on camera today, but told us her son found out about Williams through facebook.

She says her son paid 25 dollars for Williams to do his tattoo -- which was her name on his arm. But, now, she says the tattoo has caused an irritation and she's having to pay more money on treatments to heal it.

Williams is scheduled to appear in court on April 21st.

TWO TRAIN ACCIDENTS IN AS MANY DAYS

Two train accidents in two days -- the latest, this morning in Chattanooga.

A tractor-trailer driver is lucky to be alive, after a train split his rig in half..

It happened just after 9 o'clock this morning on Wauhatchie Pike -- near Birmingham Highway.

Maps show the railroad track there is owned by Norfolk-Southern Railroad.

There's no word tonight on how this crash happened.

Meanwhile, investigators are still piecing together exactly what happened yesterday that led to a deadly crash on train tracks in Dade County.

There are no crossing bars or flashing lights to warn drivers of an oncoming train at this particular crossing on Highway 11.

Officials say State Senator Jeff Mullis is organizing meetings with Norfolk Southern, Dade County and other state officials -- on what to do about the crossing.

But they're in agreement that something has to change.

Dade County commissioner Ted Rumley saw the wreckage first hand.

Those crossing bars and warning lights are estimated to cost about 2-hundred-thousand dollars. Rumley says it would be up to the Georgia Department of Transportation whether to fund the construction.

Chris Lockey is one frustrated commuter-- he lives in Hixson and usually takes Thrasher Bridge on his drive home.

"I was supposed to pick my daughter up at 6:00 in the daycare, it's not going to happen, I was supposed to drop my bike off and get my car, it's not going to happen,"

The Thrasher Bridge over the Chickamauga Dam will be closed until Monday morning while TVA crews work to repair several aging expansion joints.

The work is done every 15-years to MAINTAIN the bridge.

Ethan Bruce is not happy about taking alternative routes this weekend,

"Can't really get to where we're going really quickly, we're having to go around a lot of

This weekend, you'll have to use Amnicola Highway and Dupont Parkway to cross the

river.

"I spoke to many drivers off camera who told me yes this is causing a headache, but at least it's being done over the weekend and not during the week when traffic would be worse."

"Fortunately I don't have to get out this weekend so I'm going to stay up in the north end of the county."

Meanwhile, many restuarant and store owners on Highway 153 in Hixson say the detours will make for a SLOW weekend for their business.

"Typically on Thursday and Friday nights we're a little bit busier, and since it's been closed it's really impacted us, business has slowed down."

Hundreds gathered this afternoon to remember a firefighter who was killed in a weekend motorcycle crash.

Joey Rutherford was a volunteer firefighter with Lone Oak V-F-D.

One rider lost control, hitting Rutherford .. causing both to crash.

He was pronounced dead at the scene.

BERKE'S NEW PLAN: NO HOMELESS VETERANS

No more homeless veterans.

That's the latest promise from Chattanooga Mayor Andy Berke.

But what would that mean for the city, for veterans, and how are those veterans responding? Mayor Andy Berke signed an executive order this afternoon that begins that process.

"I promise you this. Last night I spoke to over 500 people at the State of the City and I said we're going to end, not, we're going to try. I said we're going to end chronic veteran homelessness by December of 2016. We don't stand up and say that unless we're going to mean it," said Berke. Mayor Berke held a roundtable about how he plans to accomplish his goal by 2016.

"What I'm going to do at the end of this roundtable is sign this executive order which creates a task force."

But it's local veterans like Ronnie Barclay who want to know how will this affect them and can Mayor Andy Berke make it happen.

Barclay says he enlisted in the Marine Corps because he wanted the ultimate challenge. But he ended up with a bigger challenge when he left the military.

"I was homeless for like six years. You know what I mean? Because of different relationships, poor choices, things of that nature," said Barclay.

But Barclay says he knew the first step to end his homeless situation was up to him.

"Before he signed that, I got in out the rain. Like I said, it's up to the individual. I am one of the achievers by being a living example that come out, do the networking, talk to people enlighten and motivate them that you can make it happen for yourself," said Barclay.

Mayor Andy Berke says over the next few weeks they'll put together the task force.. which will consist of business leaders, community leaders and of course, veterans.

The Task Force will then spend the next few months studying the problem and will present a plan to the Mayor.

#### GPS REMEMBERS FORMER HEADMASTER

There was a mix of emotions today at Girls Preparatory School, a day after the loss of beloved former headmaster Randy Tucker

Tucker spent 26 years as the head of GPS before retiring last year.

He was killed in a car accident yesterday on I-75.

Students and faculty shared stories and memories about Tucker.

Many of them called him a father figure and a positive influence.

Students say he embodied the spirit of GPS.

GPS is now working on how they plan to commerate Tucker.

We'll let you know what they decide.

#### CELLPHONE TOWER HEARING POSTPONED

A controversial hearing in Catoosa County is postponed to a later date. We first told you last Thursday about the 180-foot cellphone tower being proposed in Watoosa Ridge.

County commissioners were supposed to hear public comments on the issue tonight. Those against the tower say it will ruin the landscape.
