The following is a list of the participants and the subjects addressed for this quarter.

Weekend of July 1, 2016

Adam broadcasts an amazing conversation with Jackie Maier, an educator who has devoted her life to Special Needs Children and the Special Olympics. This is Part 1 of the conversation, touching on the importance of Volunteering, with Jackie’s team

Weekend of July 7, 2016

This show is the continuation of an amazing conversation with Jackie Maier, one of the many talented volunteers with Special Olympics. In this episode, we get to meet Jackie’s extraordinary children and hear about their volunteer experiences.

Weekend of July 14, 2016

The show kicks off with a community service update at SMU in Dallas . Our feature interview is with Sherry Roberts with the Fair Haven Foundation. The www.FairHavenFoundation.org works with Families seeking housing during critical care. We also feature an ALS update with show contributor Nigel.

Weekend of July 22, 2016

We begin with a live studio audience at Wabash College talking about the importance of getting tested early for Testicular Cancer. Our Feature Interview is with Hollywood director/producer/actor Garry Marshall discussing his time at Northwestern, Happy Days, and his favorite sports movie of all time. Segments include Ron Courson, Director of Sports Medicine at the University of Georgia, talking about The Heat Initiative, which educates Georgia high schools football players on the dangers of heat stroke death. Adam announces his upcoming work with All Pro Dad, the national organization founded by Tony Dungy, including the Indy All Pro Dad Event on November 3rd. While discussing Tony Dungy and All Pro Dad, Adam shares a letter Tony wrote to President Obama and Governor Romney asking them to add Fatherhood and Fatherlessness to the national campaign landscape. We round out the show with a conversation about recruiting with Texas Tech quarterback Jacob Karam.

Weekend of July 29, 2016

Today's show begins in front of a live studio audience at Morrisville State College in Mid State New York. MSU student athlete Fahraad Johnson is my guest and speaks about working with the children of Morrisville with his team's community service. Our feature interview stays in Morrisville with MSC head football coach Curt Fitzpatrick. Coach Fitzpatrick centers on the idea of selflessness. Segments of this show includes: a report from Arkansas to benefit the MDA, a report from Waldorf College in Iowa, and a report on Holistic Health and Fitness.

Weekend of August 5, 2016

As members of Delta Kappa Epsilon, these young men host a hockey tournament called Stick It To Cancer to raise money and awareness for Cancer Research. Adam Ritz Show contributor Peter Bobrinsky interviews Sue Walsh in Haiti. Miss Walsh is the founder of Little By Little, who partners with those in need of improved health and well being. They bring medical needs to groups like Mountain Top Ministries in Haiti. We wrap up with a report from the ship The Getaway, talking with Joel Sanchez about Norwegian Cruise Line's work with Make A Wish Foundation and more.

Weekend of September 2, 2016

Chris Petersen, head football coach at the University of Washington, joins us to talk about the Character and Integrity within the walls of his Pac 12 Huskies program.
