From **October 1 – December 31, 2014**, WLS-TV aired **16** regularly scheduled local programs dealing with community issues, over **630** public service announcements, and a number of special programs. In addition, we aired a variety of health and lifestyle programming on our **Live Well Network** on D2 (HD) and D3 (SD) – a single 24/7 over-the-air digital multicast platform. Programs included **We Owe What?** offering guidance on personal and family finances and **Live Big with Ali V**, providing fitness tips and advice about healthy living and eating. The Live Well Channel also aired over **9,500** public service announcements. **Windy City Live** a one-hour daily program showcasing anything and everything Chicago and also offering local news and weather reports, airs Monday-Friday on D1, and is rebroadcast daily on D2 and D3.

WLS-TV also broadcasts over **40 hours** of local news programs per week.

The ABC Television Network also supplies the station with news, public interest and educational programming, as described in the quarterly report entitled **ABC TELEVISION NETWORK NEWS and PUBLIC AFFAIRS PROGRAMMING** which is filed separately in the public inspection file.

AFRICAN AMERICAN SHORT FILMS: Sunday 11/9 at 12:00-1:00pm

Short films made by African Americans that range from comedy to drama and all the shades in-between that are entertaining and socially relevant. The films are the voices and images of contemporary life in the African American community.

THE Ñ BEAT, Saturday 10/4 at 6:30-7:00pm and Sunday 10/26 at 2:30-3:00pm

Hosted by Theresa Gutierrez, with special contributions by ABC 7's Stacey Baca, Michelle Gallardo, John Garcia and Roz Varon, the Ñ Beat is a rich tapestry of profiles highlighting the contributions of Chicago's Latino community. This edition profiles Puerto Rican born comedian Elizardi "Eli" Castro, who made a name for himself in Chicago with his one-man comedy shows. The show also looks at Mujeres Latinas en Accion, an organization that empowers Latinas and helps advocate for them on issues that affect their lives. The show explores the entrepreneurial program that this organization offers that assists women interested in starting their own business. Chicago native George Burciaga founded Elevate Digital, a digital company that introduces the integration of city services and new technology. The show looks at what makes Burciaga such a leader in his field with multiple national awards and recognition from the White House among his many honors.

HEART & SOUL, Saturday 12/20 at 6:30-7:00pm and Sunday 12/28 at 2:30-3:00pm

Heart and Soul is an in-depth look into the vibrant energy and central essence that surrounds the African-American culture in Chicago and analyzes what makes it so uniquely dynamic. This edition profiles Elizabeth Dozier, the principal of Fenger Academy in the Roseland neighborhood of Chicago. In four short years as principal she has managed to increase graduation rates up from 47 percent to 73 percent, and decrease student misconduct. Also featured is Kamau Murray, whose life mission is to make tennis available for everyone. He made that possible when he took over a fitness center and transformed it into the South Side's only indoor tennis facility. Finally, with African American or Latino musicians making up only 4% of the nation's orchestras, Aaron Dworkin began a mission to diversify the classical music scene by founding Sphinx. Sphinx holds an annual competition where 18 young African American and Latino musicians join the Sphinx Virtuosi Ensemble and chamber orchestra. Their nationwide tour has brought them to Carnegie Hall and right here to Chicago's Millennium Park's Harris theatre. .

WINDY CITY LIVE, Tuesday 11/11 at 11:00am-12:00pm Also Tuesday 11/11 at 12:00-1:00pm on our D.2/D.3 channels.

On a special episode of Windy City Live, "Veterans Day," we saluted our troops of present and past. Hosts Ryan Chiaverini, Val Warner and Ji Suk Yi highlighted some of the top military stories in Chicago. They sat down with military couple, Breg and Allison Hughes. Breg is a former US Army Special Forces commander in The Green Berets and Allison is a former US Army Blackhawk pilot. They discussed their military service, their story of recovery, and how Allison is giving back to the Green Beret community through The Steel Mags. We also highlighted Honor Flight Chicago which changes the lives of our country's oldest veterans by taking them to the WWII Memorial in Washington, D.C. We interviewed the founder of the organization, Operation Warrior Wishes, which grants wishes for veterans around the country. We also kicked off our annual "Toys For Tots" holiday program with the US Marines. We celebrated America's most patriotic songs with a live performance by DePaul University Winds band.
